Possessives		
When you want to show that something belongs to someone, you use a <u>possessive</u> . You use an apostrophe (') and then an "s" after the person's name that owns whatever you are talking about. If the object belongs to more than one person and ends with "s", put the apostrophe after the word.		
Example 1: Erica's dog is very cute . Because the dog belongs to Erica, you would put an apostrophe ('s) after her name.		
Example 2: The dogs' bones were in the yard. Because there is more than one dog, you put the apostrophe after the word.
