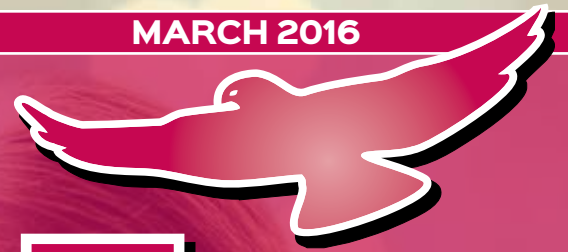

## Off-Site Levies

**O**ff-site levy rates and community services charges began on Feb. 1, 2016. Off-site levies are one of the sources of funding used to fund infrastructure. Other sources are utility rates, property taxes, and government grants. The levies for water and wastewater will be citywide, including in the established areas, which is new. Inner city developers raised concerns, but a density incentive program will not discourage this form of development. If a new development replaces development in an established area within the last 10 years, the levy will only be for the net impact of the new development. Intensification in existing communities generates increased taxes, by as much as 10-15 times the property taxes from the previous uses of the land.

# Winter LEAF Update

Here is a quick update on Hawkwood's LEAF Landscape Enhancement Program. We are still 3 to 4 months away from seeing any flowers grace our community but preparations have been well underway.

On the forefront of most Calgarians minds are the rising costs and increased financial instability families are facing in light of the current economic conditions. As decided back in November, we hope everyone will be pleased with the decision not to increase the LEAF Property Tax Levy for 2016. At this point it looks very promising that we will be in line with the budget.

The LEAF program provides Hawkwood with all of the flowers, increased grass care, and watering. Hawkwood's LEAF utilizes the City of Calgary as a contractor to carry out all of this work. A change this year will see the grass maintenance being carried out by a sub-contractor chosen by the City. We have been advised that there could be some savings to our program with this move. This change is also in line with the entire city's grass maintenance.

Two additional planters have been placed near the Dreamview Village area as this location is relatively far from the next closest LEAF flower feature and has a good number of residents that can enjoy what they have to offer.

The possibility of bringing some winter interest into the LEAF program is currently being explored. Stay tuned for more information on this development. The idea is to somehow bring some simple greenery specimens (evergreens perhaps) into the planters within the current budget. Since 2016's wheels are already in motion it is yet to be seen if there will be an opportunity to adjust and introduce anything this autumn.

Although not part of the LEAF program, the City Parks department carried out tree pruning in February on Hawkwood's city trees for shape and health. This is the first time significant attention was given to the trees since the big snowfall in early Sept 2014.

As homeowners in Hawkwood, we all have a vested interest in our property values regardless if we are selling or not. A benefit of the LEAF program is to make Hawkwood a desirable place to live and assists in giving property values and property sell-ability a boost in relation to other communities. In the current real estate market every advantage is a big help. We can all help by continuing to pick up any garbage we encounter, keeping our alleys and front yards tidy in line with the City's

"Good Neighbor" Bylaws, and not put signs on public property or call 311 to have any installed removed. These actions have proven to be infectious!

Support to help with infractions is always available by contacting 3-1-1 by phone or online.

Download the free Calgary 3-1-1 App today so you can easily report anything from illegal signage, graffiti, unsightly premises (accumulation of waste, renovation materials, etc), pet poop pickup infractions, just to name a few, right as you see them.

## Transportation Reminders

With spring around the corner, this is a good time to thank the "snow angels" who cleared pathways and sidewalks for their neighbors, and in the community. Your efforts are noticed. Thank you! Until the snow disappears, melting and freezing cycles can make sidewalks treacherous. Homeowners are responsible for spreading salt or gravel on slippery sidewalks in front of their residence. Please help keep our community safe.

Illegal commercial signs at our community entrances often increase with warm weather. Reputable businesses do not advertise this way. You can discourage this practice, and protect yourself, by not giving business to these groups. You can also call 311 to report the location of these signs. Note that community event and city signs are allowed.

Similarly, some home renovation companies regularly park their large utility trailers in Hawkwood. These companies create unappealing parking congestion, and are being inconsiderate to their residential neighbors. Our councilor has been advised and is looking into bylaw changes that will preserve the residential character of our streets. You can help address this by not doing business with these companies, and expressing your concern to Councilor Magliocca.

Thank you to the majority of residents who drive safely in our community. We may make it through the winter with all our LEAF planters intact, and ready for spring flowers. To keep our streets safe, the Hawkwood Community Association recently requested Police enforcement in our community – watch for their presence. ## Interactive Parks & Roads Map

**I**n 2014, City Parks and Roads received a one-time grant from the Council Innovation Fund of \$300,000 for an automated, interactive Parks and Roads Map.

Given the number of 311 service requests, it has been challenging to have accurate information. Soon the system on [www.calgary.ca](http://www.calgary.ca) will improve access to up-to-date data for Parks and Roads services.

One job is to track impacts to Snow and Ice Control Program service requests, website visits, and routing efficiencies.

Another is to have real-time work, such as snow clearing of pathways and roadways, as well as spring clean-up on roads and turf mowing information available.

Now there is an internal, automated map that displays work progress on a number of City services and \$39,000 will be used for final testing and implementation.

# YYC and NAV CANADA Open House Meetings

December 2015 and  
January 2016

Several representatives from YYC and NAV CANADA hosted open houses this past December and January to communicate proposed changes to current flight paths at the north and south end of the city (RNP Approaches). We would like to thank YYC, NAV CANADA and everyone who came out to learn and voice concerns.

These open houses were focused on RNP flight paths, but the key interest to many attendees was the original 2014 flight path changes, and seeking options to address the noise impact that high frequency, low flying planes are having on communities.

The following are 2 options that were frequently voiced, and ideas we would like to have further discussions with NAV and YYC to reduce the constant impact to West Calgary communities:

1. Spread the flights out across many communities rather than substantially impacting just some (similar to the previously spread out paths prior to 2014). As global aviation transitions to concentrated flight paths, this is the direction NAV CANADA is instructed to proceed, therefore, the “spread out” solution is currently not being explored. We believe this is the fairest long-term solution to this issue, which is occurring in many cities across Canada and the world.
2. Utilize less populated areas for flights when possible. NAV CANADA stated this is difficult for our area due to the conflict between arriving and departing flights. NAV CANADA’s explanation was difficult to visualize and understand. We would like to see fully explored studies involving this.

Attendees brought up the topic of legal compensation if a solution was not identified. Lawsuits exist in the US over the introduction of concentrated flight paths, and legal settlements have been awarded in Europe. To avoid this, YYC is very open to hearing concerns and suggestions. **A satisfactory outcome is more likely if residents actively vocalize their concerns.** To do this, visit [www.yyc.com](http://www.yyc.com) or [www.wcatc.ca](http://www.wcatc.ca).

A solution is required, as air traffic over West Calgary will increase in the future. This is not an easy issue,



but it is not impossible to come to a fair compromise to solve the negative effects of air space change. This will require the aviation industry to listen to communities, achieve a better understanding of life under concentrated flight paths, to fully understand the effects on physical/mental health, and the real cost to property/domestic life. We encourage NAV CANADA to become world leaders in this and successfully find safe solutions for everyone in the air, as well as on the ground.

# Playground Update

Thank you to everyone who responded with comments and support for your playgrounds. The feedback was positive and lots of you have volunteered to help with the builds and I thank you for that also. I will be letting all volunteers know about firm dates when I have firmed things up with the city.


We could do with more volunteers to step up for the playground build at Hawktree Green (HAW 170). We will need 10 volunteers full days for two days or portions of the day if you can. We are aiming to build this playground for the second week in May. You do not need any previous experience. Just a willingness to wield a shovel or a help with food or use a screwdriver. We will have competent builders on hand and supervising to help us out at all times. Come on out and meet your neighbours! We would love to have you.

This process did draw attention, for a few neighbours, to the noise issue that will potentially prevent the sports court from being put in. A meeting was held for neighbours in the Hawkwood crescent area backing

onto the playground who expressed an interest from the feedback. 5 neighbours came to the meeting. Some of the neighbours are concerned about the noise that will occur from the basketball court constantly during the day and at potentially late hours. It was proposed that this playground would be better used by flattening the area to make way for a grass soccer pitch. There will also be volunteers going door to door to get the opinions of the neighbours that can see this playground as to if this new information will effect their choice to have a sports court or not.
