#### Local Housing Allowance (LHA)

The Valuation Office (rent officer) is responsible for calculating the LHA's for different sizes of property. These will be published on a monthly basis. #### You must tell us if you can't get the evidence within one month.

If you don't return the form straightaway you might lose money. We will normally pay any benefit due from the Monday after we get your form.

If you need to claim for a past period, you must be able to show continuous good cause for not claiming earlier.

### How we collect and use information

We will use the information given in this form and any supporting evidence you send us to process your claim for Housing Benefit and Council Tax Benefit and to recover overpaid Housing Benefit and Council Tax Benefit.


