The University of Tennessee High School Arts Academy is a comprehensive studio workshop of intense practice in a wide variety of media.

The workshops will be taught by art professors and graduate students from the University of Tennessee in the following areas: ceramics, drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, bookmaking, mixed-media drawing, and sculpture. The workshops are co-organized by the University of Tennessee School of Art and Knox County art educators. These one-day workshops are open to private and public school systems in East Tennessee. The Arts Academy will take place in the Art and Architecture building on the University of Tennessee campus.

Funding for the 2016 Arts Academy is provided by the UT School of Art and Jerry's Artarama.

Watercolor

Students will explore traditional and non-traditional approaches to watercolor by completing two versions of a self-portrait. Students will work from photographs taken during class, and will focus on value, color, and brushwork as means of personal expression. Slide presentations and demonstrations will introduce various watercolor techniques and compositional strategies dealing with portraiture. Supplies will be provided.

Sparks + Fire: Experiments in Metal Sculpture

Students will learn basic metalworking techniques including forging, shaping, and welding steel. This workshop will empower students to create sculpture with both new and recycled metal. All students must dress in non-flammable cotton clothes (jeans and t-shirt and closed toe shoes or boots). Safety equipment, tools and materials will be provided. Limit 10 students.

This class will explore the use of finishing and firing techniques. Students will combine traditional and non-traditional methods while working with pre-fired tiles to explore various processes and concepts. The tiles will be Raku fired under staff supervision.

Join us for a day-long workshop focusing on the art of portrait photography. We will explore traditional portraiture as well as the more modern and ever-so-flattering 'selfie.' Using their images, students will explore several different digital and physical photo manipulation techniques to create their portraits. Students will need a digital camera. Tripods will be helpful but are not required.

Bookmaking

This course will explore dry-point technique and a variety of monoprint methods using Lexan. The morning session will include an introduction to dry-point technique. In the afternoon session, we will print the image and add the color background using various monotype techniques. Students should bring personal image sources (drawings or photographs) from which to work.

Drawing: Old School Techniques, New Ideas

images. After looking at some artists who work with such techniques, we will experiment with ways to transcend that predictable look of collage and traced imagery through composition and concept. Bring lots of magazine images and other printed materials.

Drawing: Focus on the Figure

This course will focus on the structure and dynamics of the human figure (clothed) through both short and long poses. Using a variety of mediums (charcoal and ink), exercises will emphasize composition, proportion, modelling of form, line quality and basic anatomical landmarks. Short poses will stress placement, structure and geometry of the figure. We will end the day with longer poses allowing for revisions and more highly finished drawings.
