

Learn to Use the Windows Pesticide Screening Tool - WIN-PST

The Windows Pesticide Screening Tool (WIN-PST) is an environmental risk screening tool for pesticides. Agronomists and producers can use it to evaluate the potential of pesticides to move with water and/or soil and affect non-targeted organisms. WIN-PST uses the Web Soil survey and the applied pesticides to determine risk factors to humans, fish and ground water. This tool is a necessary component of some CstP enhancements.

NRCS Great Falls Area Agronomist Joyce Trevithick and Field Office Soil Conservationist Max Blodgett will be on hand to answer questions about the tool and request that you bring your own smart phone or computer if you'd like them to walk you through the step-by-step process to use it.
