Course Description

Nursing Informatics introduces the student to the use of computer technology in nursing and in the delivery of health care. Emphasis is placed on basic computer operations and functions, nursing information systems, computerized medical records, computer-assisted leaning, and basic computer applications. Upon completion of this course, the student will demonstrate basic knowledge and skills of computer application.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the Practical Nursing student will:

- Have a basic understanding of computer operation and functions
- Develop experience in computerized testing
- Develop strong effective study skills
- Have a basic understanding of computerized medical records
- Strengthen Charting Skills
- Supplement learning concepts in NUR 102 Theory and lab courses
- Have improved Critical Thinking Skills

Modes of Instruction

Modes of instruction utilized in this course include:

Computer based learning exercises, and testing

Evaluation and Assessment

Grading:

Chart Smart Assignment will count as 25% of the course grade.

Perry & Potter Nursing Skills On-line will count as 50% of the Course grade.

The Module Exams will count as an exam grade in NUR 102 Fundamentals of Nursing.

Critical Thinking Assignment will count as 15% of the course grade.

ATI Practice Exams will count as 10% of the course grade.

Students must complete both A and B of the practice exams.
