Contact the State Office to ensure your address is correct in our system. If it is correct, you will need to contact your post office to ensure that they are delivering the Road Noise to you.

Make sure tri-folds, Chapter information forms, and other pertinent business documents are **written** legibly, including area codes, zip codes, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses. Use POSTAL CORRECT addresses. The following are address tips: Do not abbreviate County Road, Minnesota State Highway, Circle, do not use # sign (i.e. Co. Rd, ST, Hwy, CR, use Lot or Apt. or TRLR number, example: Trailer + number =TRLR 201 or Lot 201, or Apt

Memberships: Postcards go out to members who will expire at the end of that given month. Renewals must reach the State Office by the third Friday of the month, regardless of the date, to ensure you receive your next month's Road Noise. Use POSTAL CORRECT address!

Summer is here now and it's time to ride. When you're out riding, have membership tri-folds, your event posters, sponsorship forms, and rally posters. Remember, everyone is a sales person for A.B.A.T.E. chapter events, new members, and your rally party. Some of our chapters are a long way from little Bruno, MN, so if you, at any time, want posters, send me an email with an address and how many you want and I will send posters. I will take care of the postage at my end so feel free to do this. I will have them mailed to you ASAP. Jean Afrooz has spread sheets from last year and she is keeping track of who has been contacted so if you are going out for a ride, send her an email a couple days before you go and she will check her spread sheet. But don't let that slow us down. Be polite, ask if they have been contacted. Even if they decline to do it, thank them for their time. Maybe next year they will. Remember, motorcycle dealerships (metric and U.S.) have to send the sponsorship down their system to get an answer so we have to start now on them. Pretty much the same with parts shops and clothing outlets. Who do you get your motorcycle insurance through? If they are busy, leave the sponsorship forms with them and put your phone number on it so they can contact you if they decide to do it. Again, make sure you get a company card and do not put staples in it. Every thousand dollars gets your chapter two free tickets and that's why you need to let Jean know. If you send any to Mitch, send an email to Jean to let her know you did that but it will make her job much easier if you send them to her. I want to thank everybody for everything you can do for the rally. I will be out hitting the streets for sponsorships for the rally and my chapter's awesome Upper Kettle River Shakedown. Well, we had a successful A.B.A.T.E. U raffle. We sold a total of 750 tickets. So there will be a chapter payback but we just don't know how much as of yet, since all of the expenses aren't in. The committee decided that instead of waiting until the next board meeting to award the traveling plaque, that I would start taking this award and presenting it at an upcoming meeting or chapter event. So with that being said, I had the pleasure of going to the Borderland Chapter membership drive this past weekend to present this award. A big congratulations to them for selling a total of 91 tickets by the deadline. I also want to mention the other top two chapters: Glacial Ridge with 81 tickets sold and Freedom First Riders with 69 tickets sold. Thanks so much to all the chapters for their hard work.

At the last Board meeting I handed out tickets for the State Rally Raffle. We have gone back to once again offering the cash option on the grand prize. The deadline for chapter credit will be August 15th. If your chapter didn't receive any tickets, please feel free to contact me and I will be more than happy to mail some. Remember to send anything to me certified mail. You don't need to ask for a return receipt unless you want to. We just need to have the number so that we can track any missing tickets. One thing that we have noticed is that by sending things certified it is slowing up the process. So keep that in mind when you are asking for additional tickets for your summer events or when sending in for chapter credit. Also please keep in mind not to use address labels on the tickets and not to mail cash. The additional cost of sending tickets certified mail can be covered by your chapter gambling funds. I would just need a request filled out, signed by the President & Treasurer, and submitted to me along with a copy of the meeting minutes. Please don't mail any gambling forms, tickets or money to the State Office. Liz then only has to forward it to me. We had a chapter mail sold A.B.A.T.E. U raffle tickets to the State Office first, so they did not receive chapter credit on those tickets because I did not have them by the deadline. The other thing to keep in mind is that if someone wants to renew their membership along with purchasing a raffle ticket, we need two separate payments. Gambling has its own separate bank account. Funds cannot be intermingled in one account. So get out there and SELL, SELL, I would love to see us sell all 8,000 tickets. And who knows; maybe I will be visiting your chapter in September with an award.

Also, at the last Board meeting I handed out copies of the Buddy Bear receipts that need to be filled out by the organizations that you are donating the bears to. Once these receipts are completed, please get them in the mail to me as soon as possible. This is the only way that we know the bears have been distributed. This is still a concern with the gambling control board. If, for some reason, the receipts are forgotten when you do your runs, a piece of paper with the following information would be just fine:

- Name of Organization Receiving the Bears
- Date of Receipt
- Chapter donating the Bears & how many
- Signature from someone within the organization that is receiving the bears

I wanted to mention that at my April gambling meeting, I saw a lot of new faces, which is great. Due to the essence of time and the fact that some of my committee members had other meetings that they needed to be at following the gambling meeting, I was not able to address all of the questions from the new faces. So, with that being said, I would be more than happy to come and visit your chapter to answer any questions you may have or address any issues that have to do with gambling. I know that there are a lot of you out there that may think all the rules and regulations that A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota has to follow when it comes to gambling are things that A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota have put into place. That is not the case. These rules and regulations have been established by the Gambling Control Board. If you would like to learn more, take a ride this summer and attend one of our meetings.

Two Front Battle

Usually I write about the state level of politics in my monthly Legislative Director report but today I want to ask you all to turn your attention to the federal level. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation hosted its annual Bikers Inside the Beltway in mid May. This event is a lot like A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota's Bikerday at the Capitol ex-

cept it's in Washington D.C. We make appointments to talk to our elected officials about motorcycle related topics. The appointment process at the federal level is the subject of this article.

When I was making the appointments, I received some very positive and prompt responses, and then on the other hand some offices weren't so prompt or positive. Now I am not going to throw people under the bus and start naming names, what I am going to do is put some of the blame on us. We just simply need to do a better job of establishing relationships with our elected officials at the federal level. We have over five million people living in Minnesota and our two U.S. Senators represent all of us. We need to put our name and cause in front of them anytime we get a chance. When a motorcycle rights topic comes up and the alert goes out we all need to make those contacts, it's the only way we will show up in a sea of five million people. Our U.S. Representatives each serve over six hundred thousand people, again a pretty big challenge. I know that when I see my U.S. Rep he knows me by name and it's no small coincidence that we received a prompt response to our meeting request. He knows me because he sees me on a regular basis. I attend town hall meetings, fundraisers, campaign events, and I pound campaign signs into the ground for him and in return when we need him he is there for us. Now we don't need all eight of our U.S. Reps to know us on a first name basis but we do need them to know us by two names, A.B.A.T.E. and MRF. Some of our elected officials at the federal level are very familiar with those letters and some are not, that is your challenge. Make the relationships happen and get our names out there so we can protect our right to ride free and safe.

Motorcycle Only Checkpoint Introduced

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) reports that Congressman James Sensenbrenner (Wisconsin) filed a bill on Tuesday, May 7th to prohibit the federal funding of motorcycle only roadside checkpoints.


The bill, H.R. 1861, has nine original co-sponsors however, we need many more to pass this landmark legislation.

Sensenbrenner had this to say in a 'Dear Colleague letter' that is circulating in the House of Representatives; 'In the 112th Congress, I introduced H.R. 904, a bill to prohibit the Department of Transportation (DOT) from providing funds to state and local authorities for the purpose of creating motorcycle only checkpoints. Section one of the Stop Motorcycle Checkpoint Funding Act contains the same language as H.R. 904. However, this bill also contains language to force the DOT to focus motorcycle safety efforts on crash prevention programs, not national helmet mandates.

The bill was officially introduced on May 7th. It's important to contact your sitting member of the House of Representatives and ask them to be a co-sponsor of this important legislation. Ask them to contact Congressman James Sensenbrenner and lend their support as co-sponsor of H.R. 1861.

A couple of high interest items for me at this convention will be the update on the patch discrimination federal lawsuit and the government harassment lawsuit –Las Vegas. They will also do a presentation titled "your rights during a traffic stop" this is good information to stay current on, and many that know me know this will be a priority to me. If you don't know your rights how would you plan to protect them? I will share more about these and other topics in future reports.

I also want to talk a little about the recently completed A.B.A.T.E. University. First I offer a thank you to Marilyn & Keith for all their hard work making this event a success. As you know we brought lunch speakers Double D and Twitch in from Washington State. This year we moved the lunch presentation to the large banquet rooms, it was a good thing we did because we had excellent attendance. I think the largest we have ever had for the lunch meeting.

I want to thank our speakers Double D & Twitch for coming all the way from Washington to share their success story. I also want to say thank you to all that attended the presentation, thanks for taking a little time out of your weekend to learn about a problem that affects many of our motorcycling friends. Interesting to note on one place they say all motorcycles welcome and then they print "NO COLORS" in another. This is a new place to see discrimination. Typically these charities have done all they could to divert money from motorcyclists to their causes. Now it appears they want to pick and choose which motorcyclists they strip of their money. Is this also sending a signal that if someone is in need of help this organization that we call a charity would refuse to help someone if they are wearing a patch?

I know at least one A.B.A.T.E. member that has made contacts trying to rectify this situation, and was unable to resolve the problem. We also do not understand if this is a local decision or a practice we will see in all rides that support this effort. We have been unable to get these questions answered and realize we may find this has been initiated by a misdirected individual or small group. Nonetheless it is what we are presented with at the time of this writing. This is information I encourage everyone to consider before dropping your money at this event. My decision is made, I will support events that don't discriminate against my friends that ride while showing support for clubs or organizations they belong to; I encourage you to do the same.
