Student Contract for Kolbe's Online Academy

Parent/Guardian: Please read the below contract with your student and both of you initial each statement.

I. <u>Acceptable Behavior Policy</u>

Students must adhere to the following behavior policies during the live Adobe Connect classes and in using the MyKolbe website.

- The student will use proper "netiquette." The privacy of students and staff will be kept. Distribution of email addresses, home addresses, or phone numbers is strictly forbidden.
- Appropriate and courteous language should be used at all times.
- Message content in student work and comments made during the course may be accessed, retrieved, redistributed, and printed by teachers at any time. Kolbe Academy will determine the appropriateness of the language, messages, or conduct.
- Inappropriate language, messages, or conduct pertaining to, for instance, harassment, unlawful solicitation, and
 distribution of offensive material, etc. is strictly prohibited and may result in disciplinary action and/or my
 removal from class.

If any of the above behaviors become problematic, then chat, whiteboard, and discussion privileges may be restricted or removed at any time.

II. Academic Integrity Policy

Kolbe Academy takes academic dishonesty very seriously. Students who are suspected of academic dishonesty may be contacted first by the teacher as a warning depending on the severity of the offense. Continued abuse can result in suspension and/or expulsion from your Online Course.

Plagiarism is the use of another's words, ideas, and/or research without proper attribution to the source of that information. Plagiarism can be the deliberate representation of another's work as one's own or the unintentional failure to give credit to the proper source for borrowed information. Plagiarism can constitute a legal offense. Cheating is an unwarranted use of materials in one's academic work. Unoriginal student work can include either of these, or simply be the unbalanced usage of material from outside sources in a student's work. As a general rule, a student's work should not contain more borrowed information than the student's own original research, reason, and thought.

Please make sure that you know how to avoid plagiarism, and are aware that plagiarism and cheating are serious offenses that can follow them in their academic records. Consult a style guide such as MLA Handbook for Writers, by Joseph Gibaldi, to teach your junior high and high school students how to properly document their sources.

Examples of Academic Dishonesty in a Kolbe Academy Online Course include:

- Using Kolbe Academy homeschool exams and/or answer keys to study for exams
- Treating exams as open book unless otherwise specified by the instructor
- Using Google Translate or other web translators for language courses
- Copying Wikipedia or other internet sources to answer homework or test questions
- Collaborating with other students, tutors, or parents to answer exam questions (unless specified by teacher)
- Generally speaking, any student work that contains more borrowed information than the student's own original research, reason, and thought, can be considered academic dishonesty

Not sure if something is considered plagiarism or academic dishonesty? Ask yourself the following questions:

- Does my work reflect my own knowledge, thoughts, or research? If it doesn't, have I properly cited the knowledge, thoughts or research of the source?
- Does participating in this action put me at an unfair advantage over other students in my course?



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III. Study Skills Course

All Fall/Spring Online Academy students are required to watch a set of 10-20 minutes study skills videos before Orientation Week. The Study Skills videos include information on:

- Research Skills
- Reading for Content and Note taking
- Writing
- Academic Dishonesty & Plagiarism
- Time Management
- Taking an Online Course

IV. Subsidiarity

It is the goal of Kolbe Academy Home School to encourage every home schooling family to be independent, self-reliant, and totally confident in the education of their children in the home. Kolbe Academy understands and appreciates that parents, in making the decision to home school, have chosen not to abdicate nor delegate their responsibility as the primary educators of their children, but to embrace that responsibility. Often, homeschool families find that they need additional help in embracing that responsibility. As such, the online courses offered at Kolbe Academy often fit that need and become a tremendous help to the family. It is important to realize that when enrolling your child in an online course, you are delegating your subsidiarity to the Instructor for that particular course. Specifically, it is important to understand that you are delegating the following duties:

- 1) Emphasis on Course Plan content
- 2) Number, breadth, and depth of assignments
- 3) Assessment
- 4) Grading of all assignments
- 5) Final Quarter and Semester Grades

If, at any point during the school year, you find that you need to take that responsibility back, Kolbe Academy will work with you going forward to help you utilize your investment in the online course resources and materials. However, please note that you child's coursework will have to be resubmitted to Kolbe Academy for homeschool credit, and will no longer receive the OK or OH course designations indicating that the grade is instructor-assigned.

The teacher has been given the right (by the parent) to give assignments and make assessments at his/her discretion. Comprehensive daily and/or weekly work will be part of the student's overall grade. Course requirements and expectations needed to successfully complete the online course as informed by the instructor must be adhered to. It is the student's responsibility to be prepared for each class. It is the student's responsibility to make up for any work missed due to an absence and that late or missing work may affect the final grade. All parents are required to watch a fifteen minute presentation on the role of the parent in your child's Online Course. Please find the link to this presentation in your child's Welcome Packet email.

V. System, Software & Hardware Requirements Policy

There is a learning curve to successfully completing and engaging in an online course. Be prepared to be equipped to meet the challenges of online learning. The student should attend class orientation via Adobe Connect to insure that the proper technological processes needed to complete the online course are learned. Please also make sure you meet the following technical requirements to complete this online course successfully.

- You must have the necessary system requirements in order to participate in these courses (click here for hosted and licensed deployments for Adobe Connect 9).
- A DSL/Cable connection or better for broadband internet access.
- A headset with microphone and earphones for the student's computer is required. (Please note, the built-in microphone on a computer may not be used due to potential feedback problems)
- You must have access to a word processing program (such as Microsoft Word), a scanner (or digital camera
 that can upload clear images to a computer) and a printer for completing homework as assigned by each
 instructor.



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- A webcam may be required by the instructor.
- To minimize audio issues and maximize internet bandwidth for the duration of the student's live online class,
 other uses of the internet should be minimized during the student's live classes. This means only running Adobe
 Connect during live sessions, no surfing on other internet sites or checking email during, and other members of
 the family minimizing their internet use during class.
- It is best for students to login to their Adobe Connect Online Class about 20-30 minutes before class begins to have their microphone checked by a technical moderator. Once checked in, students should not log out of class, but they do not need to be active in the classroom until the actual class begins).

VI. Online Course Enrollment and Withdrawal Policies

A. Summer Courses

Enrollment & Payment Policy: Payment must be made in full at the time of enrollment for all Online Summer Courses.

Refund Policy: Kolbe Academy respects the fact that life is unpredictable and that it may become necessary for you to withdraw from a course. However, we have secured teachers for the courses based on enrollment. In consideration to you and our teachers, we offer the following refund policy:

- Each course tuition contains a \$20 non-refundable fee per course.
- A full refund, minus the \$20 non-refundable fee, will be given up to and including the first class.
- Once your child has attended their second summer class, NO REFUND will be given.
- If removed from a course for a disciplinary action, no refund will be given.
- Kolbe Academy reserves the right to cancel a course due to extenuating circumstances. If that should happen, you will receive a full refund for the course or a credit for another course, whichever you prefer.

B. Fall/Spring Courses

Enrollment & Payment Policy: Enrollment in FACTS management system for all tuition and enrollment fees is required for payment. Payment in full or payment plans of semi-annual, quarterly, or monthly may be set up through FACTS management system.

Refund Policy: Kolbe Academy respects the fact that life is unpredictable and that it may become necessary for you to withdraw from a course. However, we have secured teachers for the courses based on enrollment. In consideration to you and our teachers, we offer the following refund policy:

- Students who are enrolled full-time in the Online Academy will have a \$50 non-refundable fee if they change to part-time or withdraw completely.
- Students who are enrolled part-time in the Online Academy will have a non-refundable \$20 fee per course.
- A full refund, minus the non-refundable fees, will be given up to and including the first week of class, not including orientation week.
- Once your child has attended a class during their second week of class, NO REFUND will be given.
- If removed from a course for a disciplinary action, no refund will be given.
- Kolbe Academy reserves the right to cancel a course due to extenuating circumstances. If that should happen, you will receive a full refund for the course or a credit for another course, whichever you prefer.
