Presentations

There will be three options for presentations as well as forums for informal discussion:

Oral presentation:

Twenty minutes, including five minutes for discussion. Preference will be given to talks focusing on SHRIMP-specific issues such as instrument behaviour, method development and novel applications. A formal abstract will need to be submitted as outlined on the next page.

We would also recommend that authors give consideration to presenting at appropriate sessions in the 34th IGC.

2 Lightning talk:

Do you have something quick to report? Some unexpected data that doesn't seem to fit? A negative experiment you want to warn others about? An idea or a new concept you'd like to get feedback on? Even a call to action for the SHRIMP community?

Borrowing an idea from other conferences, the Workshop will offer sessions for 'Lightning talks' of up to five minutes each followed by discussion time. The intent is to present one—and only one—idea in a less formal way and then see where the group discussion takes it.

A formal abstract will not be required, but a brief outline of your proposed presentation will need to be provided to the Workshop organisers.

Poster:

Space will be provided for poster presentations and time organised for authors to present and discuss their work. As posters are most likely to be re-used for the 34th IGC, we will match the size specifications for that meeting and provide details as soon as they are available.



Abstracts

Abstract Deadline: Friday 30 March 2012.

An abstract volume will be published by Geoscience Australia as a Geoscience Australia Record (GA Record).

Abstracts should be submitted in the format of a GA Record with text file in Word.docx or .doc format. As well as being in the Word document, figures in .jpg format and tables in Excel.xml format should be submitted separate to the document. Extended abstracts are limited to three printed pages. All cited references must be listed in full at the end of the abstract with journal names in expanded form as per GA Record style.

An electronic copy of the GA Record template is available via request to the email address below and will be available on the Workshop internet site.

Travel Information

Visas

International delegates will need a visa to enter Australia. The only exceptions are citizens of Australia and New Zealand. Official letters of invitation will be provided to delegates by Geoscience Australia only after the registration payment has cleared.

Please allow a minimum of eight weeks for processing of visa applications (no later than 30 May 2012 is recommended for submission). Further information is available at:

Brisbane and Queensland

Brisbane is the capital of Queensland and one of the fastest growing regions in Australia. Thirty airlines fly in and out of Brisbane Airport and a light-rail link takes only 20 minutes to get to and from the central city.

South-east Queensland is renowned for its climate, especially mild winters. The mean daily maximum and minimum temperature in Brisbane in August is 22° C and 10° C respectively. The venue at O'Reilly's Rainforest Retreat is on the sapphire-misted flanks of an ancient shield volcano at an elevation of 900 metres so temperatures will likely be lower, especially at night.
