Classes Available Basic Lay Servant Ministries

The *Lay Servant Ministries Basic Course* is a foundational course designed to equip church leaders and renew current leaders in The United Methodist Church. It explores personal spiritual gifts, servant leadership, each leader's role in developing future leaders, the importance of consistent spiritual practices, the core ministries of Leading, Caring, and Communicating and much more.

The Basic Course can be used for both adults and youth.

Advanced Class -

"This Holy Mystery: A United Methodist Understanding of Holy Communion"

The time when the Church participates in Holy Communion has been called 'The Church at its best.' With that as our theme, we have the opportunity to study together this Sacrament that is celebrated among God's people at this time when Christ has promised to be present.

The goal of our study is the renewal of worship in United Methodist congregations through enhanced appreciation of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. We will explore this 'means of grace' and seek to deepen our experience of encounter with God. In 2004 the General Conference approved an official comprehensive statement of the practice and theology of the Lord's Supper. This document is known as

"This Holy Mystery: A United Methodist Understanding of Holy Communion." Following the release and approval of that document, Gayle Carlton Felton wrote a commentary and study guide to help us, as United Methodists, explore United Methodist position on Holy Communion. With this book as our guide, we will look at *how* we practice the Lord's Supper and *why* we do what we do.

In the United Methodist Church a lay servant, local church or certified, is a professing member of a local church who is ready and desirous to serve the Church and who is well informed on and committed to the Scriptures and the doctrine, heritage, organization, and life of The United Methodist Church and who has received specific training to develop skills in witnessing to the Christian faith through spoken communication, church and community leadership, and care-giving ministries. (par. 266, 2012 <u>The Book of</u> <u>Discipline</u>).

A certified lay speaker is one who has completed at least one advanced class and continues to serve in the above ways. In addition, the certified lay speaker may serve in the district and conference and in local churches other than the local church in which membership is held. At least one advanced course every three years must be completed for continuance. (pages 210 and 211 in 2012 <u>The Book of Discipline</u>. Please read paragraph 266 in its entirely.
