

Facilitating independent living and developing a plan for facing late-life transitions



<u>Dear Marci- Medicare Rights</u> <u>Center</u>

Dear Marci,

My husband was recently admitted to the hospital with a broken hip. He can leave the hospital

soon, but I am unwell myself and I'm worried I won't be able to take care of him properly. Will Medicare pay for him to stay in a nursing home until he is able enough to take care of himself?

—Brooke (Austin, TX)

Dear Brooke,

Medicare will pay for a limited number of days (As long as it is medically necessary, Medicare will pay the full cost of the first 20 days and part of the cost of another 80 days of care in a Medicarecertified skilled nursing facility (SNF) each benefit period. A benefit period begins the day you enter the SNF and ends when you no longer receive SNF care for 60 days in a row.) in a "skilled nursing facility" (SNF) only if your loved one had been admitted to a hospital as an in-patient for three days in a row within 30 days of admission to the SNF, requires daily skilled nursing or therapy services, and receives the care in a Medicare-certified SNF.

A SNF is a Medicare-approved facility that provides short-term post-hospital extended care services at a lower level of care than provided in a hospital. If you do not meet the Medicare SNF requirements, you may qualify for Medicare to pay for some home health care.

The Medicare Rights Center (MRC) is the largest independent source of Medicare information and assistance in the United States. Founded in 1989, MRC helps older adults and people with disabilities get high-quality, affordable health care.

Health Tip

Our bodies need water more than food, sleep or even exercise to stay active. Water cushions and lubricates brain and joint tissue, and helps regulate body



temperature. So when you are out enjoying the warm weather this summer, it is very important that you remember to stay hydrated!

For older adults, especially, the need to be aware of water intake is important. As we grow older, we often drink less than our bodies need. So here are some tips to make sure you are getting your prescribed daily intake:

- Have a beverage that you enjoy with every meal and snack. A glass of water or a cup of juice can really help. Even caffeinated drinks, while they should not be your primary source of hydration, can contribute to you daily water needs.
- Don't exclusively rely on thirst. As we age, our bodies lose the ability to detect thirst. Also, certain medications can cause dehydration.
- Eat more fruits and vegetables. Most fruits have 80 to 90 percent water content. They are a great supplement to drinking plain water.
- Use the color of your urine as a guide. If the color is light yellow or clear, you're drinking enough fluids. If it is dark yellow, you need to drink more.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES (714) 374-1742

Senior Services provides transportation each weekday, from 8:30 a.m.—4:30 p.m., for all your transportation needs within Huntington Beach. The *Surf City Seniors on the Go* program buses seniors to Rodgers Seniors Center for the congregate lunch program, classes and activities. Medical Transportation is also available to Hoag Memorial Presbyterian Hospital, Fountain Valley Regional Hospital and to Orange Coast Memorial Hospital.

A Volunteer Escort is available to provide extra assistance on errands and appointments. When you book your ride, tell dispatch you need an escort.

Our transportation appointments fill quickly. Please give as much notice as possible. **Five days notice is required.** Same day service is offered on a space available basis.

24 hours notice is required for cancellations. Call 714-374-1742 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to schedule your ride. New client intakes are done after 3:00 p.m. Although, there is no charge to seniors for transportation, donations are appreciated. Transportation's cost averages \$6.00-10.00 per ride and your generous donations as well as grant monies keep our wheels rolling.


