

About HELPS

All too often we are energized by information learned at seminars, lectures and presentations, only to arrive back home or work and ask “**Okay, so how do I actually do that?**” **HELPS** is a unique curriculum, combining lectures, hands-on instruction and real-life practical problem solving. It is applicable across settings—at home, at work and in the community. Participants acquire skills in teaching/coaching individuals to gain independence in self-management while increasing their understanding of the theory and application of positive behavioral supports.

At the beginning of the series, each **HELPS** student selects an individual they support to be their focus in completing homework assignments. Students apply the classroom instruction and demonstrations to real-life situations, creating person-specific interventions that they review with the **HELPS** instructors.

The **HELPS** sessions are successive, not stand alone modules. Participants need to attend all three sessions in order to complete required homework assignments. This series of **HELPS** is offered **free-of-charge** to individuals involved in the direct support of people who experience developmental disabilities.

A **FREE** training series for direct support staff, domestic employees (including family member providers), foster care providers and independent contractors who work with individuals with developmental disabilities.

Session I: April 15, 2010 9 am to 5 pm

Communication & Organization: Using specific examples reported by the students, we examine issues of communication, organization and social relationships in common across diagnoses. During a sensitivity component, students complete tasks while their sensory abilities are challenged.

Structure & Visual Support Strategies: Description of visual support strategies and how they increase independence in self-management and contribute to the development of positive behavioral interventions. Demonstration of visual structure systems in current use.

Homework Assignments: Students select the individual they support who will be their focus during the training series and complete a worksheet regarding issues of language, social skills and sensory perception as observed in this focus person.



Session II: April 29, 2010 9 am to 5 pm

Understanding Functional Assessment & Behavior Support Plans: Large group practice in interviewing and completing a functional assessment. Development of various components of a plan in small groups. Students receive multiple tracking and brainstorming tools, functional assessment and behavior support plan quality assurance review formats, as well as published articles on functional assessment and behavioral supports.

Assessment & Observation: Using lecture and video clips, this class encompasses techniques for accurate observation and assessment of communication & level of independence in daily living skills. Using sample forms, students complete assessments on the individuals viewed in the clips.

Homework Assignments: Students use the sample observation and assessment forms to conduct an assessment of their focus person and bring it to the final class for review and discussion

Session III: May 13, 2010 9 am to 5 pm

Use of Social Stories™ & Visual Systems, including Boardmaker™: Description of these interventions & their appropriate use. Students develop and analyze social stories™ they have created. Students are presented with examples of visual structure, which they then replicate in a small group process, demonstrating their ability to competently use the Boardmaker™ program.

Make & Take Session: Using provided materials, each student builds a piece of visual structure designed specifically for the individual who has been their focus during the HELPS training series.
