The Aging Mind

As the proportion of older people in the population grows, it becomes increasingly important to understand age-related changes in cognitive functioning. For the many aging people in good physical condition, cognitive decline is the main threat to their ability to continue enjoying their favorite activities; for those whose physical activities are limited, cognitive decline is a major additional threat to quality of life. The view that aging is synonymous with universal and rapid cognitive decline is giving way to a recognition that for some aging individuals, mental acuity continues well into advanced age. Moreover, recent scientific findings give growing reason to believe that it may be possible to help older people maintain more of their cognitive function into later years. Jim Clark, Professor of Psychology at the University of Winnipeg, will describe some of the changes that occur in the human brain during later life, and what the consequences are for attention, memory, and other mental processes. He will also consider some of the adaptations that people can make to compensate for these changes.

In an expanding and socially fractious early twentieth century Winnipeg, Lewis Benjamin Foote (1873 – 1957) rose to become the city's pre-eminent photographer. Documenting everything from royal visits to deep poverty, from the building of the Fort Garry Hotel to the turmoil of the 1919 General Strike, Foote's photographs are iconic representations of early Winnipeg life. In her book, *Imagining Winnipeg*, historian Esylit W. Jones takes us beyond the iconic to reveal the complex artist behind the lens. Join us for this presentation of the great artists work and discussion of his life and artistry by Ms. Jones, who literally "wrote the book" on Mr. Foote. Esylit W. Jones is an assistant professor in the Department of History at the University of Manitoba.

## Get the shot, not the flu!

The annual seasonal flu shot is available to all Manitobens at no charge. It will offer protection against three seasonal flu strains.

An annual flu shot is especially important for those at increased risk of serious illness from the flu, their caregivers and close contacts.

#### This includes:

- seniors age 65 or older
- · children age six months to five years
- those with chronic illness
- pregnant women
- residents of personal care homes or long-term care facilities
- health care workers and first responders
- individuals of Aboriginal ancestry
- people who are severely overweight or obese
- or as determined by your primary health care provider

If you are 65 or older or have a chronic illness, you should also get a pneumo shot. One pneumo shot may give you a lifetime of protection.

#### **Population Aging: Apocalypse or Cause for Celebration?** 1355 1:30-3:00 p.m.

The fact that people live longer than ever should be celebrated as one of the biggest success stories in history. Yet stories abound in the media about the "gray tsunami;" how seniors are going to bankrupt the health care system, and how the Canadian pension system will collapse under the growing older population. In this presentation some of the myths about the impact of the aging population on society will be dispelled. Dr. Verena Menec is a Professor in the Department of Community Health Sciences, Faculty of Medicine and the Director of the Centre on Aging at the University of Manitoba. She currently holds a Canada Research Chair in Healthy Aging. Her main research interests lie in the areas of healthy aging, determinants of healthy aging, age-friendly communities, and health care utilization among older adults, particularly at the end of life.

#### The New Normal for Manitoba's Climate 1:30-3:00 p.m.

The concept of "normal" in climatology defines the range of conditions expected in the near future, based upon the recent past, with the assumption that the recent past is a reasonable approximation of the near future. Thanks to climate change, this assumption of "stationarity" in the climate is no longer valid. One of the most important consequences of non-stationarity in the climate system is that the probability of extreme events will change. Dr. Blair will discuss the evidence for non-stationarity in Manitoba's rapidly changing climate, and will review the implications of continuing change in the coming decades on the nature and impacts of extreme weather. Blair is the Associate Dean of Science at the University of Winnipeg, where he is also a Professor of Geography and the Acting Principal of the Richardson College for the Environment. His main research interests are climate variability and change in Canada's western interior.

Yet, with both his business and many personal ties to this city, he never lived here. As we explore his varied and fascinating life, we'll come to know, and maybe even care about, this forgotten builder of the Winnipeg we enjoy.

We humans have been trying to understand our origin for something over 2,500 years. For most of that time, our origin was explained by the supernatural actions of gods. The first book to explore human evolution specifically was



that of T.H. Huxley in 1863, based largely on the comparative anatomy of living species, humans and the great apes. The earliest fossils that show inklings of human-like features date to about 7 million years ago. In the last 50 years, we have developed technologies for comparing the structural similarities of DNA from different sources. These approaches have confirmed our close relationship to the apes and revealed genetic legacies tracing back to bacteria, and they confirm that we are still evolving. Dr. Lockhart obtained his doctorate in Biochemistry from the University of Western Ontario. He is an Adjunct Professor, University of Manitoba, Department of Entomology, and Department of Zoology.
