SERVICE, COMMITMENT & GRATITUDE

When I returned to New Jersey after 9 years in North Carolina, it took me almost no time to find a home group. After attending for a month I realized that my group had no Group Representative. I volunteered to fill the position and was elected. At the first assembly as a new GR, I was surprised to see that there were few familiar faces. I wondered if the people I knew from previous years of service had stopped coming to Al-Anon, moved, stopped doing service outside the group or simply rotated out of service to allow others the privilege of growing through service. I learned the answer was, "All of the above."

When I first came to Al-Anon I didn't get involved in service, I didn't ask my sponsor for help in applying the Al-Anon program to my life; all I did was go to meetings. When my life got busy, I decided I couldn't afford the one hour a week I was spending at a meeting, besides, I was smart, I had the literature and books. I stopped going to meetings for a while. Within a few short weeks my life went from bad to horrible. I didn't understand that my dis-ease was progressing. I lived on cigarettes and coffee, developed several stress related conditions and became physically, emotionally and spiritually bankrupt. I thought the problem was my husband, his drinking and other behavior that accompanies alcoholism.

My sponsor died, and I was left without any ties to Al-Anon, or so I thought. A friend carried me kicking and screaming back to "the rooms." At the very first meeting I set up chairs and cleaned ashtrays. (Remember those smoking meetings?) Every meeting after that found me putting literature out, welcoming a newcomer; I became the official hugger for the group.

I got a new sponsor, helped a friend start a new meeting, led beginners' meetings, attended at least 5 meetings a week, became the Group Rep for my new home group and became the District Rep at my first Assembly meeting. That was twenty-two years ago. In doing one of my 4th Step inventories I considered the difference between my first attempt at Al-Anon and my second. During my first year in Al-Anon the focus was on the drinker and getting him to change; I attended meetings to learn

what I could do to fix him. I was sure there was a magic formula that would eventually be revealed. During my second and all subsequent years in Al-Anon, the focus was on myself. I used *all* the tools of the program. I did service to my group, the District, the Area, and served as an Alateen sponsor in 2 states. Eventually I had the privilege of serving on an In-Town Committee. The difference was the commitment I made to myself and to Al-Anon. I *bought in* to the program, signed on, so to speak, and Al-Anon became an integral and vital part of my life.

As the result of participation in service I have met Al-Anons from all over the world. My life has been enriched by giving back, in gratitude, what was so freely given to me. Commitment to service work in Al-Anon has deepened my ties to members of the program and from them I learned how to apply this program to all aspects of living.

With gratitude in my heart I serve as GR, and when needed, lead meetings, set up or clean up for my home group. My sponsor told me to participate in service outside my group, I became Ala-Gram editor. Our program has three legacies, the Steps for personal growth, the Traditions for groups unity and the Concepts of Service that guide our service structure. I use all three legacies in my personal program of recovery. Life is not perfect, but Al-Anon has given me the tools I need to have a happy, serene and grateful life regardless of circumstances.

I urge each of you to make a commitment to yourself by participating in service to Al-Anon.

Alateen went to Ewing High School and handed out literature, one packet was made for Alateens and the other was made for adults. The turn out was well attended.

**MISSION IMPOSSIBLE?
AL-ANON LITERATURE IN EVERY LIBRARY
IN NJ!**

World Service has asked us to try to place Al-Anon literature in every library so the public can be more informed of our existence. After 50 years, people may forget that we are still around, so we have to gently do our 12th Step and drop gentle reminders wherever people go to read about alcoholism and it's effect on them. If your group has some extra money, try purchasing one of the books below to donate to your local library.

First, go to your local library and ask them where the literature is on alcoholism and look to see if they have any Al-Anon literature. If they don't, ask if they would accept a donation from the local group and if you could place a sticker with a toll free number to call, or a hand written number. Then, someone could contact World Service or the local literature depot, which would provide a number to call for a meeting in their area.

Then, the next time your group places a literature order, get an extra book to place in the library, or you could take a special collection to purchase some books. This is the group's choice as to how to finance. This can be done at the local public library; middle and high school, or if you have a college in your town, ask there also. The books that World Service suggested are:

Elementary, middle or high school:

- Alateen: Hope for Children of Alcoholics (B-3) \$5.50
- Alateen-A Day At A Time (B-10) \$7.00
- Courage to Be Me-Living with Alcoholism (B-23) \$9.00

Church Library:

- As We Understood (B-11) \$8.50
- Having Had a Spiritual Awakening (B-25) \$10.00

College, University or Medical Library:

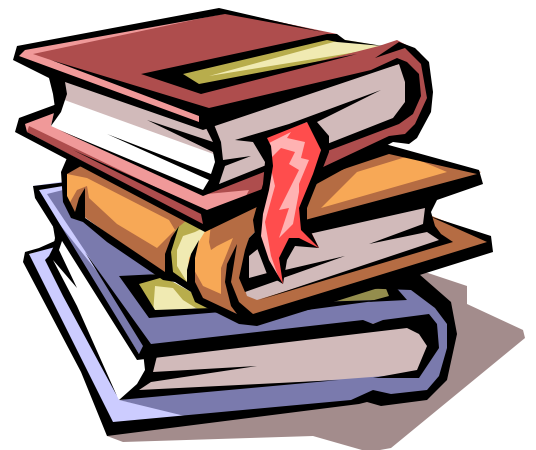
- How Al-Anon Works for Families & Friends of Alcoholics (B-22) \$11.00
- Paths to Recovery-Al-Anon's Steps, Traditions and Concepts (B-24) \$15.00
- From Survival to Recovery: Growing Up in an Alcoholic Home (B-21) \$13.00
- In All Our Affairs: Making Crises Work for You (B-15) \$10.00
- Courage To Be Me- Living with Alcoholism (B-23) \$9.00

Public Library- Any of the books listed above. My suggestion would be at least one book from each category.

Russia/Ukraine

With each pack was a note from our Area wishing the group a Merry Christmas and peace and serenity in the New Year.

I will be writing a letter to each group in the near future and would like to enlist your help. In some of the letters we have received, the groups ask about us and how we are doing, and all I have been able to do is speak from my own experience. I think we can strengthen the bonds between our groups if they heard from someone other than me.

Here's a thought for doing some personal long-distance twelfth step work without leaving home. How about taking a mini-meeting to our groups in Russia and Ukraine.

How about reaching out a few thousand miles and sharing some of YOUR experiences, strengths, and hopes with our extended AA-Anon family members. Write to me via the Alagram or e-mail me [russian@nj-aa-anon.org] a brief note and I will have it translated and forward it to them. All replies will be translated and forwarded to you by way of the Alagram.

You never know how much you might help someone who is suffering and hears what they need in what you write. You might want to consider suggesting a few topics that have been most helpful to you. Every two or three months we could pick one, a few of you could send me your brief comments on that topic, and I would forward them as part of a letter to each of the groups. Who knows? This could develop into something really good, for them and for you. Without your help, however, this will 'never fly', and we'll never know what we missed because we didn't try.

We're More than Meeting Books

Information Services

Information Services is a very important service arm in Al-Anon. When you first call seeking help, your call is directed to the Information Service answering bureau. For most of us, that's the first friendly voice that we hear in Al-Anon.

In New Jersey, we have two information services and renting the office space, paying for the phone service and keeping staff on hand is a very expensive operation. Like the Assembly, information service is funded by donations from the groups, but unlike the Assembly, they also have another source of funding; the literature depots maintained by each information service. **So, remember, when you order literature, make sure that you place your order with your local LDC.** It's the same price as ordering from World Service, but it will go a long way to keeping your service arms in this state afloat.

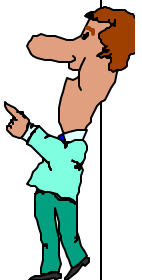
