

To honor Ivan, we wish to seek employees wishing to further their career and skills.

OBJECTIVE

To accumulate and distribute scholarship funds for the purpose of underwriting a portion of the post secondary school tuition costs to vocational or trade school institutions as well as other skills training opportunities for individuals who are seeking business, trade or technical skills attainment.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Scholarship Committee will meet at the request of the Chamber of Commerce Executive Director for the purpose of reviewing submitted applications.

CRITERIA

Must be an employee of a Lowell Area Chamber of Commerce Member in good standing.

ELIGIBILITY

- Employee shows evidence of a high school education and employment with a member business of the Lowell Area Chamber of Commerce at the time of application. Note: Award payment is also contingent upon continued employment (full or part time) by the member business employee.
- The request must benefit the chamber member business.
- Submit with the application proof of acceptance to take classes from a vocational or trade school or other skills training class pertaining to the Vision.
- Show evidence of a minimum of 15 hours of volunteer service over the past 12 months within the Greater Lowell Community.

APPLICATION & WINNER SELECTION

To be eligible for consideration, application, volunteer hours, and required attachments must be turned into the Lowell Area Chamber of Commerce. Deadline for application: The 3rd Friday of April, August and December.



WHAT IS A VOLUNTEER?

A volunteer is a person that has a spirit of service, creativity, sensitivity for human pain, strong moral values, the ability to work in a team, and a social conscience. They practice solidarity, leadership, good interpersonal relationships, discipline, communication skills, and care for themselves and for others
