STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Students at Umpqua Community College are expected to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with an educational environment and in accordance with standards of the college that perpetuate its educational purpose. WHO MAY ENROLL?

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UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Graduates from accredited secondary schools.
- Individuals who have earned the GED Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school as juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website.

Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.

EARLY REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT

Student who register early for a subsequent term(s) must pay the tuition and fees due. Students with no schedule changes may mail or drop off a check (with their name and identification number) at the Cashier's Office by the dates listed for each term.

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees for fall term may be paid in one of the following ways:

- 1. Payment in full or online payment plan *by September 29.*
- 2. Approved Financial Aid.

Registration **AFTER September 29** must be accompanied by payment in full or online payment plan.

Failure to pay may result in being dropped from classes.

Any unpaid debts will be put into the collections process 30 days after the end of the quarter. Appeals may be submitted to the Finance Office.

COMMUNICATIONS CLASS PROJECT BENEFITS LOCAL ELEMENTARY

They call themselves the "Fantastic Four" and they are superheroes for the children at Lookingglass Elementary School in Winston.

The group of four first-year UCC students met in Paula Usrey's communications class last spring. The class was asked to break into small groups and complete a community service project. Kelsey Warren, Jamie Glen, Danny Medak, and Theresa Barry formed a group and set out to accomplish what they expected to be a modest project, one that would fulfill the class requirements.

"We decided we wanted to buy new roller skates for the kids at Lookingglass school," explained Glen. "The school has skating in the gym once a month and there weren't enough skates for all the kids who wanted to participate. We thought if we raised \$500 we could get enough skates for all the kids."

With that goal in mind, the Fantastic Four planned a fundraising raffle and event at Loggers Tap House in Roseburg. Loggers agreed to donate half of their food proceeds from the night to the Fantastic Four's cause and several people donated items for the raffle. In addition, the Josh Bidwell Foundation heard about the fundraiser and offered to pay for anything the group needed to replace all the skates at Lookingglass school.

In total, the group raised \$2,130 in cash and the Josh Bidwell Foundation pledged to fill in any gaps the group needed to buy 165 pairs of brand new skates. The group was overwhelmed by the response.

"We learned how giving this community can be and how to work collaboratively as a group," said Warren.

Added Barry, "We also made friends and now we all hang out together."

At least one group member, Jamie Glen, is reconsidering her future because of the success of their fundraising project.

"I think I figured out what I want to do," she said. "I think I want to be a fundraising coordinator for a non-profit."

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UCC HONORS LONG-TIME SUPPORTERS WITH BUILDING RENAMING







Umpqua Community College hosted three renaming ceremonies in June to honor the contributions of longtime college supporters.

On Wednesday, June 4, the college renamed the Campus Center Building in honor of LaVerne Murphy, who helped organize the college in 1964 and served on the budget committee until 2011. Murphy was the recipient of a number of service awards throughout his life, including his designation as the King of Sutherlin at the city's 150th anniversary celebration. Murphy passed away in 2011 at the age of 96. The LaVerne D. Murphy Center for Student Development is home to such campus services as financial aid, student life, counseling, and human resources.

On June 9, the college renamed the fitness center in honor of Tom Keel, a lifelong fitness enthusiast who served on the UCC board from 1975-2011. Keel is the longest-serving community college trustee in Oregon history. Keel is a regular visitor to the campus fitness center, which will now be known as the Tom Keel Center for Physical Fitness.

On June 10, the college renamed the Administration Building in honor of Del Blanchard, who served 32 years on UCC's board. Blanchard served 20 years in the US Navy and Ready Reserves, and founded Oregon Metalcraft in Myrtle Creek. The Del Blanchard Welcome Center serves as the starting point for all new students and includes such functions as admissions and registration.

REFUNDS

Students who withdraw from one or more UCC courses and who have complied with regulations governing withdrawals are entitled to certain refunds of tuition depending on the time of withdrawal. Refunds are limited to students who comply with withdrawal procedures.

Consequences for Not Paying

The college may take any or all of the following actions if students fail to pay their accounts:

- Require immediate payment in full
- Block enrollment for future terms
- Decline to provide official transcripts
- Turn accounts over to collections for non-payment after three months
- Assign the debt to the Oregon Department of Revenue to offset any refunds or sums due

VETERANS SERVICES

The placement test is required for all credit students. It is given on a walk-in basis in Testing Service in the Campus Center building. 541-440-4610.

DROPS / WITHDRAWALS

Students registered for classes are considered to be in attendance. Students discontinuing attendance without filing the official drop/ withdrawal form in the Registration Office may receive a failing grade. Recipients of Title IV financial aid are subject to the federal regulations for withdrawals from classes for a term.

Students wishing to drop/delete (which does not appear on the academic transcript) from a course(s) must initiate the withdrawal procedure within the first five instructional days of each term (except for classes less than 10 weeks in length). The appropriate form must be filed in the Registration Office. After five days, the following withdrawal (appears on the academic transcript as a "W") procedures must be followed.

WITHDRAWAL FROM UCC

To withdraw from all courses, students must get signatures from a counselor and the financial aid office. The withdrawal form must be completed and filed in the Enrollment Services Office.

WITHDRAWAL BY INSTRUCTOR

Students who register for a class but do not attend the first class, or who contact the instructor before the first class meeting of the term, may be withdrawn by the instructor.

STUDENT EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, covers the release and inspection of student educational records. In compliance with FERPA, Umpqua Community College has formulated the Student Records Policy to outline the proper handling and release of these records. See the UCC catalog at www.umpqua. edu.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Umpqua Community College defines certain information as "directory information," which may be released to a third party upon written request. Students may sign a Directory Information Hold Form to prevent the release of this information. Students who sign the request will not be listed in news releases concerning honor rolls or in commencement publications.

STUDENT ID CARDS

All registered students are entitled to an ID card. The ID card serves as official UCC photo identification and can be used as a UCC library card. A student ID card is required for a parking permit. ID cards are available from the Student Life Office. Students must show a copy of their current class schedule and another form of photo id.

PARKING

CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY

Campus security coverage is maintained weekdays by four full-time security officers and weekends by three part-time security officers. In addition to providing a safe working and learning environment, Campus Security enforces traffic and parking regulations, promotes crime prevention and secures the college buildings and facilities. How to get to UCC

Easy I-5 access. Take exit 129. If coming from the south, turn right at the stop, and left onto Umpqua College Road. If coming from the north, turn left at the stop sign. Continue traveling east on Umpqua College Road. Umpgua Community College is about one mile.

Parking

Umpqua Community College provides more than 450 parking spaces conveniently located near all campus buildings. Of these, about 171 are assigned to college faculty and staff.

All employees are given a yearly parking permit. Designated parking spots for employees are


marked by green lines, curbs and signs. All part-time and full-time students also receive a yearly parking permit. Designated parking spots for students are marked by yellow lines, curbs and signs. All white marked lines and curbs are regarded as open parking. These spots are available to everyone. There are 14 parking spots clearly designated for the college Motor Pool and are off limits to general parking. Red zones are usually fire related areas and are considered restricted lanes; no parking

is allowed at any time.


Visitor Parking -Visitor parking is clearly divided into two separate areas. One area is 30-minute visitor only and the other is Visitor Day parking only. All areas are designated by purple curbs, lines, and signs. The 30-minute only is for non-student activities and is strictly enforced. The Visitor Day parking is for specific day use only. Permits are available at the front desk of the Administrative Building or in advance through the UCC Security Department.

Disabled Person Parking — Special stickers are required for parking in clearly marked Disabled Parking spaces. These stickers are issued at the Oregon Division of Motor Vehicles.

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
