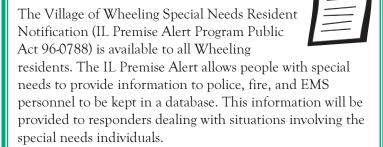

The information provided on the list will not result in preferential treatment, or change the response of trained emergency personnel. Inclusion on the list will result in emergency responders being better prepared to assist individual residents with special needs.

WHO SHOULD BE SCREENED?

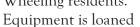

WHEELING POLICE CRIME PREVENTION POST OF THE MONTH

"YOU HAVE WON" SCAM

The Wheeling police receive many calls from people about lottery or sweepstakes scams. Here are a few quick reminders that if you get an unexpected call or mailing stating "YOU'RE A WINNER" you will have the right tools to avoid being cheated.



Here's how this con game works. The person calling or the mailing will be excited and can't wait for you to get your "money". But what comes next is they tell you there will be a fee, taxes or custom duties to pay. And all you have to do to be the "winner" is wire the fees or use a credit card. What could be simpler than that to claim your \$5 Million Dollar Prize?

The best thing to do is to simply say "No Thanks". Never share your information, credit card information or your Social Security number, it is a scam. Hang up and report this activity to the Federal Trade Commission at ftc.gov/complaint. Or Call 1-877-382-4357.

My name is Officer Kanches and I am the Crime Prevention Officer for the Wheeling Police Department. I want you to be prepared not to be a victim and how to handle an unexpected call and mailing telling you "YOU'RE A WINNER"!!!

Come see me at the monthly beat meeting at the Senior Center. I will spend some time talking to you about how telephone scams get you "hooked", how to handle an unexpected call and what to do about prerecorded calls.

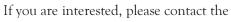

Did you recently receive a Tablet? Get off to the right start by learning how to use it!

Tablets have many features of laptop computers with an easier learning curve. They are extremely portable in your pocket or purse and simple to use for email, texting, Internet searching, learning and taking great pictures and movies. Enjoy the new technology without fear. SENIOR HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

Since Medicare Open Enrollment will be here soon here are some reminders about Medicare.

If you are an American citizen or a legal resident of the United States for at least 5 years, you are eligible for Medicare when you or your spouse turn 65 and have paid payroll taxes for at least 10 years. You must enroll in the program unless you already receive Social Security in which case you are automatically enrolled. If you work beyond 65 for an employer who provides health insurance you can delay enrollment until you retire.

<u>PART A</u> covers hospital services and skilled nursing facility stays for up to 100 days as well as in-home health care and hospice. All eligible people get Part A and most receive the coverage "premium free"; others pay a premium up to \$407 monthly.

<u>PART B</u> covers doctors' visits/outpatient services/lab work and preventive services. If your income is less than \$85,000 yearly, the monthly premium is \$104.90. Persons with higher income pay a premium which is capped out at \$335.70, with \$214,000 for individuals and \$428,000 jointly.

<u>PART C</u> covers Medicare Advantage Plans which is private insurance as an alternative to the Original Medicare Plan.

<u>PART D</u> covers prescription drugs. If your income is above a certain limit you will pay a certain premium related to the drugs in addition to your supplemental plan premium. You are on the hook for premiums, deductibles, coinsurance and co-payments. You may qualify for premium assistance depending on your income. The federal program for this assistance is "Extra Help".

There are a few categories which usually aren't covered under regular Medicare or separate plans such as dental, vision, hearing, foot care, and medical services outside the United States. Part C plans may offer such benefits. Remember, if you don't enroll in Medicare or have "creditable coverage" when you reach 65 you may penalized by Medicare; that penalty may remain on your account for some time

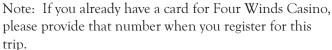

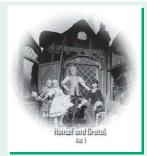

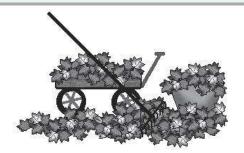
