



# **Community Initiatives and Affected Areas Programs** 2016-2017

The Community Initiatives and Affected Areas Program (CIP/AAP) supports projects identified as priorities within individual communities. The CIP/AAP programs are designed to help address the needs of Basin communities. The programs are flexible and able to accommodate individual processes and they incorporate community-based funding decisions to better meet local priorities. Program funds are allocated on a per capita funding formula and are distributed once a year to CBT's local government partners: the regional districts of East Kootenay, Central Kootenay and Kootenay Boundary, City of Revelstoke, Town of Golden, Village of Valemount, Ktunaxa Nation Council and Shuswap Indian Band.

Community Initiatives and Affected Areas Program Funding is for meeting community and public needs rather than private needs. The *Columbia Basin Trust Act* requires the Trust funding <u>NOT</u> relieve any level of government of its normal obligations. Program funds are not to be used to fund basic infrastructure activities such as roads, sewers, water systems, and core services provided through any level of government taxation.

#### **Project Proposal Guidelines**

### 1. Who Can Apply

a) Registered and non-registered non-profit and not-for-profit societies, groups, and organizations are invited to submit a project proposal that benefits one or more of the following electoral areas:

- b) Registered non-profit/not-for-profit organizations may request a value of choice from each electoral area per project proposal however; non-registered non-profit/not-for-profit organizations may only request funding support to an overall maximum of \$4999 per project proposal.
- c) The Project Proponent (as defined in Attachment A, section A item 2) assumes financial and project responsibility for the project outlined in this proposal. A sponsored organization is supported by a project proponent and funding will be conditional on the status of the project proponent. Individual and private sector proposals must be sponsored by a non-registered or registered non-profit not-for-profit organization and the project must clearly demonstrate community benefits.

### 2. Submissions and Inquiries

Proposals must be submitted using the project proposal form (Attachment A) and can be handwritten, typed, or completed using the fillable Adobe form from on RDCK website at <a href="http://rdck.ca/cip-aap">http://rdck.ca/cip-aap</a>. Proposals need to be delivered by the deadline for submissions date of Monday, February 29, 2016 to the following address:

#### 3. Key Time Periods

January 11, 2016 to February 29, 2016 – Project proposal intake period.

February 29, 2016 - Deadline for submissions - MONDAY, FEBRUARY 29, 2016 16:30 PST

May 2016 – June 2017 – The 2016/17 project period will be recognized as the day following the May 2016 RDCK Board Meeting to June 30, 2017. CIP/AAP funding is to be used in the manner outlined in Schedule A and the project is expected to be completed by June 30, 2017.

**June 30, 2017** - A final report accompanied by copies of invoices/receipts that support project expenditures incurred during the project period is expected to be submitted to the above noted office by June 30, 2017 or upon completion of the project, or upon expenditure of funds whichever comes first.

#### 4. General Information and Instructions

- A. **Proposal forms** are available on the RDCK website at <a href="http://rdck.ca/cip-aap">http://rdck.ca/cip-aap</a> and can be downloaded, completed, saved to PC, and emailed as noted in item 2. Proposals will also be available in hard copy from Area Directors, RDCK Services at the Creston Library, Lardeau Community Center, City and Village halls/municipal offices throughout the Regional District and the RDCK head office in Nelson. Proposals will be accepted by email (the preferred method); typed or handwritten and delivered to this office by fax, post, courier, or hand delivered.
- B. **One (1) project proposal** per project accepted, revised proposals must be clearly marked "REVISED" and received at this office prior to the submission deadline.
- C. **Required fields**: All fields are mandatory with the exception of Section A Sponsored Organizations items 2a 8a if not applicable. Proposals must include a balanced project budget (item 19). Initial project startup costs are acceptable however; ongoing operational costs that pose potential multi-year expense implications will not be accepted.
- D. **Encourage other funding opportunities**, CBT is committed to ensuring that other funding opportunities are sought to support projects in the Basin. Accordingly, project proponents are encouraged to seek funding from other sources to assist with their projects and not to rely solely on CIP/AAP funding.
- E. Attachments: Maximum five (5) pages.
- F. City of Nelson has specific criteria regarding Nelson's Sustainability Goals and Community Priorities, contact Joanne Caldecott at <a href="mailto:jcaldecott@nelson.ca">jcaldecott@nelson.ca</a> or by phone 250-352-5511, Suite 101 310 Ward St., Nelson, BC V1L 5S4. Supporting documentation for City of Nelson consideration may exceed five (5) pages and needs to be submitted as a separate file. Note: project proposals must be submitted as noted in item 2.
- G. **Confirmation** will be provided by email for proposals received. Please ensure a contact email address is provided in *Section A item 8*.
- H. SUBMISSION DEADLINE MONDAY, FEBRUARY 29, 2016 16:30 PST
- I. <u>Final Reports</u>: Organizations that receive CIP/AAP Program funds <u>MUST</u> submit a final financial report for each project supported by CIP/AAP funds and <u>MUST</u> include copies of receipts/invoices that support project funding expenditures. Failure to satisfy reporting requirements for projects funded during the years 2010/11 to 2014/15 jeopardizes eligibility for 2016 CIP/AAP funding consideration. Projects that remain inprogress during the above noted periods are advised to obtain a supported *extension* or authorized change of scope to remain in good standing.
- J. **Community Involvement:** Public consultation meetings will be conducted throughout the RDCK electoral areas during April and proponents will be given the opportunity to make a proposal presentation for CIP/AAP area funding consideration. Meeting dates and times will be made available on the RDCK website and will be advertised in local newspapers throughout the RDCK electoral areas. *Proponents are expected to attend a public meeting for each electoral area funding is requested from. For more details on electoral area definitions and affected area boundaries, please refer to page 7.*
- K. Dispute Resolution: In the event an organization or individual wishes to lodge a complaint about the process used regarding the administration of the program or the public consultation meeting a written complaint containing the complainant's name, contact information, and a detailed description of the issue, must be submitted to the RDCK Board of Directors no later than five (5) working days after the public consultation meeting.
- L. **Proposal Approval:** The RDCK Board of Directors will make the final project funding decision at the board meeting to be held on May 21, 2016.
- M. **Project Period:** The 2016-2017 project funding period will be recognized as the day following the May 2016 RDCK Board meeting to June 30, 2017. Expenses pertaining to the project described in Schedule A must be incurred during this period. Expenses prior to the funding period will not be accepted to satisfy 2016-17 project expenditures. (Note, GST expenses are based on declared GST rebate values)
- N. Release of Funding: Funding payments will be dispersed during the month of June
