LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

There are two types of letters of recommendation. One is from a counselor, typically on the Secondary School Report. The other is a letter from a teacher who knows you well.

THE COUNSELOR LETTER

- 1. You must have TEACHER INPUT FORMS on file in your counselor's office. A sample is on page 33. These are to be filled out by teachers who know you well. However if a teacher is writing a letter for you then do not give them a TEACHER INPUT FORM. Your counselor will tell you how many input forms they require. Please read the instructions carefully. You fill out part 1 and parts 2 and 3 will be filled out by the teacher.
- 2. The Teacher Input form is not a letter of recommendation. It is not sent to any colleges. The form is kept in your file to help your counselor write your personalized letter.
- 3. As soon as you know you need a letter, give out the teacher Input forms to your teachers. Then, they will be in your file and available for your counselor.

THE TEACHER LETTER

- 1. Ask your teacher POLITELY if they would write a letter of recommendation for you. Teachers have different systems for how they write and send letters. Ask them how they prefer to do this for you.
- 2. You must allow the teacher adequate preparation time. You are probably not the only one requesting a letter. Be sure that you tell the teacher if there is a specific deadline.
- 3. Some schools provide a form for the teacher, some require a standard letter and still others have the option of submitting the letter/form electronically. Be sure to discuss these options with your teacher so that there is no confusion that will delay your letter.
- 4. If there is a form or you are asking for a hard copy of the letter to be sent, be sure to give the teacher an addressed and stamped envelope for each school or scholarship. If there is no form, be sure to mention that in a note clipped to the envelope.

Letters of recommendation can be a very time consuming and daunting task for your teachers and counselors. We spend a great deal of time writing very personalized letters because they are very important in the application process. Our letters are not just a list of your grades and activities. We want to do our very best to provide the school or scholarship with an impression of you that will make them think, "I want this kid at our school". That is why it is so important to follow the directions and instructions above.
