## **Number 2 in World Rankings**

It was twenty-one years since District 73 was formed. The difference between the District in 1976 when it there was only 23 clubs now had 102 clubs. After a period of great growth and achievement by the District from 1991/1992 to 1993/1994 there has been a slight drop off.

# Part Eight – Toastmasters ... for every Tom, Dick and Julie

For the second time in the District's history the previous years Lieutenant Governor Education and Training didn't become the new District Governor. Yvonne Cowling's new job as a Festival organiser made it impossible to be District Governor. So it was with much heartache she didn't stand for election, and Julie Cody became the District Governor.



Julie Cody was inspiration to all through her commitment, patience leadership. This inspiration could also have been the reason for the District achieving a record number of ATM awards registered in a year to that time. From 38 registered in the previous year, this increased to reach 98 ATM awards.

This was one of the main reasons for the District 73 climbing the World Rankings again, from 38 to 13.

The theme for Julie's year was "Co-operation makes it happen!" She chose this because she believed that there was a need to foster that spirit of teamwork, fun and friendship.

Of the five clubs formed in 1997/1998, all are still around today. These clubs are Ford Australia, Moonee Talks, Nine-90, Bendigo and Burwood Unity.

#### Statistics for 1997/98:

- 107 clubs (5 new),
- 209 CTM awards,
- 98 ATM awards.
- 702 new members.
- World Ranking 13.

"Mr Toastmaster" was the name on the caricature of Dick Briggs who became the District Governor for 1998/1999.



Dick increased the number of District Officers and Coordinators that the District had. These position included Assistant Bulletin Editor (filled by May Wilson), District Sergeant-At-Arms (Cataldo Mase), District Database Officer (Jill

Kinsman Lloyd) and District Webmaster (Norman Lingwood).

The introduction of the role of Webmaster was the Districts first major push into the new mode of communication and marketing in the internet. Clubs were encouraged to make a presence on the web with their own site. The District's website received praise from many Toastmasters from overseas.

The theme for Dick's year was "Education + Fun = Fulfilment. It's the Toastmasters way." This was designed to take us back to the grass roots of what Toastmasters is all about and to set goals for the upcoming year.

The District continued its climb back up the World Rankings that year, climbing three places to be ranked 10<sup>th</sup> and was **Select Distinguished**. All six Divisions were distinguished, with five of them being President's Distinguished. Fifty-nine of the District's clubs were distinguished, twenty-six of those were Select Distinguished. Nineteen of the twenty-six Areas were Distinguished, with seven being Select Distinguished and seven being President's Distinguished.



Of the eleven clubs formed in 1998/1999. those that have survived until today include Gateway, Valley Yarra Water, Margaret River, North Melbourne, Sullivan's Cove, Western Founders, City of Greater Geelong and Epping.

#### Statistics for 1998/99:

- 118 clubs (11 new),
- 220 CTM awards,
- 87 ATM awards,
- 14 DTM awards.
- 748 new members,
- World Ranking 10.

Tom Boon took the next step and became the District Governor for 1999/2000. That was Tom's theme for the year, "Take the next step." This was designed to focus on taking a step forward and to face whatever the future brings.

Tom had set a goal of becoming a Distinguished District. Through hard work this was achieved. This meant that the District had been distinguished for three years in a row.

At the International Convention Tom Boon had the honour of carrying the Australian flag in the flag parade of countries were Toastmasters are found.



After eight years former District Governor Charlie Holden gave up the reins of the Southern Cross. Charlie had turned it into an icon of the District. Norman Lingwood took up the reins.

Of the nine clubs formed in 1999/2000, those that have survived until today include Durack, Mandjar, Talking Blue, Terrace, Dandenong Rangers, Carrington

Central, Filoz and Launceston

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- If only the President or Vice President Education is in attendance at the council meeting, he or she may exercise the other's vote without a signed proxy from the absent Club officer.
- If either the President or Vice President Education is unable to attend the council meeting, he or she may assign his or her vote to a financial member of THAT club by satisfactorily completing the Proxy Form. The vote may NOT be proxied to a member of another club if the member is not financial in your club.
- No person may vote at the Council meeting unless he or she is the President or Vice President Education of a Club, a District Officer (a person having the word "Governor" in their title, the District Public Relations Officer, District Secretary and District Treasurer) or a person carrying a properly signed proxy of the President or Vice President Education of their Club.
  - Designated District Officers: All Governors, PRO, Treasurer, Secretary get a vote in their own right. This vote cannot be proxied and is additional to the Club votes that a member may otherwise lodge.
- The President and VPE of a Club may each assign their vote by, provided that such assignees are not already carrying the responsibility for voting, by reason of office or proxy, for a total of two votes for another Club.

In other words, a member of Toastmasters is only entitled to lodge a maximum of three votes through office and by proxy of the Clubs of which they are a member at an Annual, Semi-Annual or Extra-ordinary Meeting of the Council of District 73.

Note that if a Toastmaster belongs to three clubs and is President of two of these and VPE of the other, the Toastmaster is only allowed to register votes for two of these offices. The third must be lodged by a proxy holder, who is entitled to hold that proxy as above. If the President or Vice President Education has assigned their proxy and then attends the meeting, they will be entitled to vote in preference to the proxy holder.


