Each week, our students look forward to their classes with our wonderful specials teachers. Here are some updates about what they have been working on in Art, Music, P.E., and Library!

Music with Ms. Bamzai

Kindergarten and first grade students they have learned how to read 1/4 notes and will be learning how to read 1/8 notes. The students are doing a great job learning how to read music! Second graders have been learning about time signature. Third and fourth graders are busy preparing for their performances before spring break which will highlight many of the things they have learned in music. Fifth and sixth grade students have wrapped up their ukulele lessons and will be learning to compose four-chord songs. All of the grade levels will be participating in Ms. B's version of March Madness!

Art with Mrs. Martin-Bowman

The students are learning about the connections between literature and art across many of our grade levels! Kindergarten students read a book called *Cerca*, and drew their response to the story they heard. First and second grade students read a book called, *Hoy Volare* and are learning about art through multi-media to connect with their Celebrate Reading and Writing books. Third and fourth grade students are learning to draw anthropomorphic animals modeling off of a Dynamo artist. Fifth and sixth grade students are working to animate themselves in the style of famous cartoonists!

Ms. Lenski is working with all the grade levels on a fun volleyball unit! The kindergarten, first and second grade students are learning to set and bump using balloons. Soon they will be learning the positions on the court and will practice hitting beach balls over the net. The intermediate grade students have learned to bump, set, and serve. Soon they will be learning how to rotate through the positions on the court and play scrimmage games.

Library with Mrs. Podlin and Mrs. Murphy

All of the students have just completed their Comic Life projects, which focused on incorporating technology and folklore. In March, the students will be practicing their keyboarding skills!

SCHAUMBURG TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF PTAS 2016 ELEMENTARY SUMMER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

As part of its commitment to life-long learning, the Schaumburg Township Council of PTAs (STC) offers scholarships for summer programs/camps to District 54 students <u>currently in Kindergarten through 7th grade</u> who wish to broaden their education, talents and experiences.

Changes to the Application in 2016

- Current Kindergarteners are now eligible to apply.
- Proof of prepayment is no longer required.

A full and complete application **must** include *all* the following:

- ✓ Completed Identification & Verification Form
- ✓ Student Statement (consisting of one (1), two-part question with a <u>maximum of 300</u> words) on the STC application form provided. Statement must fit on the front <u>only</u> of the page either typewritten, computer generated or neatly handwritten <u>with text able to be clearly copied</u>.
- ✓ A copy of the summer camp/program brochure with description (including cost information). Do not send entire catalog/website information.
- ✓ A copy of the <u>completed</u> application/registration form (no exceptions)
- ✓ A copy (not the original) of the parent/guardian PTA/PTSA membership card for the 2015-16 academic year, or written verification of PTA/PTSA membership from local unit membership chair or local unit president. (Parent/Guardian must be a PTA member at the school attended by the child applying for the scholarship. Must be a PTA member by March 1, 2016).

Please note that any application not meeting *all* the criteria will be disqualified. No materials will be returned. <u>Please do not staple/tape/paperclip anything together.</u>

Scholarships will be awarded for the full cost of the summer program/camp up to \$125.

All scholarship checks will be forwarded directly to the summer program/camp.

*One application per student

*No household will be awarded more than one (1) scholarship each year

*No student will be awarded a scholarship for more than two (2) consecutive years.

The summer program or camp must start on or after June 1, 2016 and be completed by September 1, 2016. To comply with the Bylaws of PTA, to be "noncommercial, nonsectarian, and nonpartisan," a camp with the purpose of religious instruction will be ineligible for a scholarship.

Submit your application to your school on the date as designated by your PTA/PTSA Elementary Scholarship Coordinator. Place in a sealed envelope, labeled STC Elementary Scholarship Application. All candidates will be notified of committee decisions after May 1, 2016.

Scholarship recipients are encouraged to notify STC describing the benefits of having attended the camp/program for which the scholarship is received.

Please note that this program is not the same, nor is it affiliated with the Schaumburg Township Elementary School Foundation Memorial Scholarship Grant program.
