## 1. Objective

The objective of these Regulations is to prescribe certain forms for the purposes of the Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968.

### 2. Authorising provision

These Regulations are made under section 31 of the Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968.

### 3. Commencement

These Regulations come into operation on 1 February 2002.

### 4. Revocation

The Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Regulations  $1992^1$  are **revoked**.

## 5. Certificate under section 11(1)

For the purposes of section 11(1) of the **Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968**, the prescribed form of the certificate is set out in Schedule 1.

### 6. Certificate under section 12(1)

For the purposes of section 12(1) of the **Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968**, the prescribed form of the certificate is set out in Schedule 2.

# 7. Certificate under section 15(2)

For the purpose of section 15(2) of the Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968, the prescribed form of the certificate is set out in Schedule 3.

- 1. The certificate must-
  - (a) specify the facts upon which the registered medical practitioner has formed his or her opinion that the person to whom the certificate relates is an alcoholic or drug-dependent person (as the case requires); and
  - (b) distinguish facts the registered medical practitioner has personally observed from facts communicated to him or her by others.
- 2. The registered medical practitioner must not be-
  - (a) a relative or guardian of the person examined; or
  - (b) the person by whom complaint is made under the Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968; or
  - (c) in the case of admission to a private treatment centre, the licensee of, the resident registered medical practitioner of, or a registered medical practitioner regularly visiting, the centre; or
  - (d) a partner, principal, assistant, or relative, of the licensee of a private treatment centre; or
  - (e) a partner, principal, assistant, or relative, of any other registered medical practitioner signing the certificate or other authority or request to admit the person examined.

It is an offence under the Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968 to sign the certificate if you are in one of these categories.

3. A registered medical practitioner and any other person who falsely states or certifies anything in a certificate is guilty of an indictable offence.

The Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Regulations 2002, S.R. No. 7/2002 were made on 30 January 2002 by the Governor in Council under section 31 of the **Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Act 1968**, No. 7772/1968 and came into operation on 1 February 2002: regulation 3.

The Alcoholics and Drug-dependent Persons Regulations 2002 will sunset 10 years after the day of making on 30 January 2012 (see section 5 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**).
