The Rotary Club of Austin is pleased to offer a scholarship opportunity for graduate students pursuing an advanced degree in a discipline that aligns with one or more of Rotary's six Areas of Focus:

- Peace and Conflict Prevention/ Resolution
- Maternal and Child Health
- Disease Prevention and Treatment
- Basic Education and Literacy
- Water and Sanitation
- Economic and Community Development

Preferred academic programs include those that

- (1) Focus on grass-roots economic development strategies
- (2) Focus on addressing economic issues of poor and underserved communities;
- (3) Support social business development, such as a tailored track within a Masters of Business Administration program

Programs that will not be favorable considered include those that

- (1) Focus on purely theoretical or macro-level economics
- (2) Support general private business development, such as a masters of business administration

The scholarship amount available for 2016-2017 is **\$2,500**. Applicants must submit this application along with the designated essays, school transcript, and 2 letters of recommendation by **January 23, 2016**. Two applicants will be selected for interviews, to be held in March 2016. The recipient will be announced in April 2016.

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to prevent and mediate conflict, and to support peace-building in communities and regions affected by conflict.

Preferred academic programs include conflict prevention/resolution peace and justice studies and international relations or law with a specialization in peace and conflict;

- a. Programs that will be considered favorably include those that focus directly on peace and conflict issues;
- b. Programs that will <u>not</u> be considered favorably include those that relate to general international relations or law.

Maternal and child health

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to improve the health of mothers and their children by:

- a. Reducing the mortality and morbidity rate for children under the age of five;
- b. Reducing the maternal mortality and morbidity rate;
- c. Improving access to essential medical services, trained community health leaders and health care providers for mothers and their children.

Preferred academic programs include epidemiology, nutrition, global health, public health, and health promotion and degrees in nursing and medicine.

☐ Disease prevention and treatment

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to prevent disease and promote health by:

- a. Improving the capacity of local health care professional;
- b. Promoting disease prevention programs, with the goal of limiting the spread of communicable diseases and reducing the incidences of and complications from non-communicable diseases:
- c. Enhancing the health infrastructure of local communities;
- d. Educating and mobilizing communities to help prevent the spread of major diseases;
- e. Preventing physical disability resulting from disease or injury.

Preferred academic programs include public health, advanced degrees in nursing and medicine.

☐ Basic education and literacy

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to ensure that all people have sustainable access to basic education and literacy by:

- a. Involving the community to support programs that strengthens the capacity of communities to provide basic education and literacy to all;
- b. Increasing adult literacy in communities;
- c. Working to reduce gender disparity in education.

Preferred academic programs include education, literacy, curriculum development, special education, and school administration.

■ Water and sanitation

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to ensure that people have sustainable access to water and sanitation by:

- a. Providing equitable community access to safe water, improved sanitation and hygiene;
- b. Strengthening the ability of communities to develop, fund and maintain sustainable water and sanitation and sanitation systems;
- c. Supporting programs that enhance communities' awareness of the benefits of safe water, sanitation and hygiene.

Preferred academic programs include water science/engineering, water management, environmental science, epidemiology, and parasitology.

☐ Economic and community development

Scholars in this area are expected to study ways to invest in people by creating sustainable, measurable and long term economic improvements in their communities and livelihoods by:

- Building the capacity of entrepreneurs, community leaders, local organizations, and community networks to support economic development in impoverished communities;
- b. Developing opportunities for productive work;
- c. Reducing poverty in underserved communities.

e. Essays

- Describe your educational and professional goals, including your career plans, and how your chosen program of study will help to advance these goals.
