
#### **Overview of Community Health Needs Survey**

- Questionnaire
  - 33 total questions: 12 multiple choice, 5 fill-in-the-blank, 5 Likert scale, 5 yes/no, 6 open-ended
  - Survey assessed self-reported health status, access to medical services, knowledge of public health and demographic information
- Survey and Questionnaire Distribution
  - Survey was conducted from December 3, 2013 to January 10, 2014
  - Surveys were distributed via convenience and snowball sampling methods
  - 458 total questionnaires were completed: 72 paper copies were received and 391 were completed online






# How would you rate the overall health of our community? (Q3)






#### How would you rate your personal health? (Q6)



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
# How many days during the past 30 days was your physical health not good? (Q7)






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# How many days during the past 30 days was your physical health not good?




# How many days during the past 30 days was your mental health not good? (Q8)








# How many days during the past 30 days was your mental health not good?


# Where do you go most often to receive medical care? (Q9)








#### Do you have at least one person you think of as your healthcare provider? (Q10)






#### Was there a time in the past 12 months when you could not see a doctor due to cost? (Q15)




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# In the past 12 months, have you used an emergency room? (Q11)




# If yes, how many times did you go to the emergency room? (Q11, continued)






# In the past 12 months, have you used an emergency room?




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# In the past 12 months did you visit a dentist or dental clinic for dental care? (Q12)




# If yes, how many times did you go to the dentist? (Q12, continued)






# Which town or city do you mostly go to for your non-emergency healthcare? (Q13)






# Which town or city do you mostly go to for your emergency healthcare? (Q14)






# How long has it been since your last routine check-up? (Q16)






# How long has it been since your last routine checkup?




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# How difficult is it to obtain medical information? (Q18)






# What is your primary source for medical information? (Q17)

Types of medical services would like to see that do not currently exist (Q21)

- Specialists 19.5%
  - Neurologist, Orthopedic Surgeon, Dermatologist, Cardiologist
- Urgent Care 15.9%
  - Open extended hours and weekends, preferably 24/7
- Public health nurse or Walk-in clinic 11.8%
  - Low costs, sliding fee scale
- Mental health services 11.2%
- More family medicine doctors, general practitioners, pediatricians – 9.4%
  - Primarily ones that accept Medicaid and Medicare



# Types of medical services would like to see that do not currently exist (Q21, continued)


- Better quality doctors and services provided 8%
- Oncologists and local cancer treatment centers 6.5%
  - Availability of local radiation and chemotherapy services
  - Local doctors who can care for cancer patients without requiring extended travel to larger cities
- More OB/GYN care, prenatal care, family planning services – 3.8%

Especially female doctors and high risk pregnancy specialists

 Home health services, hospice and at home care for seniors and disabled persons – 3.2%

- 6.5% of respondents mentioned at least 33% of the definition in their response, when using the definition provided by <u>whatispublichhealth.org</u>
  - Public Health is the science of protecting and improving the health of communities through education, promotion of healthy lifestyles, and research for disease and injury prevention.
- 17% of respondents mentioned at least 20% of what public health professionals do in their response (www.whatispublichealth.org)
- 49% of respondents mentioned healthcare that was funded by the government, free, universal, etc.




# In your own words, what do you believe 'public health' means? (Q23, continued)


- "A public health nurse that will only see patients certain times a week and are only in the office part time."

### Are you aware of where you can obtain restaurant inspection scores? (Q25)



### Additional comments or concerns (Q33)

- "There needs to be more doctors that see patients after 5pm and have walk-ins."
- "..it would be nice if health care (appointments) were available when needed and we did not have to wait weeks for an appointment or go to the ER where the cost is astronomical."
- "Just wish more doctors would come and then stay here."
- "Our hospital has a horrible reputation, some of it is probably undeserved but most people I know are scared to trust them with anything critical."
- "Healthcare in Elko County is not a priority for our elected officials. Out County Commissioners and City Council people are more concerned about sage grouse, guns and public lands than they are about the health of the people living here..."



### Additional comments or concerns (Q33)

- "More information on where to report a problem with a restaurant would be nice. A dog park would be wonderful."
- I worry that there are a lot of individuals who are unable to access affordable healthcare. Therefore, the spread of various illnesses are passed onto the public.
- "Right now, I don't feel as if I have a doctor, much less one that is familiar with me and my medical history."
- "Great Basin college has wonderful medical programs, but they could be increased."
- "West Wendover is a part of Elko County and provides a large amount of tax revenue. We should be treated like those in Elko, NOT discriminated against!"
- "If I had the ability to, I would move out of Elko."
- "Please help with the hospital here."
