Update from 8/2/15 voters meeting:

Leadership presented a deficit budget to the congregation on Sunday, 8/2/15. The deficit of \$80,000 (which does not include our current debt) was based on an enrollment of 48 full time equivalent students (each pre-school student counts as $\frac{1}{2}$ a student). This number is based off the current enrolment situation shown below. Ninety one votes were turned in, 54 votes were in favor and 37 were against hence passing the budget.

Direction of hiring of a part time (non-called) principal was also discussed at the meeting. We have hired Linda King as our new part time principal. Please welcome her as she is scheduled to start on August 10, 2015.

Most recently Linda has been Principal of the Immanuel Lutheran School in Hillside (K-8); Curriculum Coordinator and Gifted teacher in Naperville District 203, and Assistant Principal, Computer Coordinator and Fifth Grade Teacher at St Paul's Lutheran School in Aurora. She earned her Colloquy Degree of Ministry from Concordia University, River Forest. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree in education with concentration in Mathematics from Northern Illinois University.

St. Luke's in Montgomery to host MISSION U MU-201 in Conjunction with the 81st Annual Convention of the Lutheran Laymen's League of Northern Illinois

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you."

John 20:21

It is clear that God has chosen each of us to be His ambassador. He is sending each of us to carry His message of hope and salvation into a world urgently in need of good news and into a culture that is, at best, indifferent to the Gospel. One of four American teens and young adults claim no religious connection whatsoever. How will they hear the message of salvation through Jesus Christ if no one reaches them?

Have you ever wanted to be a witness for Christ, but weren't sure how to go about it, or lacked the confidence to do so? Lutheran Hour Ministries has created the MISSION U courses to encourage and equip each of us in our role as God's chosen ambassador to those around us.

MISSION U is a personal witness training program. Through onsite seminars at local churches, it is designed to give each of us the tools and training to confidently embark on our mission of reaching people with the real news of Jesus Christ. By participating in MISSION U courses individuals and their churches will gain tools that sharpen witnessing efforts to reach people of all ages and backgrounds. Become equipped through MISSION U to help you fulfill your mission with boldness to the diverse mission field around you. You and your church can gain a scripture-based understanding of how outreach works in a culture that doesn't care about God.

MISSION U Course MU-201, Dealing with Tough Questions, addresses prevalent questions concerning Christianity in society today. In this course you will learn to discover the root issues behind a question and how to respond appropriately. Answers will be provided and reviewed in class. Most importantly, you will learn how to bridge back into sharing the Gospel.
