Directions for Summer Reading Log

1. **Read your book**, either by yourself or with another person. If possible, reread parts that you especially like or that seem most important.
2. **Think about your book. If possible, talk to another person about some or all of these questions:**
 - What scene in the book stands out in your memory?
 - What was the main character like?
 - Did the main character change during the book?
 - Was there a problem and how was it solved?
 - What would you have done if you had been in the story?
 - What new thing did you learn in this book?
 - Does the story remind you of something that happened to you? If so, how is your experience like the book?
3. **Complete a Log Entry.**
 - A. Write the title and author of your book.
 - B. In the box, use the ideas you thought about and talked about:
 - a. Write a summary of the book that includes the beginning, middle, and end.OR
 - b. Write your reflections on one or more of the questions listed in step 2.
