Dear Pastors, Administrators, Finance & Operations Managers, and Business Managers:

The Archdiocese of Boston is moving forward with an initiative that soon will become standard practice for offertory collections. Advocated by Cardinal Seán O'Malley, the "Offertory Collection Controls Initiative" has been piloted at approximately 50 parishes to date with a planned rollout over the course of FY16. The goal is simple—to create alignment across parishes so that all employ the same checks and balances in securing offertory.

In an effort to promote this new system of financial controls, the Finance Department partnered with Boston Catholic Development Services and the Parish team at the Catholic Tri-Parishes of Brockton to create a video (http://www.bostoncatholic.org/OffertoryCollectionsInitiative/) that highlights these best practices in responsible stewardship. This video presentation clearly outlines the benefits of the Secure Bag System, both for training purposes and for the Catholic faithful who entrust their gifts to the Church.

RE: IOI Upload

After reviewing the bank reconciliations that have been submitted and receiving a number of emails and calls, we have observed that entities having a 7/3/15 or earlier July Payroll may have June 30, 2015 bank reconciliation issues. In most cases, the **withholding** was pulled from the bank on 6/30/15 and the upload is dated early July. **If you are paying in arrears,** you can edit the date of the early July IOI upload to 6/30/15. This will accomplish two important things:

- 1) This will allow you to properly use the withholding entries when doing your June bank reconciliations and allow the bank reconciliation to correctly match the QuickBooks balance.
- 2) You will not have to book an accrual for **this** early July payroll, since in most cases this early July payroll upload applies 100% to June payroll.

If you are not paying in arrears, you will need to book the June, 30th entry against cash and prepaid for the withholding amounts and reverse that entry in July.

Please note that due to the different payroll cycles, you should thoroughly review your particular situation after first checking to see if IOI pulled the withheld amounts from your bank in late June.

August 9 - Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Elijah threw in the towel, "This is enough O Lord. Take my life...", but God would hear none of it: "Get up and eat..." In the beautiful Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel today, Jesus tells us that He is the Bread of Life "...whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."
