Maryland vs. Wake Forest

FIRST-AND-10 ...

• Maryland looks for its fourth straight home win Saturday when Wake Forest visits College Park for the Terps' annual Homecoming game. The Terps, who are tied for second in the Atlantic Division, are coming off an emotional 24-21 win over Boston College, one which snapped a road skid. After playing their last two games on the road, the Terps will play at home in three of their final five contests. The Terps have been a gritty bunch this year, winning by making big plays, holding onto the football and coming up with a key stop with the game on the line. The Maryland-Wake Forest game, will be telecast nationally on ESPNU and broadcast on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network.

• The Maryland offense, under third-year coordinator and assistant head coach **James Franklin**, has been efficient and a mostly mistake-free unit this season. The Terps have turned the ball over a league-low seven times and rank fifth in the ACC in passing efficiency. RBs **Da'Rel Scott** and **Davin Meggett**, and WR **Torrey Smith** have all produced for an offense which has scored six times this season on plays of 50 yards or more. Smith, one of the most dynamic players in the nation, has six TD receptions (tied for second in the ACC) and is averaging 70.6 receiving yards per game (fourth in the ACC). The Biletnikoff Award candidate is also fifth in the ACC in all-purpose yards (117.2 ypg) despite battling an ankle injury. **Danny O'Brien** has emerged as the starting quarterback since subbing for an injured **Jamarr Robinson** (shoulder) against FIU (9/25). O'Brien has started the last four games, completing 26 of 39 passes for 179 yards and three touchdowns vs. BC (10/23) to earn ACC Rookie of the Week honors. O'Brien ranks fifth in the ACC in passing efficiency (127.9) and fifth among freshmen in the FBS. The o-line, which has allowed two or fewer sacks in five games, has been reshuffled following season-ending injuries to LT **Justin Gilbert** (knee) and RT **Pete DeSouza** (fractured legs), who was inserted into the starting lineup to replace Gilbert. RT **Paul Pinegar** (moved from center), LG **Andrew Gonnella** and LT **R.J. Dill** (moved from RT) have the most experience along the line. **Justin Lewis** mans the right guard position, with **Bennett Fulper** having taking over as the starting center last week.

• The linebacker corps, including two-time All-ACC performer **Alex Wujciak**, anchors the defense under second-year coordinator **Don Brown**. The Terps rank fifth in the ACC and 36th nationally in scoring defense (20.6 ppg). They also have the best red-zone defense in the ACC (tied for fourth nationally). Maryland is allowing opponents to gain just 4.5 yards per play, which ranks tied for third in the ACC. The Terps possess three of the top nine tacklers in the ACC. Wujciak, who was listed among the preseason candidates for five national awards (see list on pg. 6), ranks second in the league and 14th nationally in tackles (10.6 pg). LB **Adrian Moten**, a playmaker throughout his career (team-best 9.0 TFLs and 6.0 sacks last year), ranks tied for seventh in the ACC in stops (7.4 pg). First-year starter **Joe Vellano** is among the more productive linemen in the ACC. He ranks tied for fifth in sacks (0.71 pg) and fourth in tackles among lineman (5.4 pg). Junior CB **Cameron Chism**, one of five returning defensive starters, posted a team-best four interceptions in 2009 and leads the team with seven pass breakups. The safety combo of senior **Antwine Perez** and junior **Kenny Tate** had been a productive duo. Perez is tied for second in the ACC in passes defended (1.29 pg) and Tate fifth in the ACC in tackles (8.0 pg) and first in forced fumbles (0.57 pg). Perez won ACC Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble against BC (10/23).

• Special teams was expected to be a strength this season with all the top performers back and the Terps have been solid overall through seven games. **Travis Baltz**, a 2008 first team All-ACC punter, has handled both kicking chores this season. Baltz has connected on five of his seven FG attempts and is averaging 41.9 yards per punt, which is seventh in the league. Junior **Tony Logan** has been one of the top punt returners in the nation. He has returned two punts for scores, becoming one of just two players in ACC history to post consecutive games with a return for a score. Logan is also averaging 23.2 ypr which is second in the FBS. Smith was one of the top kick returners in the country last season, posting an ACC single-season record 1,309 yards.

QUICK HITTERS...

- Maryland has won five of their first seven games for the sixth time under **Ralph Friedgen**.
- A win Saturday would make the Terps bowl eligible for the seventh time in Friedgen's 10 seasons.
- Saturday's win over Boston College snapped a 10-game road losing streak, including a seven-contest string in the ACC. The Terps' last road win came at Clemson on 9/27/08.
- RT **Pete DeSouza** was lost for the season after being injured in a traffic accident on Oct. 21 so the Terps had to adjust vs. BC (10/23). **Paul Pinegar** moved from center to right tackle with **Bennett Fulper** starting at center.
- **Torrey Smith** snagged his team-high sixth TD reception against BC (10/23), the most in one season by a Terp since Vernon Davis's six in 2005. Smith's 13 career TD receptions ties him for third in school history with Darrius Heyward-Bey (2006-08) and Guilian Gary (1998-2001). Smith's 17.0 yards-per-catch average is second in the ACC among players with more than 15 catches.
- A disruptive force who is having an all-conference season, junior safety **Kenny Tate** is the leading tackler in the ACC among defensive backs (8.0 per game). He is also atop the league chart with four forced fumbles, the most by an FBS defensive back this season and the highest total by any Terp since Milton Harris also had four in 2005.
- Tate's counterpart **Antwine Perez** had a monster game against BC (10/23), posting career-best two interceptions and recovering a fumble. Perez is second on the team in pass breakups (six) and tied for third in the league in interceptions (0.43 pg).
- **Adrian Moten** has a career-best three interceptions and is tied for the FBS lead in picks among linebackers (0.43 pg). Moten's three interceptions are the most in one season by a Maryland LB in 23 years (school-record five by Karl Edwards in 1987).
- Honors candidate **Alex Wujciak** has averaged 10.6 tackles per game in his career which is third in the nation among active players (see chart on pg. 4).
- Smith has a school-record three career kickoff returns for touchdowns and is one of only two active players in the ACC with more than one (2 by T.J. Graham, N.C. State). Tyron Carrier of Houston (5) is the only player in the nation with more kickoff returns for touchdowns than Smith (see list on pg. 4).
- Friedgen just became the 13th head coach in ACC history to amass 70 career wins with the victory over Duke (10/2).
- The Terrapins have over 70 percent of the offensive and defensive two-deep back from the end of 2009. There are 17 of 22 offensive players back and 14 of 22 defenders. In addition, all six special teams starters (KR, PR, PK, P, LS, H) are back in uniform.
- The Terps have just eight seniors (**Adrian Cannon, Paul Pinegar, Da'Rel Scott, LaQuan Williams,**

Drew Gloster, Adrian Moten, Alex Wujciak, and Antwine Perez listed among the 44 players on the current offensive and defensive two-deep. In addition, senior **Travis Baltz** is the first-team punter and place-kicker.

• There are six 2009 bowl teams which appear on the Terps' 2010 schedule: Navy (Texas Bowl), West Virginia (Konica Minolta Gator Bowl), Clemson (Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl), Boston College (Emerald Bowl), Miami (Champs Sports Bowl), and Florida State (Konica Minolta Gator Bowl).

STOPPING THE RUN...

Maryland ranks fourth in the ACC rushing defense (143.6 ypg), including first in league-only games (79.3 ypg). The Terps have held each of their last three opponents (Duke, Clemson, BC) under 100 yards on the ground. It marks the first time since 2004 the Terps held three foes (NC State, Clemson, FSU) in a row under 100 rushing yards. The Terps have surrendered 98.8 yards per game on the ground since the season opener vs. Navy (9/6). Only 12 teams in the FBS give up less than 100 rushing yards per contest.

FOURTH-DOWN STOPS...

Maryland stopped Boston College (10/23) on fourth down on the final two drives to preserve the win. BC finished the game 2 of 4 on fourth downs. Maryland entered the game third in the ACC by holding opponents to a 45.5 percent conversion rate on fourth down. The Terps also had key fourth-down stops at the end of the Navy (9/6), FIU (9/25) and Duke (10/2) games to hold on for wins. The opposing offense is just 3-for-10 (30 percent) converting fourth downs in the fourth quarter.

CONVERSION TIME...

The Terps entered the BC contest (10/23) last in the ACC in third-down conversions (18 of 71/25.4 percent). Their best mark so far this season was 5 of 13 (38.5 percent) against Morgan State (9/11). Maryland converted on 10 of 19 chances (52.6 percent) against BC. The Terps had started the game just 1 of 5, but converted nine of their final 14 attempts. Seven of Maryland's conversions came via the pass, while three came by run. **Danny O'Brien** went 9 of 13 for 80 yards with two TDs on third down. He also completed both fourth-down pass attempts for 20 yards.

CLOSE CALLS...

Despite the 2-10 finish last year, Maryland was in nearly every game to the last possession. In seven of the losses, the Terps were within a touchdown in the fourth quarter. They lost four games by four points or less and the last two by a combined five points. In the loss to Florida State (11/21/09), Maryland took the lead twice in the final quarter vs. the Seminoles, only to lose on a touchdown with 32 seconds left. So far the Terps, hoping to regain their 2008 form, are 3-0 in games decided by seven points or less. Two seasons ago, the Terps were 6-1 in games decided by a touchdown or less.

STREAKS AND TRENDS...

- Maryland is 4-1 when being outgained by the opponent and when winning the turnover battle.
- Despite a season-high three turnovers vs. Clemson (10/16), the Terps have turned the ball over just seven times this year (five interceptions/two fumbles). Maryland leads the ACC and ranks tied for seventh in the FBS in fewest turnovers. After seven games last season, the Terps had 20 turnovers (eight picks/12 fumbles).
- Maryland had a couple streaks snapped against Clemson (10/16). The running backs had carried the ball 133 times without a fumble until the fourth quarter of the Clemson game when **Da'Rel Scott** fumbled (and then recovered the ball). **Danny O'Brien** did not throw a pick in his first 96 career passes until his first of three fourth-quarter interceptions vs. Clemson. As a team, Maryland had gone its last 125 pass attempts without an INT. O'Brien's interception that was returned for a TD marked the first points an opponent scored off a Maryland turnover all season. The Terps did score twice off turnovers vs. BC (10/23) and have outscored the opposition 52-7 following TOs.
- **Alex Wujciak** has started a team-best 32 straight games, all at Mike LB. **Torrey Smith's** 13 straight starts leads the offense.
- Wujciak has reached double-digit tackles in 20 of his last 28 games.
- The Terps have recorded 16 interceptions over the last 12 games.

SPECIAL TEAMS STANDOUT...

A reserve wideout who has solidified his role as a punt returner, **Tony Logan** has been a game-changer for Maryland this season. The junior is averaging an astounding 23.2 yards per return (second in the FBS) on 21 chances this season. Logan is also one of just four players in the FBS who has at least two punt returns for touchdowns - an 85-yarder against FIU (9/25) and an 84-yarder vs. Duke (10/2). The TD returns came at crucial times for the Terps - his TD against FIU (first punt return for a score since Steve Suter in the 2004 Gator Bowl) broke a 7-7 tie and

the one against Duke gave Maryland a 14-9 lead. Logan has four returns over 50 yards and his 488 punt return yards are already the second most in a season in Maryland history and more than 117 of the 120 FBS schools tallied all of 2009. Utah (592) is the only school which has more yards than Logan this season. Logan has two of the top three punt returns in school history, trailing only a 90-yard TD by Dick Nolan in 1953. Logan had a career-high 135 punt return yards vs. FIU, his second 100-yard game of the season (also 128 yards vs. Morgan State, 9/11). Logan's 15.2 yard-per-return career average ranks second in the FBS among active players.

BREAKING UP IS EASY TO DO...

The Terps, who rank second in the ACC in passing efficiency defense, have been an aggressive bunch defending the throwing game this season. The defense has already posted 33 pass breakups on the season after tallying 29 all of 2009. **Antwine Perez** ranks tied for second in the ACC in passes defended (1.20 pg) and **Adrian Moten** is tied for seventh (1.0 pg). Perez and Moten are also tied for third in the ACC in interceptions (0.43 per game). **Cameron Chism** leads the team with seven pass breakups. Chism and Perez had two of the best games in the country this season knocking down passes. Chism had four PBUs vs. FIU (9/25) and Perez matched that total vs. Duke (10/2), tallies that are tied for the most in one FBS game this season.

DEFENSE TIGHTENS IN RED ZONE...

The Maryland defense has been at its best when the opposing team reaches the red zone. The Terps lead the ACC and are seventh nationally by allowing opponents to score on just 65.5 percent of their trips inside the 20-yard line. Out of 29 trips to the red zone, Maryland has stopped the opponent 10 times, including three fumble recoveries, two interceptions and two on downs. Maryland did its best work against Navy (9/6), stopping the Midshipmen on five of its seven trips to the red zone. The Terps' 10 stops inside the 20-yard line are tied for first nationally.

HOLDING ONTO THE BALL...

The Terps have continued where they left off last season in the turnover department. Maryland ranked 97th in the FBS (-0.50 pg) in turnover margin in 2009, but improved during the latter half of the year, going +7.0 over the last five games. The defense forced 10

turnovers in the last five games of 2009 after inducing seven in the first seven contests. This season, Maryland is first in the ACC and tied for seventh nationally in turnover margin (+1.14 pg). The Terps, plus-8 on the season, have won the turnover battle in five of seven games. Until **Danny O'Brien** threw the first of three interceptions in the fourth quarter against Clemson (10/16), the Terps had not turned the ball over in their last 203:32 of game action, while gaining six from the opposition in that time span.

DID YOU KNOW? ...

In ACC history there have been only two occurrences of back-to-back games with 80-plus yard punt returns for touchdowns. **Tony Logan** did it this season (85 yards vs. FIU, 9/25; 84 yards vs. Duke, 10/2) and Willie Reid of Florida State was the first league player to perform the feat (83 vs. Virginia Tech in the ACC championship game on 12/3/05; 87 vs. Penn State in the Orange Bowl on 1/3/06).

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS...

The Terps have been much more effective in making explosive plays to score points this year than they were last season.

- Maryland already has 41 explosive plays (defined as 20 yards or longer) this year, and the Terps have scored 12 touchdowns on those plays. In 2009, Maryland had just 13 TDs off explosive plays the entire season.

- The Terps had four scoring plays over 50 yards against FIU (9/25). **Tony Logan** had an 85-yard punt return, **Davin Meggett** had a 76-yard run, **Torrey Smith** had a 68-yard reception and **Da'Rel Scott** had a 56-yard run. It marked the first time since 9/13/03 (vs. The Citadel) that Maryland had 50-plus yard TDs on a punt return, rush and pass.

- The Terps have 13 plays of 50 yards or longer this year - five on passes, four on punt returns, three on rushes and one on an interception return. In 2009, Maryland had eight plays of 50 yards or longer.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR VS. WAKE FOREST AND BEYOND...

- A win over Wake Forest would make the Terps bowl eligible for the fourth time in the last five years and seventh time in **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure. A victory would also assure the Terps of remaining in second place in the Atlantic Division. NC State (2-1) and FSU (4-0) play Thursday.

- The Terps are seeking a 3-1 start in ACC play for the third time (2006, 2008) in the last five seasons.

- The Demon Deacons have one of the better rushing attacks in the nation. They rank 23rd in the FBS (206.6 ypg), while the Terps are 51st nationally in rushing defense (143.6 ypg).

- Senior RB **Da'Rel Scott** needs 11 rushing yards to become the 10th back in school history to reach 2,000 in his career. Scott ranks 10th on the Maryland career rushing list (1,989). Next on the list is Willie Joyner, who had 2,140 yards in his career (1980-83).

- Senior LB **Alex Wujciak** is 14th on the Terps' career tackles list (338). He needs six more to reach Ted Klaube (1975-77) for 13th place (see pg. 21).

- Senior LB **Adrian Moten**, who has 14.5 career sacks, needs 1.5 more to reach the top 15 on the Maryland all-time list (see pg. 21).

- **Torrey Smith** ranks second in school history in career all-purpose yardage (4,394). He needs to average 113.2 yards a game the rest of the season to pass Lamont Jordan (1997-00) who has a school-record 4,960 all-purpose yards (see pg. 19).

- Smith, who holds the Maryland career kickoff return yards mark (2,640), needs 11 yards to set the ACC mark. Smith is currently second (see pg. 7) while Brandon Tate of North Carolina (2,688/2005-08) holds the record.

- Smith has 114 career catches which is sixth in school history. Russ Weaver is fifth with 120 catches (see pg. 19). He also has 1,654 receiving yards, ranking eighth on the Maryland career list (see pg. 20). Smith needs 67 yards to reach Barry Johnson (1,721/1987-90) and Greg Hill (1,721/1982-84) who are tied for sixth.

- **Tony Logan** (592) needs 19 punt return yards to move from fourth to third on the Maryland career chart. Larry Marshall (656/1969-71) is currently third (see pg. 20).

DID YOU KNOW? ...

Tony Logan is one of only five FBS players in the last eight years to return two punts of at least 80 yards for touchdowns in the same season. He is joined on the list by Quinton Jones of Boise State (2005), DeSean Jackson of Cal (2006), Javier Arenas of Alabama (2008) and LaVon Brazill of Ohio (2009).

FORCING THE ISSUE...

Maryland's defense has been a more aggressive unit through seven games this season than at the same point last year. So far the Terps have forced nine fumbles, recovering six of those. They have also picked off nine passes. After seven games a year ago, the first under coordinator **Don Brown**, the Terrapins forced three fumbles (four recovered) and picked off three passes.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES...

• Maryland's defensive effort against Clemson (10/16) ranks 13th among the top performances in Friedgen's 10 seasons (see list on pg. 5). The Tigers gained 213 yards on 65 plays. It marked the third time in the last nine seasons, Clemson was held under 225 total yards by the Terps.

• Tight ends **Matt Furstenburg** and **Will Yeatman** were key contributors in the Clemson game (10/16). The duo combined for eight catches and also saw time on special teams. Furstenburg set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (98). Yeatman, in his first year with the team after playing lacrosse the previous two, made his first receptions as a Terp, matching his career high in receptions (3) and setting one in receiving yards (41). The eight combined receptions in the game were the most by Terrapin tight ends since 11/10/07, when Jason Goode and Joey Haynos combined for eight catches against Boston College.

• **Avery Graham** leads the squad with 10 special teams tackles. He has five on kickoff returns and five on punt returns. **Austin Walker** is second with seven special teams stops. **Matt Robinson**, **Trenton Hughes**, **Darin Drakeford** and **LaQuan Williams** are tied for third with six apiece.

• **Desmond Kearse** started as a third safety against FIU (9/25), becoming the first Terp true freshman defensive player to start since Jeremy Navarre (vs. Boston College, 11/19/05). Kearse is also the first true freshman DB to start since Domonique Foxworth (vs. NC State, 11/17/01).

• **Torrey Smith** had season highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (159), including a 68-yard touchdown, in the win over FIU (9/25). That followed a 149 receiving-yard performance vs. WVU (9/18). The junior had consecutive 100-yard receiving games for the first time in his career and the 308 receiving yards over those two contests were the most by a Terp over a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28). With Smith's 193 all-purpose yards (also 34 kickoff return yards) against FIU, he became just the second player in school history to accumulate more than 4,000 all-purpose yards in his career, joining LaMont Jordan (4,960).

• Maryland played 24 freshmen (10 true/14 redshirts) last season, which was the most during **Ralph Friedgen's** first nine seasons. The Terps played 20 freshmen in both the 2001 and 2004 seasons. Last year's freshmen are now sophomores, but the Terps are still relatively young, though more experienced. Of the 111 players on the roster, 65 are freshmen or sophomores, but just 16 are seniors. Maryland also had a relatively low senior class (14) last season.

SUDDEN CHANGE..

After going 41 games without scoring via a fumble or interception (Erin Henderson in 2006 vs. Virginia), Maryland has registered a defensive touchdown in three of the last 10 contests. **Demetrius Hartsfield's** pick-six in the second quarter of the Morgan State game (9/11) was Maryland's first defensive score since **Alex Wujciak** scored on a 70-yard interception return on 11/14/09 at NC State. One week later, Jared Harrell fell on a fumble in the end zone vs. Virginia Tech (11/21/09). FS **Kenny Tate** nearly made it four TDs in seven games. Tate had a 53-yard interception return vs. WVU (9/18). **Adrian Moten**, who is tied for FBS lead in picks by a linebacker, nearly had his fourth interception, and first for a TD. Early in the fourth quarter of the Clemson game (10/16), Moten stepped in front of a Kyle Parker pass on the sidelines, but he could not hang onto the ball. Moten would have walked into the end zone.

WAKE FOREST AT-A-GLANCE..

• Wake Forest is coming off its bye week and has a 2-5 record entering Saturday's matchup. The Demon Deacons have lost five straight after opening the season with wins over Presbyterian and Duke.

• The Demon Deacons and Terps have two common foes. Maryland defeated Navy and Duke, while Wake Forest went 1-1 vs. those two teams (lost to Navy).

• Running back Josh Harris is averaging 71.7 yards per game rushing, which ranks seventh in the ACC. The redshirt freshman ran for 241 yards and two touchdowns, including an 87-yarder, in Wake's last game (Virginia Tech, 10/16).

• True freshman QB Tanner Price is completing 53.6 percent of his passes, with six TDs to three INTs.

• Sophomore wide receiver Chris Givens leads the team and ranks eighth in the ACC with 60.8 receiving yards per game. He is averaging 18.2 yards per catch.

• Senior safety Alex Frye leads the team in solo tackles (33), is tied for the team lead in total tackles (48) and has a team-high three interceptions. He also has two forced fumbles on the season.

• Kyle Wilber, a junior defensive end, is second in the ACC and sixth in the nation in tackles for loss (1.93 pg). He is also tied for fifth in the ACC (t-35 nationally) with 0.71 sacks per game.

• Wake Forest ranks fifth in the ACC in tackles for loss (7.29 pg).

• The Demon Deacons are surrendering 37.7 points per game and rank 11th in the ACC in rushing defense, 12th in pass defense and 12th in total defense.

• Kick returner Michael Campanaro, a freshman, ranks second in the ACC with a 25.2 average on 17 kick returns.

COACHING STAFF AT-A-GLANCE...

- **Ralph Friedgen** is in his 10th season as Maryland's head coach. Friedgen has a 71-48 (.597) record and has led the Terps to six bowl games. He has won a school record four bowl games, while his victory total and winning percentage both rank fourth in Maryland history. Friedgen became only the 13th head coach in ACC history to reach 70 career wins with the Terps victory over Duke (10/2).
- Assistant head coach/offensive coordinator **James Franklin** was named the eventual successor to Friedgen in February, 2009. Franklin, 38, has spent the better part of this decade on the Maryland staff. He served as the wide receivers coach from 2000 to 2004, which spanned Friedgen's first four seasons. During that time, Franklin established himself as one of the nation's top recruiters. Rivals.com ranked Franklin as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters for two of those first four years and tapped him again last season.
- **Don Brown** is in his second year as defensive coordinator. Brown, who runs an attacking-style defense, served as head coach of the University of Massachusetts-Amherst the previous five years which included a trip to the 2006 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) title game. During his tenure, UMass maintained one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Minutemen finished among the top 20 in total defense in three of his five seasons (third in 2005; 20th in 2006; 14th in 2007).

ROBINSON A DUAL-THREAT...

QB **Jamarr Robinson**, a junior from Charlotte, N.C., started the first three games of the season before a shoulder injury sidelined him against FIU (9/25). He also missed the Duke game (10/2), but returned to play a reserve role the last two contests.

- In the season opener, Robinson rushed for 92 yards, averaging 7.7 ypc on 12 rushes. He attempted just five passes in the game, completing two of them, while throwing his first career interception.
- Robinson put up solid numbers while splitting time with **Danny O'Brien** and **C.J. Brown** against Morgan State (9/11). He passed for 70 yards and ran for another 36 on just five attempts. Robinson also had the first multiple-touchdown game of his career, hooking up with **Torrey Smith** on a 5-yard TD and **Adrian Cannon** on a 19-yarder. Overall, Robinson led the Terps on five scoring drives in the game.
- Robinson had a career-high 227 passing yards, tossed two TDs and posted a career-best 161.12 efficiency rating vs. West Virginia (9/18).

O'BRIEN STEPS IN AT QB...

Danny O'Brien has started the last four games, playing in place of an injured **Jamarr Robinson** against FIU (9/25) and Duke (10/2), and continuing as the No. 1 QB against Clemson (10/16) and Boston College (10/23).

- The Kernersville, N.C., native became the first Maryland freshman QB to start since Latrez Harrison (11/20/99), and is one of only five freshmen QBs to start in Maryland history. O'Brien went 18 of 27 for 250 yards and a pair of touchdowns against FIU (9/25), including a 68-yard TD pass to **Torrey Smith**.
- On the season, O'Brien has an efficiency rating of 127.9, which is the fifth-best mark among freshmen QBs in the FBS. He has done a good job spreading the ball around, hitting eight different receivers against FIU (9/25), Clemson (10/16) and Boston College (BC) and six against Duke (10/3).
- Ken Mastrole was the first freshman in school history to start at quarterback (vs. West Virginia, 9/28/96). Randall Jones was the first true freshman signal-caller to start (vs. Clemson, 10/10/98). Two freshmen started the following season. Calvin McCall, a redshirt freshman, started the season opener at Temple (9/2/99) before giving way to Harrison, a true freshman, in the Florida State game (11/13/99). O'Brien's 250 passing yards are the most by any Maryland freshman in his first start. In fact, he more than doubled the previous best mark (100 by McCall vs. Temple in 1999).
- O'Brien went his first 96 collegiate passes without a pick before throwing three in the fourth quarter against Clemson (10/16). His interception that was returned for a TD marked the first points an opponent scored off a Maryland turnover all season. Still, O'Brien went 24-for-45 for a career-high 302 yards,

the most ever by a Maryland freshman starter.

- Against Boston College (10/23), O'Brien set a career high with 26 completions and matched his career high with three TD passes.
- O'Brien has played in each of the first seven games, but saw just one play against Navy (9/6) and West Virginia (9/18). His first significant action came against Morgan State (9/11), when he went 5-of-10 for 79 yards. In that game, O'Brien threw three TD passes, all of which came on his first four pass attempts.

WEEKLY AWARDS...

DB **Kenny Tate** and DL **Joe Vellano** picked up individual awards after helping the Terps down Navy (9/6), 17-14. Tate was voted as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, while Vellano was tabbed the top defensive lineman in the league. It marked the first weekly ACC honor for both players, who were instrumental in Maryland holding Navy to two scores in seven red-zone chances. Tate notched a career-high 12 tackles and also forced a pair of fumbles. Vellano, making his first career start, had 10 tackles, including five solo stops, as well as 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Tate was also named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and was the Jim Thorpe Award DB of the Week. Tate was added to the 2010 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List. **Danny O'Brien** earned ACC Rookie of the Week twice, after throwing for 250 yards against FIU (9/25) and for completing 26 of 39 passes for 179 yards vs. BC (10/23). **Antwine Perez** was the ACC Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble vs. BC.

MULTI-FACETED PLAYMAKER...

Torrey Smith has established himself as one of the most explosive playmakers in the nation over the last two-plus seasons. Smith set the ACC single-season record for kickoff return yardage each of the last two years, totaling 1,309 return yards a year ago. He leads the team in receptions (29) and receiving yards (494) and his 70.6 receiving yards per game ranks fourth in the ACC.

- The junior had at least one touchdown reception during a three-game span - he had two against Morgan State (9/11), two against West Virginia (9/18) and one against FIU (9/25). He became the first Terp to record consecutive games with multiple touchdown receptions since Jermaine Lewis in 1993. His six TD receptions are second in the ACC.

- Smith's explosive play ability has been evident this season. He has touchdown receptions of 60, 68 and 80 yards and is averaging 15.9 yards every time he touches the ball. He also ranks fifth in the ACC with 111.0 all-purpose yards per game.

- With 149 yards receiving against West Virginia (9/18) and 159 against FIU (9/25), Smith recorded back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for the second time in his career. The 308 yards was the most by a Terp in a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28).

- Smith has five career 100-yard receiving games, which ties for fifth all-time in school history.

- Smith is second on Maryland's career all-purpose yards list (4,394) and is one of only two players in school history to reach the 4,000 yard mark. LaMont Jordan holds the school record with 4,960. He is also sixth on the Terps career receptions list (114) and is seventh on the receiving yards chart (1,654).

- Smith's value to the Terrapins doesn't stop on the

field - he is a member of the Terrapin Council, the team's leadership committee, for the second year in a row. "He's a very good receiver, he's a very good leader, he's a very good person," Friedgen said during fall camp. "He's very humble. He's really just a great kid. He has a tremendous work ethic. He's a good student. He's the ideal of low maintenance-high production...his meaning to our team - just his presence alone makes us better. Take away that he's a good football player and everything. His presence in this program, his leadership qualities, his camaraderie, his unselfishness, his ability to communicate with me and all the other kids - he's going to be very successful in life."

SHIFTS ON THE O-LINE...

Despite being dealt two major blows, the Terps' offensive line has played gutty all season. The Terps are eighth in the ACC by allowing 15 sacks on the season, but eight of those came in the West Virginia (9/18) game. A season-ending injury to **Justin Gilbert** vs. WVU caused the Terps to reshuffle the line. **R.J. Dill** moved from right to left tackle and redshirt freshman **Pete DeSouza** stepped in at RT. DeSouza started the next three games, but was involved in a traffic accident just two days prior to the Boston College (10/23) game. DeSouza is expected to make a full recovery, but is out for the season. Against Boston College, the Terps used a lineup with Dill at left tackle, junior **Andrew Gonnella** at left guard, sophomore **Bennett Fulper** at center, sophomore **Justin Lewis** at right guard and senior **Paul Pinegar** at right tackle.

- The Terps allowed just one sack against FIU (9/25), which entered the game 12th in the nation in that category, and none against Duke (10/2). But they surrendered eight sacks to West Virginia (9/18) and three to Clemson (10/16). After the late changes to the line for the BC game, Maryland surrendered two sacks in the game.

- In the season opener the Terps racked up 261 rushing yards (most since 271 vs. Delaware in 2008) on just 34 attempts - an average of 7.7 ypc. **Davin Meggett** had his first career 100-yard game, including a career long 67-yard run, **Jamarr Robinson** ran for 92 yards and **Da'Rel Scott** had 58.

- Against Morgan State (9/11), the Terps had their second consecutive 200-yard rushing game, going for 221. The last time Maryland had back-to-back 200-yard rushing games was 2007, when they had 200 against Wake Forest (9/22) and 239 against Rutgers (9/29) the following week.

- Maryland also totaled 169 rushing yards against FIU (9/25). **Da'Rel Scott** had 103 yards and the line helped create holes for two 50-plus-yard plays - Scott had a 56-yard TD and Davin Meggett had a 76-yard TD. The Terps followed that up with another 100-yard effort against Duke (10/2), totaling 124 yards.

- The Terps had their best passing performance of the season in terms of total yards against Clemson

MORE THAN A TACKLING MACHINE...

One of the top play-making linebackers in the country, **Alex Wujciak** has proved he can do more than just wrap up opposing ball carriers. Wujciak was a first team All-ACC pick in 2009 after leading the team in tackles (career-high 131) and ranking eighth nationally in that category (10.9 per game). He was a consensus preseason All-ACC pick heading into this season and is on the watch list for five awards - Lombardi Award, Nagurski Trophy, Lott Trophy, Bednarik Award and Butkus Award. He set a new career high with 18 tackles in the season opener against Navy (9/6) and ranks second in the ACC and 14th nationally with a 10.6 tackles-per-game average. But the senior also had a pair of interceptions last season and set the Maryland record for return yards. Wujciak totaled 152 return yards on his two picks which set a single-season school record. Joe Horning had 147 return yards in 1951. Wujciak's return yardage ranked fifth nationally last season and was the most by any linebacker. He had a 70-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State (11/7/09) and had a 82-yarder vs. FSU (11/21/09) which set up a TD. Over the last 11 games, he's also forced three fumbles and broken up three passes.

DEPTH AND EXPERIENCE AT LINE-BACKER...

One of the strongest units on the team is linebacker with starters **Alex Wujciak** (Mike), **Adrian Moten** (Sam) and **Demetrius Hartsfield** (Will) and key backups **Darin Drakeford** and **David Mackall**.

- Wujciak ranks second in the ACC and 14th nationally with 10.6 tackles per game. Moten is tied for seventh in the league in stops (7.4 pg), has one forced fumble and is tied for the team lead with three interceptions. Hartsfield, who ranks 23rd in the ACC with 6.0 tackles pg, made his first career interception against Morgan State (9/11), returning it 14 yards for a touchdown.

- The trio combined for 42 tackles against Navy (Wujciak 18; Moten and Hartsfield 12 each) and helped stop the Midshipmen from scoring on five of their seven trips to the red zone. Moten had a spectacular play that made highlight reels around the country, jumping over the offensive line as QB Ricky Dobbs snapped the ball at the Maryland 1-yard line to force a fumble that Maryland recovered. Moten also had 1.0 tackle for loss, while Wujciak and Hartsfield had 0.5 each.

- Wujciak is a two-time All-ACC selection and a consensus preseason first team All-ACC pick. He is one of only two players in the nation (also Nick Bellore, CMU) to post 130 tackles in 2008 and 2009. Moten's 14.5 career sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss are tops on the team. The Terps also have depth behind the starters, although they were dealt a setback with the loss of junior **Ben Pooler** to a knee injury in the preseason. Pooler played in 11 games with five starts last season and was the backup at Will. Sophomore **Ryan Donohue**, Pooler's replacement at Will, had a solid fall camp and recovered a fumble in the game against Navy (9/6). Mackall, a true freshman who tied for the team lead with seven tackles against Morgan State (9/11), is the backup at Mike and Drakeford, who backs up Moten at Sam, is tied for second on the team with 4.5 tackles for loss.

BOOMING BALTZ...

Travis Baltz, an All-ACC selection in 2008 as a punter, has been handling punting and place-kicking duties for the Terps.

- Baltz currently ranks seventh in the ACC and 47th nationally with an average of 41.9 ypp. Of his 43 punts on the season, 14 have been inside the opponents' 20-yard line and six inside the 10. Seven have been 50 yards or longer.

- While taking on kicking duties for the first time in his collegiate career, Baltz was 2-for-2 on PATs and made his only field goal attempt in the season opener against Navy (9/6), a 24-yard game winner.

- Against Morgan State (9/11), Baltz kicked two 47-yard field goals and was a perfect 8-for-8 on PATs. In addition to place-kicking and punting duties, the senior had to handle the kickoffs as well in the second

half after an injury to **Ted Townsley**. Baltz averaged 60.5 yards on four kickoffs.

- Baltz averaged 45.3 ypp on seven punts against West Virginia (9/18), with a season-long 62-yarder. The senior put four punts inside the opponents' 20 and two inside the 10. He also made his only field goal attempt, from 35 yards.

- Baltz was heavily relied upon again in the Clemson game (10/16) and averaged 43.7 ypp on seven tries. He missed his only field goal attempt, however, from 33 yards.

- Baltz has a career average of 41.2 ypp. In 2009 he averaged 40.7 ypp despite battling injuries and in 2008, Baltz averaged 41.1 yards per punt, which ranked first in the ACC and 43rd nationally (FBS).

SECONDARY STEPPING UP...

Maryland's secondary has been solid this season even after losing three of four starters from 2009. The lone returning starter is junior **Cameron Chism**, who moved into a starting role last season after an injury to Nolan Carroll and had a very productive year. Opposite of Chism is junior **Trenton Hughes**, with redshirt freshman **Dexter McDougale** also seeing time at cornerback. **Antwine Perez** and **Kenny Tate** took over the starting safety positions and both have made a big impact.

- The Terps rank second in the ACC and ninth nationally in pass efficiency defense by holding opposing QBs to a 104.8 rating. A big part of that is due to Maryland's ability to force turnovers - the Terps have nine interceptions and six fumble recoveries, which is fifth in the ACC.

- The Terps have recorded at least one interception in five of seven games this season. Adrian Moten and Demetrius Hartsfield each had a pick against Morgan State (9/11); Tate had one against West Virginia (9/18); Hughes made his first career pick vs. FIU (9/25); Perez and Moten each had one against Duke (10/2); and Perez had two against Boston College (10/23).

- Over the last two games, Maryland has allowed just 295 passing yards, while opposing QBs have gone a combined 26 of 54 (48 percent).

- Tate leads the team in solo tackles (33) and is fifth in the ACC in total tackles (8.0 pg). He has also forced four fumbles, the most by a Maryland player since Milton Harris also had four in 2005. Perez is tied for second in the ACC in passes defended (1.29 pg) and Chism is tied for seventh (1.0 pg).

- Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** rolls in a number of secondary players. Sophomore **Eric Franklin**, true freshmen **Matt Robinson** and **Desmond Kearse**, and junior **Austin Walker** also rotate in the defensive backfield.

TOUGH LOSSES...

The Terps suffered a couple of difficult losses during the preseason and two in the regular season. Junior TE **Lansford Watson** injured his knee, had surgery at the end of camp and is out for the season. Watson, who played in 10 games last season, was atop the depth chart at tight end, along with **Devonte Campbell**. In fact, that position was hit hard in August. Campbell (knee), **Will Yeatman** (fractured finger) and **Ryan Schlothauer** (leg) suffered from various ailments. Yeatman played his first game without a cast against Clemson (10/16) and posted three receptions. Maryland had another significant loss in the preseason when linebacker **Ben Pooler** also suffered a season-ending knee injury. Pooler, the team's versatile fourth linebacker, had five starts last season when he posted 43 tackles, which was ninth on the squad. **De'Onte Annett** and **Nick Ferrara** missed the first two games, and Gary Douglas has played in just one game this season. **Taylor Watson**, who had knee surgery in the spring, returned to action against West Virginia (9/18) as did Yeatman. The Terps had a significant loss against WVU as starting left tackle **Justin Gilbert** suffered a torn ACL in his left knee and is out for the season. **Jamarr Robinson** (shoulder) also missed the start against FIU (9/25) and against Duke (10/2), though he was available as an emergency replacement against the Blue Devils. The Terps lost another tight end against Duke as **Dave Stinebaugh**, who had increased playing over the first five games, injured his knee and is out of action up to six weeks. **Pete DeSouza**, who started three games at right tackle after Gilbert's injury, was involved in a traffic accident prior to the Boston College game (10/23) and is out for the season.

CAREER DAY VS. NAVY...

There were a number of Maryland players who posted career high numbers against Navy (9/6):

- Junior DB **Kenny Tate** recorded career highs in tackles (12), solo stops (9) and forced fumbles (2). His previous high in tackles was eight (vs. N.C. State 11/7/09).
- Senior LB **Alex Wujciak** posted a career-best 18 tackles (previous best: 17 vs. Rutgers, 9/26/09).
- Seeing his first extensive action, sophomore **Joe Vellano** recorded career highs in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3.0) and sacks (2.0). Vellano had just one career tackle before that game.
- Senior DE **Drew Gloster** had a career-high seven tackles (previous best: three vs. NC State 11/7/09).
- Sophomore LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** finished with a then career-best 12 tackles. He improved on that production with 13 stops vs. FIU (9/25).
- Sophomore DL **Justin Anderson** posted a career-high five tackles and his first forced fumble.
- **Davin Meggett's** 67-yard scamper in the first quarter was the longest run of the junior's career. It was also Maryland's longest run since Darrius Heyward-Bey went 76 yards vs. Clemson (9/27/08). Meggett totaled 105 yards in the game on just eight carries, the first 100-yard game of his career. Meggett went on eclipse that rush with a 76-yard TD against FIU (9/25).

MORGAN STATE MILESTONES...

Maryland downed Morgan State, 62-3, on 9/11 and there were a number of highlights in the game:

- The 85 yards in total offense allowed by Maryland against Morgan State are the fewest in the Friedgen era. Maryland has now had seven games since 2001 in which they have allowed less than 200 yards (see chart on pg. 5). The most recent was 187 by Villanova in 2007, with the fewest previously allowed being 124 against Eastern Michigan in 2001.
- Morgan State rushed for 37 yards, the lowest total by a Maryland foe since Duke had 23 last season.
- Maryland's 17-point first quarter against Morgan State marked the most points in the opening stanza since the Terps scored 24 on 9/13/03 at home vs. The Citadel.
- Maryland's 45 points in the first half tied for the most in the Friedgen era. The Terps took a 45-21 halftime lead over North Carolina on 11/1/03 en route to a 59-21 home victory. It is the fourth time Maryland scored 40 in a half in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 28-point second quarter marked the most points since it had an ACC-record 39 in the second period against UNC in that 2003 game.
- The last time Maryland scored 50 or more in a game was 9/20/08 when the Terps beat Eastern Michigan 51-24. The last time Maryland scored 60 in a game

was a 61-0 win over The Citadel on 9/13/03. The 62 points mark the most by the Terrapins in the Friedgen era and is the sixth-highest total in school history (see list on pg. 5). It is the seventh time Maryland has scored 50 points or more in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 62 points were the most since a 62-24 win over Virginia on 11/22/75. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since that 61-0 win over The Citadel.

GOAL-LINE STAND...

The Terps had four key goal-line stands against Navy (9/6) which allowed them to come away with a 17-14 win:

- With Navy at the Maryland 1-yard line halfway through the second quarter, **Adrian Moten** leapt over the offensive line and forced a Ricky Dobbs fumble that **Antwine Perez** recovered.
- After Maryland went three-and-out, the Midshipmen again threatened to score as they drove the Maryland seven. But Perez stopped Dobbs at the 2 on third down and time expired in the first half.
- The Terps had another big stop in the second half. After Navy went on a 13-play, 59-yard drive to get to the 1, **Kenny Tate** forced a fumble by Dobbs that Maryland linebacker **Ryan Donohue** recovered.
- Maryland came through with its biggest stop on a Navy fourth-and-goal from the 1 with just 0:37 to play. Tate smashed through the line and tackled Dobbs.

TURNING RED...

The Maryland defense came up with the big stop time and again in the 17-14 win over Navy (9/6). The Midshipmen ran 82 plays and held the ball for close to 40 minutes, but when they got within scoring range, the Terps defense stiffened. Navy ran 32 plays in the red zone, but were only able to come away with points just twice in seven trips. Navy missed a 32-yard field goal on its first possession of the game, but went inside the Maryland 5-yard line on four trips without scoring. The Terps forced two fumbles, stopped a Navy drive at the end of the first half and had a goal-line stand in the final minute of the game to secure the win.

TERPS ADD FLORIDA TRANSFER...

One of the most highly sought-after players in the 2010 recruiting class has joined the Terps. **Adrian Coxson**, a transfer from the University of Florida, began practicing with the team in September. Coxson will sit out this season and be eligible to play in 2011. The Baltimore native is looking forward to getting back on the field. "It's close to home and it's a good program with great coaches," Coxson said of his decision to come to Maryland. "I believe Maryland is really on the rise and I think we're going to have a great season." A four-star prospect who was rated the No. 19 wide receiver in the nation according to Scout.com

TERRAPIN SPORTS RADIO NETWORK

All of Maryland's football games will be broadcast live on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network, which boasts one of the strongest coverage areas in college sports. Terrapin Sports Marketing (TSM), a division of CBS Collegiate Sports Properties, manages the radio network. In its ninth year as the multi-media marketing rights partner for University of Maryland Athletics, Terrapin Sports Marketing has built a stronger network that provides coverage in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, and Washington, D.C.

WJZ-FM 105.7 and WJZ-AM 1300 in Baltimore serve as network's flagship stations, with 13 more affiliates across the state picking up the games.

In July 2010, ESPN980 became the home for Terps football in Washington, D.C. All games will be "trimulcast" throughout the D.C. metropolitan area, suburban Maryland, and Northern Virginia on 980-AM (WTEM), 92.7FM (WWXT) and 94.3FM (WWXX).

and the seventh-best player in the state of Maryland by Rivals.com. Coxson had over 1,280 yards rushing with 11 touchdowns and 650 yards passing and eight touchdowns as a wildcat quarterback in 2009. Coxson averaged 12.08 yards per carry as a senior and had more than 200 rushing yards in four games. He finished his junior season with 40 catches for 987 yards and 12 touchdowns. Coxson was a 2009 *Baltimore Sun* first team All-Metro selection and a second team All-Metro pick in 2008.

MARYLAND-WVU EXTEND SERIES...

Maryland and West Virginia will continue their football rivalry until at least 2017 as the schools agreed to extend the series by four years just before their meeting this season. The upcoming series is as follows:

Maryland and West Virginia have met 47 times (WVU leads 24-21-2), including each season from 1980 to 2007. After a two-year hiatus (2008-09) in the series, the schools agreed to a pair of home-and-home tilts (2010-11) and then tacked on two more years (2012-13) in 2009.

MARYLAND-TEXAS AGREE TO TWO-YEAR DEAL...

Maryland and Texas agreed to a two-year home-and-home football series on Sept. 27. Maryland will travel to Austin, Texas, on Sept. 2, 2017 for a game with the Longhorns. Texas will make the return trip to Maryland on Sept. 1, 2018. That game will be played at FedExField in Landover, Md., home of the Washington Redskins. Both games will be season openers. Texas has won all three previous meetings, though the teams have not met since the 1978 Sun Bowl.

TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...

The Touchdown Club of Annapolis presented the Crab Bowl Trophy to Maryland after its victory over Navy (9/6). The trophy will be presented for all subsequent meetings. The Touchdown Club of Annapolis, founded in 1954, has an extensive history with both Navy and Maryland, honoring both teams at its annual banquet. Commissioned by the club with underwriting from the D'Camera Group, the Crab Bowl is a large pewter bowl overflowing with pewter replicas of the Chesapeake Bay blue crab. The Crab Bowl sits atop an ebony-colored mahogany base that is engraved with the results of previous Maryland-Navy games.

TERPS OWN NATION'S LONGEST STREAK...

- During the last nine seasons, Maryland has had three full-time punters (Brooks Barnard, Adam Podlesh, and **Travis Baltz**), three long snappers (Jon Condo, Andrew Schmitt and **Tim Downs**) and zero blocked punts. In fact, since the Wake Forest game on 10/9/99, only four players (Barnard, Podlesh,

Baltz, **Nick Ferrara**) have started at punter. Downs made his debut last season, replacing Schmitt, a four-year starter at the position. However, with Baltz shelved with an injury, Ferrara took over punting duties for five games. In addition, **Ted Townsley** had one punt in the game against Rutgers (9/26/09).

- The Terrapins' streak without a blocked punt goes back 128 games, the longest streak in college football. The team has kept that streak intact under second-year special teams coordinator **Charles Banks**.

- The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State game (11/13/99). That amount of time became the longest in NCAA football when Georgia had a punt blocked by Ole Miss in 2006, snapping a streak which began earlier in the 1999 season.

TERPS AND THE NFL DRAFT...

- There are currently 29 players on NFL rosters (see list on pg. 22), including 26 who are active (three on practice squads). The 27 active players on rosters rank tied for second among ACC schools. Miami has 42 players active in the NFL and Florida State has 27.

- There have been 24 Terps drafted during **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure as head coach. There have also been 57 players either drafted or signed as free agents over the last seven seasons.

- Maryland had two players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft - OT Bruce Campbell (Oakland, fourth round) and Nolan Carroll (Miami, fifth round) - and five players selected the year before (WR Darrius Heyward-Bey, CB Kevin Barnes, LB Moise Fokou, OL Jaimie Thomas, and TE Dan Gronkowski), which was the most since 2004 when the Terps also had five players chosen. The five selections were also the most for an ACC school in 2009.

- The Terps have had at least two players selected in seven of the last nine drafts.

- The Terrapins have had 15 players chosen in the first round of the NFL Draft, including two Top-10 picks in the last five years. Darrius Heyward-Bey was taken seventh overall in 2009 (Oakland Raiders) and Vernon Davis was selected sixth in 2006 (San Francisco 49ers).

PROTECTING THE HOUSE...

- The Terrapins are 43-17 at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium under **Ralph Friedgen**.

- The Terps finished the 2001 (7-0) and 2003 (6-0) seasons with perfect home records. The Terps also had just one loss at home during the 2002, 2006 and 2008 campaigns.

- In 117-plus seasons of football, Maryland has finished undefeated at home 19 times. Just eight of those occasions, however, have occurred since 1950 (when Byrd Stadium opened), including just

three (1976, 2001 and 2003) since 1975.

- The Terrapins' 6-0 mark in 2003 tied for the second-best record at home in school history. The 1976 team was also 6-0, only to be trumped by the 2001 team which won all seven home games.

MORE ON CAPITAL ONE FIELD AT BYRD STADIUM...

- Now in its 61st year of operation, Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (which had its name changed for the 2009 season) continues to serve as the home of the Terps. Opened on Sept. 30, 1950, and constructed for a sum of \$1 million, Byrd was named after Dr. H.C. "Curley" Byrd, a multi-sport star at Maryland who later became the school's head football coach and, ultimately, its president.

- The Terrapins are 200-116-1 within the friendly confines of Byrd. With the Tyser Tower expansion and temporary bleachers, Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium can hold up to 54,000 (up from 51,500 prior to the 2009 expansion). The win over Duke on 10/2 was the 200th in stadium history.

- Twenty-two of the top 29 crowds in Byrd Stadium history have occurred during **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure.

- Three of the top eight crowds in Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium history occurred in 2007. Maryland welcomed 52,782 fans to Byrd for the 2007 Homecoming game vs. Virginia (10/20). The crowd was the eighth-largest ever at Byrd Stadium. The announced crowd of 52,827 for the game against BC (11/10) marked the seventh-highest in stadium history. The Terps also had a crowd of 51,620 for the 2008 Florida State game and had a sellout for last season's Virginia Tech contest.

- Maryland's six-game 2007 home attendance totaled 307,580. Maryland averaged 51,263 fans per game that season, the third-highest amount in school history. The Terps have now averaged over 50,000 fans at home in four of the past six seasons.

TERP ALLEY...

- In an effort to restore some tradition on gameday in College Park, head coach **Ralph Friedgen** created Terp Alley in 2001, a tradition that has become a part of the gameday experience outside Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

- For every football home game, the entire football team makes its first appearance of the day at "Terp Alley." The team is dropped off at the circle at the top of Field House Drive (between the football press box and Ludwig Field) approximately two hours before kickoff and is led past fans gathered along the street to the football complex by the Maryland band and cheerleaders.

TERP HIGHLIGHTS UNDER FRIEDGEN

- Friedgen has a 71-48 record in nine-plus years, including the first back-to-back-to-back 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003).
- The consensus national coach of the year in 2001 when he led Maryland to its first ACC title in 16 years, Friedgen has guided the Terrapins to six bowl game appearances, including a school-record four postseason wins. He is one of seven coaches in ACC history with four or more bowl wins and one of 11 with six or more bowl game appearances. He became the 13th coach in ACC history to amass 70 wins with the victory over Duke (10/2/10).
- Friedgen's 71 wins are more than the Terps had (60) in the 15 years prior to his arrival. The victory total ranks fourth in school history, as does his winning percentage (.597).
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's nine years as head coach.
- Maryland was among the best in 2008 playing ranked opponents. The Terps went 4-1 vs. ranked foes (AP poll) with wins vs. No. 23 Cal, No. 20 Clemson, No. 21 Wake Forest and No. 17 UNC. The Terps were one of only five teams in the nation (also Florida, Oklahoma, USC and Texas) to beat at least four top 25 teams. The other four all finished in the top five of the final polls.
- During 2007, the Terps defeated two top 10 teams (No. 10 Rutgers, No. 8 Boston College). The Terps had never beaten two Top 10 teams in the same season. They were also one of only four teams in the nation (LSU, Kentucky and Illinois) to accomplish that feat in 2007.
- The Terps posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins (2003, 04, 06), culminating with a 24-7 triumph over Purdue in the 2006 Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps have out-scored their last five bowl foes by a 151-83 margin.
- Maryland posted a school record-tying 11-victory season in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many games.
- Maryland was joined by only four other Division I-A schools - Miami (Fla.), Oklahoma, Texas and Washington State - to have won as many as 10 games in the 2001, 2002 and 2003 seasons.
- A Top 20 final ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03). Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls, and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the ESPN/USA Today poll and 11th in the AP. It was the program's best three-year final rankings since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).
- After seven years as the Terps' head coach, Friedgen ranked the third-most successful seventh-year coach in ACC history, with his 56-31 mark eclipsing those of league mentors Dick Sheridan, Tommy Bowden, Bill Dooley and Mack Brown.
- He is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.
- In his first four years, Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifth-year coach.
- Bowl appearances in six of his first nine seasons, including dominating wins in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7 over West Virginia) and a 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl victory over perennial national power Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in the two major preseason polls). The Terrapins also earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001 campaign.
- Friedgen led the Terps to the 2001 ACC title when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright league title since the Seminoles joined the conference.
- By winning the 2001 ACC title, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- 43 wins in 60 games at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005 and 51,263 in 2007.
- Three of the last nine ACC Defensive Players of the Year.
- 53 national television appearances, including a school-record eight showings in 2002. The Terrapins played on national television or ABC regional six times in 2005, 2006 and 2007, eight times in 2008, and once in 2009.
- The program's first major national award winner since 1974 in linebacker E.J. Henderson, a two-time consensus first team All-American who was named the winner of the Dick Butkus Award (nation's outstanding linebacker) and the Chuck Bednarik Trophy (nation's outstanding defensive player) in 2002.
- Back-to-back school records in number of first team All-ACC performers in 2001 (7) and 2002 (8), and an ACC-best 13 overall all-league honors in 2001 and nine in 2008.
- A league-best 14 representatives on the Academic All-ACC teams during a two-year span (eight in 2008; six in 2007).
- 33 weeks in at least one of the country's two major Top 25 polls, including a streak of seven consecutive weeks at the start of the 2004 season.
- The only consensus national coach of the year award (2001) in Maryland football history. He was one of 20 coaches around the nation on the watch list for the 2008 Paul 'Bear' Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- 22 of the top 29 all-time largest crowds at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium have come since 2001.
- Back-to-back school scoring records (2001 and 2002) and a two-year team scoring average of more than 33 points per game in those seasons.
- A NCAA-low four passing touchdowns allowed in 2005.

Maryland 17, Navy 14

BALTIMORE - Navy dominated the time of possession, outgained Maryland by nearly 200 yards and made 15 more first downs.

None of this lessened the enjoyment the Terrapins derived from their 17-14 victory.

Kenny Tate stopped Ricky Dobbs at the goal line with 34 seconds left, and Maryland stunned their in-state rivals to break a seven-game losing streak that began last October.

The Midshipmen (0-1) held the ball for nearly 19 minutes longer than Maryland (1-0), amassed 485 yards and collected 26 first downs. But in a game influenced by untimely turnovers and huge penalties, the outcome was decided by a gritty goal-line stand.

Trailing 17-14 with a fourth down at the 1, Navy decided to go for the win. Dobbs took the snap, went to his left and was met by Tate, who would not relent to the momentum Dobbs brought to the line.

Maryland raced to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and then held on behind a defense that repeatedly excelled after Navy got inside the 20.

The Midshipmen had a 7 1/2-minute edge in time of possession in the first half, yet trailed 14-7 after coming up empty on drives of 52, 63 and 66 yards.

In the second half, Dobbs lost a fumble at the Maryland 1 and was stuffed by Tate on the game's pivotal play. Dobbs ran for 63 yards and a touchdown, but the senior quarterback fumbled three times -- losing two of them at the Maryland 1.

Navy didn't punt until early in the fourth quarter, and the short kick was returned 57 yards by Tony Logan to the Navy 16.

Maryland promptly fumbled the ball away on a missed exchange.

The Midshipmen pulled even at 14 with 1:52 left in the third quarter when Dobbs scored from the 1 on a drive that began with wide receiver Greg Jones running 53 yards on a reverse.

A crowd of 69,348 showed up for the second meeting between the teams since 1965.

Maryland 62, Morgan State 3

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - With Maryland coming off an emotional win and playing with only four days rest, coach Ralph Friedgen was worried about how the Terrapins would fare against in-state foe Morgan State. He got the answer rather quickly.

Maryland scored on its first three possessions Saturday night, and the Terrapins enjoyed their highest-scoring performance in 35 years with a 62-3 rout.

Despite the quick turnaround following Monday's win over Navy, the Terrapins reached the 62-point mark for the first time since a 62-24 blowout against Virginia on Nov. 22, 1975. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since a 61-0 win over the Citadel on Sept. 13, 2003.

Maryland has already matched its victory total from last season and owns its first winning streak since 2008.

Morgan State (1-1) gained only six yards in the first half and finished with 85 - the fewest allowed by Maryland since Friedgen arrived in 2001.

Morgan State's lone score came on a 39-yard field goal by Kemar Scarlett in the third quarter.

Maryland backup quarterback Danny O'Brien entered for starter Jamarr Robinson in the second quarter with the score 24-0. On his third play, O'Brien unleashed his first career throw: a 27-yard touchdown pass to wide-open tight end Matt Furstenburg.

A 37-yard punt return by Tony Logan led to a 24-yard TD pass from O'Brien to Torrey Smith, and O'Brien closed out Maryland's prolific first half by connecting with running back Da'Rel Scott on a 22-yard score.

Robinson also had his first game with multiple touchdown passes, connecting with Smith on a 5-yarder and Adrian Cannon for 19 yards to end Maryland's first two possessions.

Late in the first quarter, a 6-yard punt by the Bears set up a 47-yard field goal by Travis Baltz for a 17-0 lead.

With the Bears backed up on their own 11, Maryland's Demetrius Hartsfield intercepted a Dickerson pass at the 14 and coasted into the end zone for a 24-0 lead.

No. 21 West Virginia 31, Maryland 17

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Jamarr Robinson had third-quarter touchdown passes of 60 and 80 yards to Torrey Smith, but a fast start lifted No. 21 West Virginia past Maryland, 31-17, on Saturday.

Geno Smith threw a career-high four touchdown passes for the Mountaineers, while Noel Devine rushed for a season-high 131 yards.

Smith, a sophomore making his third career start, had two scoring tosses apiece to sophomore Tavon Austin and redshirt freshman Stedman Bailey as West Virginia (3-0) jumped ahead 28-0 early in the third quarter.

Except for Geno Smith's 5-yard scoring toss to Bailey to start the third quarter, West Virginia struggled on offense after halftime as it tried to eat up clock time. Smith finished 19 of 29 for 268 yards.

Torrey Smith caught three passes for 149 yards. His TD catches cut Maryland's deficit to 28-14. Terps added a 35-yard field goal from Travis Baltz in the fourth quarter.

West Virginia then put the game out of reach behind fullback Ryan Clarke, who carried eight straight times on the ensuing 16-play drive that ate up nearly nine minutes of clock and ended with Tyler Bitancourt's 23-yard field goal with three minutes left for the final margin.

Maryland was trying for a 3-0 start for the first time since coach Ralph Friedgen's first season in 2001.

Austin had a big day against the Terrapins with seven catches for 106 yards to add to his team-leading totals. Early in the game, he caught a 15-yard pass, threw a key block that sprang Devine on a 50-yard run, then caught a 6-yard scoring pass from Smith on a crossing route.

After West Virginia got the ball back near midfield, Geno Smith avoided the blitz and hit Sanders on a 32-yard pass play to set up Smith's 5-yard TD toss to a wide-open Austin for a 14-0 lead.

Bailey took over from there, stretching high to snare a 26-yard scoring pass in the back of the end zone early in the second.

Maryland entered the game averaging 241 yards rushing but was held to minus-10. Bruce Irvin had three of West Virginia's eight sacks.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland was in desperate need of a big play when Tony Logan wrapped his arms around a punt at his own 16-yard line.

Eight-four yards later, the Terrapins had their first lead against Duke.

Logan's electrifying punt return in the third quarter provided Maryland with the push it needed, and the Terrapins opened the ACC portion of their schedule with a 21-16 victory.

Maryland (4-1, 1-0) trailed 9-0 midway in the second quarter and 9-7 at halftime before coming back. Logan's touchdown made it 14-9, and the Terps held on.

Logan sidestepped a potential tackler immediately after catching the punt. He then headed upfield, juked to his left and then cut right at his own 25 before sprinting down the sideline to the end zone. It was Logan's second punt return for a score in two weeks.

Duke (1-4, 0-2) lost for the fourth-straight time. Sophomore Sean Renfree completed 28 of 56 passes for 351 yards and a touchdown, but he was intercepted twice.

Donovan Varner had eight catches for 128 yards, and Conner Vernon gained 99 yards on six receptions.

A 2-yard touchdown pass from Renfree to Brandon King made it 21-16 with 7:20 to go, and after a Maryland punt the Blue Devils moved from their own 19 to the Maryland 39 with two minutes left. Facing a fourth-and-15, Renfree threw a pass to Austin Kelly that was tipped away.

Duke has been tormented this season by too many turnovers and the Terrapins got their first touchdown late in the first half following an interception, and in the second half Logan and Scott scored on long plays.

But the Duke defense - which was allowing 44.5 points per game - made it tough on O'Brien, who was playing in place of injured starter Jamarr Robinson for a second straight week. O'Brien went 9 for 26 for 170 yards, including his TD pass to Scott.

Davin Meggett capped off an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 3-yard TD plunge which cut Duke's lead to 9-7 with under two minutes left in the first half.

Will Snyderwine kicked three first-half field goals when the Maryland defense stiffened in the red zone three times.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Danny O'Brien threw for a career-high 302 yards, but Clemson made key plays on special teams to outlast Maryland, 31-7.

Andre Ellington had an 87-yard kickoff return score and added a rushing touchdown as Clemson broke a three-game losing streak.

The victory for the Tigers (3-3, 1-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) came when former Clemson star C.J. Spiller had his No. 28 retired. And Ellington did his best to emulate the excitement Spiller brought Death Valley the last four years.

Ellington broke through the Terps early in the second quarter for Clemson's first kickoff return score since Spiller had one against South Carolina last November.

Ellington also had a 1-yard touchdown in the third quarter and Jaron Brown set up a TD later in the period with a 41-yard punt return.

Maryland (4-2, 1-1) had won three of its past four against Clemson, but got its lone TD on a 4-yard halfback pass from Da'Rel Scott to O'Brien who completed 24 of 45 passes.

Clemson defensive end Da'Quan Bowers had three sacks, giving him nine on the season. Cornerback Xavier Brewer had a 61-yard interception return touchdown in the final quarter.

Maryland's best chance at a late rally came in the third quarter, driving to the Clemson 29 down 24-7. However, the Terps were flagged for an illegal shift and the Tigers took over on downs.

The Terps had Clemson's number the past few meetings, including the past two at Death Valley where they left with stunning victories against the favored Tigers.

Maryland outgained Clemson 350 to 213, but the Tigers made plays when they needed them.

Scott and Davin Meggett combined for just 47 yards on the ground, and receiver Torrey Smith was held to four catches for 55 yards.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Antwine Perez had two interceptions and a fumble recovery, and Danny O'Brien matched a career high with three TD passes to lead Maryland to an emotional 24-21 win over Boston College.

O'Brien completed 27 of 40 passes for 182 yards, hitting Torrey Smith, Ronnie Tyler and Kerry Boykins on touchdown passes for Maryland (5-2, 2-1 ACC) which held off a fourth-quarter rally by the Eagles.

The Terps were playing without Pete DeSouza, who was lost for the year in a traffic accident less than 48 hours before kickoff. Despite the emotions, O'Brien, also a redshirt freshman, didn't seem rattled.

He did not turn the ball over and connected with eight different receivers. Smith had receptions and Tyler added five catches for 57 yards for the Terps who utilized a short passing game to counter the ACC's top-ranked rush defense.

Maryland went ahead late in the first quarter on a 2-yard scoring pass from O'Brien to Smith. The score completed a 13-play drive which was set up by a 29-yard punt return from Tony Logan, the nation's second-leading returner.

After BC tied the game at 7-all with 12:09 left in the second quarter on a Chase Rettig to Bobby Swigert 3-yard TD connection, the Terps cashed in two of the Eagles' three turnovers.

Kenny Tate forced Montel Harris to do something he rarely does, fumble the football. The junior knocked the ball free and Perez recovered at the BC 38. Nine plays later O'Brien hit Tyler on a 9-yard TD pass.

On BC's next offensive play, Rettig was intercepted by Perez and he returned it to the Eagles' 22. O'Brien directed another short TD march, connecting with Boykins on a 6-yard scoring toss on third-and-goal with 2:38 to go in the opening half.

Maryland got a 26-yard field goal from Travis Baltz to go ahead 24-7 with 13 seconds to play in the third quarter before BC started to get things going.

Rettig hit Ifeanyi Moma for a 23-yard pass to the Maryland 7, and Harris ran it three times for the score that made it 24-14 with 11:20 to play. After BC forced a punt, Rettig threw a long pass to Moma that was high and off his fingertips, only to be caught by Swigert for a gain of 63 yards.
