2010 Football Game Notes

Maryland at Clemson

(4-1, 1-0 ACC)

(2-3, 0-2 ACC)

FIRST-AND-10...

- Maryland has won back-to-back games and is off to one of its best starts under **Ralph Friedgen**. The Terps, who enjoyed a week of healing and fine tuning with the bye after the Duke contest, begin a stretch Saturday with four of five games on the road. Maryland, which is receiving votes in the *USA Today* poll, will travel to Clemson to face a squad which has dropped three straight, though two of those losses came against top 20 foes. The Terps have been a gritty bunch this year, winning by making big plays, holding onto the football and coming up with a key stop with the game on the line. Saturday's game will be broadcast regionally on the ACC Network and can be heard on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network.

- The Maryland offense, under third-year coordinator and assistant head coach **James Franklin**, ranks fourth in the ACC (42nd nationally) in scoring (31.8 ppg). RBs **Da'Rel Scott** and **Davin Meggett**, and WR **Torrey Smith** have all produced for an offense which has scored six times this season on plays of 50 yards or more. Scott and Meggett have combined to average 5.7 yards per carry this year, while Smith, one of the most dynamic players in the nation, has five TD receptions (second in the ACC) and is averaging 81.0 receiving yards per game (third in the ACC). The Biletnikoff Award candidate is also first in the ACC in all-purpose yards (123.0 ypg). **Danny O'Brien** became the first Maryland freshman to start at quarterback in 11 years when he subbed for **Jamarr Robinson** (shoulder) against FIU. O'Brien also started against Duke, though Robinson is close to full strength this week. Both QBs are expected to play vs. Clemson, with the starter a game-time decision. The o-line, which was reshuffled following a season-ending knee injury to LT **Justin Gilbert**, surrendered just one sack the last two games. C **Paul Pinegar**, LG **Andrew Gonnella** and LT **R.J. Dill** (moved from RT) have the most experience along the line. **Justin Lewis** mans the right guard position, with **Bennett Fulper** rotating in at that spot and center. **Pete DeSouza** made his first career start against FIU, opening the game at right tackle.

- The linebacker corps, including two-time All-ACC performer **Alex Wujciak**, anchors the defense under second-year coordinator **Don Brown**. The Terps rank first in the ACC and 28th nationally in scoring defense (18.4 ppg), and have surrendered a league-low 11 TDs. They also have the best red-zone defense in the ACC (sixth nationally). Maryland is allowing opponents to gain just 4.8 yards per play, which ranks tied for third in the ACC. A key to the defensive effort is the production of the linebackers. The Terps possess four of the top nine tacklers in the ACC. Wujciak, who is listed among the preseason candidates for five national awards (see list on pg. 6), ranks second in the league and 10th nationally in tackles (11.4 pg). LB **Adrian Moten**, a playmaker throughout his career (team-best 9.0 TFLs and 6.0 sacks last year), ranks fifth in the ACC in stops (8.2 pg), while LB **Demetrius Hartsfield**, a 2009 freshman All-ACC pick, is ninth (7.4 pg). First-year starter **Joe Vellano** is among the more productive linemen in the ACC. He ranks second in sacks (1.0 pg) and fifth in tackles for loss (1.7 pg). **A.J. Francis**, a 2009 freshman All-America choice, has 14 tackles over the last two games from his nose tackle position. Junior CB **Cameron Chism**, one of five returning defensive starters, posted a team-best four interceptions in 2009 and ranks tied for fourth in the league in passes defended (1.2 pg), along with Moten and senior **Antwine Perez**. Junior **Kenny Tate** has been a playmaker. He is seventh in the ACC in tackles (7.8 pg) and tied for first in forced fumbles (0.60 pg).

- Special teams was expected to be a strength this season with all the top performers back and the Terps have demonstrated that over the first five games. **Travis Baltz**, a 2008 first team All-ACC punter, has handled both kicking chores with an early-season injury to place-kicker **Nick Ferrara**, a 2009 freshman All-American. Baltz has connected on four of his five FG attempts and is averaging 41.7 yards per punt, with nearly half his attempts (13 of 30) landing inside the 20-yard line. Junior **Tony Logan** has been one of the top punt returners in the nation. He has returned two punts for scores, becoming one of just three players in ACC history to post consecutive games with a return for a score. Logan is also averaging a nation's-best 27.7 ypr. Smith was one of the top kick returners in the country last season, posting an ACC single-season record 1,309 yards.

QUICK HITTERS....

- Maryland is off to one of its best starts in **Ralph Friedgen's** 10 seasons. The Terps are 4-1 for the first time since 2008 and have won at least four of their first five for the third occasion in Friedgen's tenure (5-0 in 2001 en route to a 10-2 mark).
- The Terps won for the 200th time in Byrd Stadium when they knocked off Duke (10/2).
- Friedgen just became the 13th head coach in ACC history to amass 70 career wins with the victory over Duke (10/2).
- **Torrey Smith's** 23.8 yards-per-catch average is second in the FBS among receivers with at least 15 catches.
- Butkus Award candidate **Alex Wujciak** has averaged 10.7 tackles per game in his career which is second in the nation among active players (see chart on pg. 4).
- Smith has a school-record three career kickoff returns for touchdowns and is one of only two active players in the ACC with more than one (2 by T.J. Graham, N.C. State). Tyron Carrier of Houston (5) is the only player in the nation with more kickoff returns for touchdowns than Smith (see list on pg. 4).
- A disruptive force who looks like he is coming into his own, junior safety **Kenny Tate** is the leading tackler in the ACC among defensive backs (7.8 per game) and is one of three players in the ACC with a league-leading three forced fumbles.
- **Adrian Moten** has a career-best three interceptions and leads the FBS in picks among linebackers (0.60 pg). Moten's three interceptions are already the most in one season by a Maryland linebacker in 23 years (four by Karl Edwards in 1987).
- The Terrapins, who have been to six bowl games under Friedgen, have 51 letterwinners, including 12 offensive and defensive starters, all four special teams performers back from 2009. There are eight Terps on the roster who have earned all-conference and/or All-America honors.
- The Terrapins have over 70 percent of the offensive and defensive two-deep back from the end of 2009. There are 17 of 22 offensive players back and 14 of 22 defenders. In addition, all six special teams starters (KR, PR, PK, P, LS, H) are back in uniform.
- The Terps have just eight seniors (**Adrian Cannon, Paul Pinegar, Da'Rel Scott, LaQuan Williams, Drew Gloster, Adrian Moten, Alex Wujciak, and Antwine Perez**) listed among the 44 players on the current offensive and defensive two-deep. In addition, senior **Travis Baltz** is the first-team punter and place-kicker.
- There are six bowl teams from last year which appear on the Terps' 2010 schedule: Navy (Texas Bowl), West Virginia (Konica Minolta Gator Bowl), Clemson (Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl), Boston College (Emerald Bowl), Miami (Champs Sports Bowl), and Florida State (Konica Minolta Gator Bowl).

STREAKS AND TRENDS...

- The Terps have won two straight games at Clemson.
- The Terps have turned the ball over just four times this season (two interceptions/two fumbles). Only one team in the FBS (Oregon State – 1) has turned it over fewer times. Oklahoma, Wisconsin and Army have also posted just four turnovers.
- The Maryland running backs have yet to fumble the ball (120 carries) this season, while the quarterbacks have not tossed an interception in the last 90 passes.
- **Alex Wujciak** has started a team-best 30 straight games, all at Mike LB. **Torrey Smith's** 11 straight starts leads the offense.
- Wujciak has reached double-digit tackles in 20 of his last 26 games.
- The Terps have recorded 14 interceptions over the last 10 games.

TWO IN A ROW FOR LOGAN...

A reserve wideout who has solidified his role as a punt returner, **Tony Logan** has been a game-changer for Maryland this season. The junior is averaging an astounding 27.7 yards per return on 15 chances this season (first in the FBS). Logan is also one of just four players in the FBS who has two punt returns for touchdowns - an 85-yarder against FIU (9/25) and an 84-yarder vs. Duke (10/2). The TD returns came at crucial times for the Terps – his TD against FIU (first punt return for a score since Steve Suter in the 2004 Gator Bowl) broke a 7-7 tie and the one against Duke gave Maryland a 14-9 lead. Logan has four returns over 50 yards and his 415 punt return yards are already the third most in a season in Maryland history and more than 114 of the 120 FBS schools tallied all of 2009. Logan has two of the top three punt returns in school history, trailing only a 90-yard TD

BREAKING UP IS EASIER TO DO...

The Terps, who rank second in the ACC in passing efficiency defense, have been an aggressive bunch defending the throwing game this season. The defense has already posted 25 pass breakups on the season after tallying 29 all of 2009. Three Terps - **Antwine Perez, Adrian Moten** and **Cameron Chism** - rank tied for fourth in the ACC in passes defended (1.2 per game). As a team, the Terps are third in the ACC in both interceptions (seven) and pass breakups. Chism and Perez had two of the best games in the country this season knocking down passes. Chism had four PBUs vs. FIU (9/25) and Perez matched that total vs. Duke (10/2), tallies that are tied for the most in one FBS game this season.

HOLDING ONTO THE BALL...

The Terps have continued where they left off last season in the turnover department. Maryland ranked 97th in the FBS (-0.50 pg) in turnover margin in 2009, but improved during the latter half of the year, going +7.0 over the last five games. The defense forced 10 turnovers in the last five games of 2009 after inducing seven in the first seven contests. This season, Maryland is first in the ACC and sixth nationally in turnover margin (+1.60 pg). The Terps, plus-8 on the season, have won the turnover battle in all five games. In fact, Maryland has not turned the ball over in its last 155:30 of game action, while gaining six from the opposition in that time span.

DEFENSE TIGHTENS IN RED ZONE...

The Maryland defense has been at its best when the opposing team reaches the red zone. The Terps lead the ACC and are sixth nationally by allowing opponents to score just 61 percent of the time when they get inside the 20-yard line. Out of 23 trips to the red zone, Maryland has stopped the opponent nine times, including three fumble recoveries, two interceptions and two on downs. Maryland did its best work against Navy (9/6), stopping the Midshipmen on five of its seven trips to the red zone. The Terps' nine stops inside the 20-yard line are tied for first nationally.

DID YOU KNOW? ...

Maryland and Florida State are the only two teams which rank in the top five of the ACC in both scoring offense and defense. The Terps are fourth in scoring offense (31.8 ppg) and second in scoring defense (18.4). FSU is second in scoring offense (36.7) and first in scoring defense (15.7).

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS...

The Terps have been much more effective in making explosive plays to score points this year than they were last season.

- Maryland already has 30 explosive plays (defined as 20 yards or longer) this year, and the Terps have scored 12 touchdowns on those plays. In 2009, Maryland had just 13 TDs off explosive plays the entire season.

- The Terps had four scoring plays over 50 yards against FIU (9/25). **Tony Logan** had an 85-yard punt return, **Davin Meggett** had a 76-yard run, **Torrey Smith** had a 68-yard reception and **Da'Rel Scott** had a 56-yard run. It marked the first time since 9/13/03 (vs. The Citadel) that Maryland had 50-plus yard TDs on a punt return, rush and pass.

- The Terps have 12 plays of 50 yards or longer this year - four on punt returns, four on passes, three on rushes and one on an interception return. In 2009, Maryland had eight plays of 50 yards or longer all season.

SUDDEN CHANGE..

After going 41 games without scoring via a fumble or interception (Erin Henderson in 2006 vs. Virginia), Maryland has registered a defensive touchdown in three of the last nine contests. **Demetrius Hartsfield's** pick-six in the second quarter of the Morgan State game (9/11) was Maryland's first defensive score since **Alex Wujciak** scored on a 70-yard interception return on 11/14/09 at NC State. One week later, Jared Harrell fell on a fumble in the end zone vs. Virginia Tech (11/21). FS **Kenny Tate** nearly made it four TDs in seven games. Tate had a 53-yard interception return vs. WVU (9/18/10).

0... Number of points the opposition has scored off four Maryland turnovers this season. In contrast, the Terps have scored 38 points off 12 opponent turnovers.

2...Joe Vellano ranks second in the ACC in tackles (5.8 per game) among interior defensive linemen.

FORCING THE ISSUE...

Maryland's defense has been a more aggressive unit through five games this season than at the same point last year. So far the Terps have forced eight fumbles, recovering five of those. They have also picked off seven passes. After five games a year ago, the first under coordinator **Don Brown**, the Terrapins forced two fumbles (none recovered) and picked off three passes.

DID YOU KNOW? ...

Tony Logan is one of only five FBS players in the last eight years to return two punts of at least 80 yards for touchdowns in the same season. He is joined on the list by Quinton Jones of Boise State (2005), DeSean Jackson of Cal (2006), Javier Arenas of Alabama (2008) and LaVon Brazill of Ohio (2009).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR VS. CLEMSON AND BEYOND...

- The Terps are attempting to post a 2-0 start in the ACC for the first time since 2005.

- Maryland is looking to win on the road for the first time since it visited Clemson on 9/27/08.

- Senior RB **Da'Rel Scott** needs 48 rushing yards to become the 10th back in school history to 2,000 in his career. In addition, he can also become the 10th player in school history with 3,000 career all-purpose yards with another 15.

- Scott ranks 11th on the Maryland career rushing list (1,952). He needs six yards to reach Billy Lovett (2002-03 2005-06) who is in 10th place.

- Senior LB **Alex Wujciak** needs nine more tackles to reach the top 15 on the Maryland career list (see pg. 21). Kevin Walker (330, 1985-87) currently occupies the 14th spot.

- Senior LB **Adrian Moten**, who has 14.5 career sacks, needs 0.5 more to reach the top 15 on the Maryland all-time list (see pg. 21).

- **Torrey Smith** ranks second in school history in career all-purpose yardage (4,232). He needs to average 104.0 yards a game the rest of the season to pass Lamont Jordan (1997-00) who has a school-record 4,960 all-purpose yards (see pg. 19).

- Smith, who holds the Maryland career kickoff return yards mark (2,559), needs 86 yards to set the ACC mark. Smith is currently third (see pg. 7) while Brandon Tate of North Carolina (2,688/2005-08) holds the record.

- Smith has 102 career catches which is ninth in school history. Barry Johnson (1987-90) is eighth with 106 catches (see pg. 19). He also has 1,565 receiving yards, also ranking ninth on the Maryland career list (see pg. 20). Smith needs 76 yards to reach Ferrell Edmunds (1984-87/1,641) in eighth.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES...

- **Avery Graham** leads the squad with 10 special teams tackles. He has five on kickoff returns and five on punt returns. **Matt Robinson** is second on the team with six (all on kickoff returns).

- **Desmond Kears** started as a third safety against FIU (9/25), becoming the first Terp true freshman defensive player to start since Jeremy Navarre (vs. Boston College, 11/19/05). Kears is also the first true freshman DB to start since Domonique Foxworth (vs. NC State, 11/17/01).

- **Torrey Smith** had season highs in receptions (eight) and receiving yards (159), including a 68-yard touchdown, in the win over FIU (9/25). The junior had consecutive 100-yard receiving games for the first time in his career and the 308 receiving yards over those two contests (also 149 vs. WVU, 9/18) are the most by a Terp over a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28). With Smith's 193 all-purpose yards (also 34 kickoff return yards) against FIU, he became just the second player in school history to accumulate more than 4,000 all-purpose yards in his career, joining LaMont Jordan (4,960).

COACHING STAFF AT-A-GLANCE...

- **Ralph Friedgen** is in his 10th season as Maryland's head coach. Friedgen has a 70-47 (.598) record and has led the Terps to six bowl games. He has won a school record four bowl games, while his victory total and winning percentage both rank fourth in Maryland history. Friedgen became only the 13th head coach in ACC history to reach 70 career wins with the Terps victory over Duke (10/2).

- Assistant head coach/offensive coordinator **James Franklin** was named the eventual successor to Friedgen in February, 2009. Franklin, 38, has spent the better part of this decade on the Maryland staff. He served as the wide receivers coach from 2000 to 2004, which spanned Friedgen's first four seasons. During that time, Franklin established himself as one of the nation's top recruiters. Rivals.com ranked Franklin as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters for two of those first four years and tapped him again last season.

- **Don Brown** is in his second year as defensive coordinator. Brown, who runs an attacking-style defense, served as head coach of the University of Massachusetts-Amherst the previous five years which included a trip to the 2006 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) title game. During his tenure, UMass maintained one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Minutemen finished among the top 20 in total defense in three of his five seasons (third in 2005; 20th in 2006; 14th in 2007).

CLOSE CALLS...

Despite the 2-10 finish last year, Maryland was in nearly every game to the last possession. In seven of the losses, the Terps were within a touchdown in the fourth quarter. They lost four games by four points or less and the last two by a combined five points. In the loss to Florida State (11/21/09), Maryland took the lead twice in the final quarter vs. the Seminoles, only to lose on a touchdown with 32 seconds left. So far the Terps, hoping to regain their 2008 form, are 2-0 in games decided by seven points or less. Two seasons ago, the Terps were 6-1 in games decided by a touchdown or less.

DID YOU KNOW? ...

In ACC history there have been only two occurrences of back-to-back games with 80-plus yard punt returns for touchdowns. **Tony Logan** did it this season (85 yards vs. FIU, 9/25; 84 yards vs. Duke, 10/2) and Willie Reid of Florida State was the first league player to perform the feat (83 vs. Virginia Tech in the ACC championship game on 12/3/05; 87 vs. Penn State in the Orange Bowl on 1/3/06).

GREEN TEAM...

Maryland played 24 freshmen (10 true/14 redshirts) last season, which was the most during **Ralph Friedgen's** first nine seasons. The Terps played 20 freshmen in both the 2001 and 2004 seasons. Last year's freshmen are now sophomores, but the Terps are still relatively young, though more experienced. Of the 111 players on the roster, 67 are freshmen or sophomores, but just 16 are seniors. Maryland also had a relatively low senior class (14) last season. There were 12 Maryland players who saw action for the first time in their careers against Navy (9/6), including nine freshmen. Seeing action were true freshmen **Matt Robinson** and **David Mackall**, red-shirt freshmen **Dexter McDougale**, **Danny O'Brien**, **D.J. Adams**, **Avery Graham**, **Marcus Whitfield**, **Bradley Johnson** and **Dave Stinebaugh**; sophomore **Ryan Schlothauer**; and juniors **Nick Peterson** and **Herbert Law**.

ALL HANDS ON DECK...

There were 75 players who saw action against Morgan State (9/11) which is the most in **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure. The Terps had 70 players take the field vs. The Citadel on 9/13/03. After 12 players saw their first career action in the season opener vs. Navy, another 14 Terps got their feet wet vs. Morgan State (9/11). The list included **Louis Berman**, **Cody Blue**, **C.J. Brown**, **Josh Cary**, **Pete DeSouza**, **Anthony Green**, **Trenton Hughes**, **Desmond Kearse**, **Nick Klemm**, **Paul Lariviere**, **Joey McQueeney**, **Chris Rhodes**, **Mike Salvatico** and **Pete White**. There were two more players - TE **Will Yeatman** and DL

De'Onte Arnett - who saw their first career action as Terps in the WVU game (9/18). In addition, RB **Taylor Watson** hit the field for the first time this season in that contest.

CLEMSON AT-A-GLANCE...

- Clemson enters Saturday's matchup at 2-3 overall and 0-2 in the ACC, having dropped three straight to then-No. 16 Auburn, then-No. 16 Miami and North Carolina.
- Sophomore running back Andre Ellington leads the team and ranks third in the ACC with 87.0 rushing yards per game. Ellington is averaging 6.6 ypr and is tied for the league lead with seven rushing TDs.
- Junior RB Jamie Harper also contributes to the ground attack, ranking second on the team with 60 carries for 238 yards (47.6 pg). Harper is also third on the team with 10 receptions, including a team-high three TD receptions.
- Overall, Clemson's rushing attack ranks fifth in the league (179.6 ypg). The Tigers have run the ball on 55 percent of their offensive plays.
- The passing attack is led by sophomore quarterback Kyle Parker, who is completing 53.4 percent of his passes. Parker has thrown for 173.2 ypg and has totaled seven touchdowns to four interceptions.
- Defensively, the Tigers average 8.8 tackles for loss per game, which is tied for second in the nation. They are also fourth in the ACC and 19th nationally in sacks per game (2.8).
- Defensive end Da'Quan Bowers leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally in sacks (1.2 pg). A junior, Bowers is also first in the ACC and third nationally in tackles for loss (2.2 pg).
- Seven different Tigers have made an interception this season, with the team total (7) ranking tied for third in the league.
- Senior corner back Marcus Gilchrist handles kickoff and punt returns and ranks second in the ACC by averaging 13.0 yards per punt return.

MARYLAND-CLEMSON SERIES HISTORY...

- Saturday's game will mark the 59th meeting between the Terrapins and Tigers. The two teams met for the first time in 1952, and have played every year since, with Clemson owning a 30-26-2 edge in the all-time series. Maryland is 13-16 vs. Clemson in games played in Death Valley. The Terps have won the last two in Memorial Stadium.
- The Terps are 6-3 against the Tigers under **Ralph Friedgen**, including a 13-12 win in 2006 in Clemson and a 20-17 victory in 2008. Prior to Friedgen's arrival, Clemson had taken eight straight and 13 of 14 in the series.
- The series has been extremely close in recent years

with five of the last six games being decided by four points or less.

- Four years ago, Maryland won 13-12 at No. 19 Clemson after Dan Ennis nailed a 31-yard field goal as time expired.
- Clemson won 30-17 in 2007 at College Park, but the Terps rallied for 20-17 win over the 20th-ranked Tigers the next season in Death Valley. Chris Turner threw a TD pass and **Da'Rel Scott** scored the go-ahead touchdown. Clemson QB Cullen Harper was stopped short on fourth-and-1 with 5:36 remaining.
- Last season in College Park, Turner passed for two touchdowns and Maryland overcame two late missed field goals by Clemson in a 24-21 win. The Tigers' had their final drive snuffed out at the 28 with a sack and fumble recovery by **Demetrius Hartsfield** with 27 seconds to play. Clemson cut the score to 24-21 with 4:11 left in the third quarter after C.J. Spiller scored on a 92-yard kickoff return. The Tigers could have tied and taken the lead but Richard Jackson missed field goals from 47 and 48 yards away.

ROBINSON A DUAL-THREAT...

Jamarr Robinson, a junior from Charlotte, N.C., started the first three games of the season at quarterback until a shoulder injury sidelined him against FIU (9/25). He also missed the Duke game (10/2), but returned to practice during the bye week. Robinson has made five career starts, including two last season.

- In the season opener, Robinson rushed for 92 yards, averaging 7.7 ypc on 12 rushes. He attempted just five passes in the game, completing two of them, while throwing his first career interception.

- Robinson put up solid numbers while splitting time with **Danny O'Brien** and **C.J. Brown** against Morgan State (9/11). He passed for 70 yards and ran for another 36 on just five attempts. Robinson also had the first multiple-touchdown game of his career, hooking up with **Torrey Smith** on a 5-yard TD and **Adrian Cannon** on a 19-yarder. Overall, Robinson led the Terps on five scoring drives in the game.

- Robinson had a career-high 227 passing yards, tossed two TDs and posted a career-best 161.12 efficiency rating vs. West Virginia (9/18).

- Last year, Robinson saw most of his action late in the season in place of an injured Chris Turner. Against Virginia Tech (11/14/09), in his first career start, Robinson totaled 233 yards of offense, including 129 yards on the ground.

- In his second career start, Robinson showed vast

improvement through the air while maintaining his ability to pick up yards on the ground against Florida State (11/21/09). He finished the game 20 of 27 (74.1 percent) for 213 yards and a touchdown. Robinson also ran 12 times for 58 yards, helping the Terps post a season-high 196 yards on the ground.

O'BRIEN MAKES FIRST STARTS...

Danny O'Brien has started the last two games in place of an injured **Jamarr Robinson**, playing against FIU (9/25) and Duke (10/2).

- The Kernersville, N.C., native became the first Terp to start at QB since Latrez Harrison on Nov. 20, 1999, and is one of only five freshman QBs to start in Maryland history. O'Brien went 18 of 27 for 250 yards and a pair of touchdowns against FIU, including a 68-yard TD pass to **Torrey Smith**.

- Ken Mastrole was the first freshman in school history to start at quarterback (vs. West Virginia, 9/28/96). Randall Jones was the first true freshman signal-caller to start (vs. Clemson, 10/10/98). Two freshmen started the following season. Calvin McCall, a redshirt freshman, started the season opener at Temple (9/2/99) before giving way to Harrison, a true freshman, in the Florida State game (11/13/99). O'Brien's 250 passing yards are the most by any Maryland freshman in his first start. In fact, he more than doubled the previous best mark (100 by McCall vs. Temple in 1999).

- In his second career start, O'Brien went 9 of 26 for 170 yards and a touchdown, with much of that coming on a 71-yard screen pass to Da'Rel Scott. But the freshmen didn't commit a turnover, and now has gone his first 63 collegiate passes without an interception.

- O'Brien has played in each of the first five games, but saw just one play against Navy (9/6) and West Virginia (9/18). His first significant action came against Morgan State (9/11), when he went 5-of-10 for 79 yards. In that game, O'Brien threw three touchdown passes, all of which came on his first four pass attempts.

- On the season, O'Brien is 32 of 63 for 499 yards, six touchdowns and no interceptions. His 148.76 efficiency rating would rank third in the ACC, but he doesn't have enough attempts to qualify.

WEEKLY AWARDS...

DB **Kenny Tate** and DL **Joe Vellano** picked up individual awards after helping the Terps down Navy, 17-14 (9/6). Tate was voted as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, while Vellano was tabbed the top defensive lineman in the league. It marked the first weekly ACC honor for both players, who were instrumental in Maryland holding Navy to two scores in seven red-zone chances. Tate notched a career-high 12 tackles and also forced a pair of fumbles. Vellano, making his first career start, had 10 tackles, including five solo stops, as well as 3.0

tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Tate was also named the FWAA/Bronco Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and was the Jim Thorpe Award DB of the Week. Tate was added to the 2010 Bronco Nagurski Trophy Watch List. Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Week on Sept. 27 after throwing for 250 yards against FIU, his first-career start.

GETTING BACK ON TRACK...

After an injury-plagued 2009, senior **Da'Rel Scott** appears to be back to the form which made him an All-ACC performer in 2008. A breakaway threat every time he touches the ball, Scott is a three-time member of the Doak Walker Award watch list (2008-10 and two-time member of the Maxwell Award watch list (2009-10). Scott posted the seventh-highest single-season rushing total (1,133) in school history and with just 48 more yards will become the 10th back in school history to reach 2,000 career rushing yards. A broken forearm relegated Scott to seven games last year, but a strong off-season put him in position for a big year, and so far it has paid off, as Maryland's offense has relied heavily on the rushing attack early in the season. The Terps rushed for 261 yards in the season opener against Navy (9/6), with Scott rushing 10 times for 58 yards and a touchdown. Against Morgan State (9/11), the Terps ran for 221 yards as a team, with Scott picking up 42 yards on eight carries. The senior also made three receptions for 31 yards, including a 22-yard touchdown pass from **Danny O'Brien**. After posting just 32 yards rushing and receiving vs. West Virginia (9/18), Scott posted his first 100-yard game of the season vs. FIU (9/25), including a 56-yard TD run. He continued to be a threat in the running and passing games against Duke (10/2), going 71 yards for a TD on a screen pass - the longest play of his career, while also running for 50 yards.

MULTI-FACETED PLAYMAKER...

Torrey Smith has established himself as one of the most explosive playmakers in the nation over the last two-plus seasons. Smith set the ACC single-season record for kickoff return yardage each of the last two years, totaling 1,309 return yards a year ago. He leads the team in receptions (17) and receiving yards (405) and his 81.0 receiving yards per game ranks third in the ACC.

- The junior had at least one touchdown reception during a three-game span - he had two against Morgan State (9/11), two against West Virginia (9/18) and one against FIU (9/25). He became the first Terp to record consecutive games with multiple touchdown receptions since Jermaine Lewis in 1993. His five TD receptions rank second in the ACC.
- Smith's explosive play ability has been evident this season. He has touchdown receptions of 60, 68 and 80 yards and is averaging 20.5 yards every time he touches the ball.
- With 149 yards receiving against West Virginia (9/18) and 159 against FIU (9/25), Smith recorded back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for the second time in his career. The 308 yards was the most by a Terp in a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28).
- Smith has five career 100-yard receiving games,

which ties for fifth all-time in school history.

- Smith is second on Maryland's career all-purpose yards list (4,232) and is one of only two players in school history to reach the 4,000 yard mark. LaMont Jordan holds the school record with 4,960. He is also ninth on both the Terps career receptions list (102) and receiving yards chart (1,565).
- Smith's value to the Terrapins doesn't stop on the field - he is a member of the Terrapin Council, the team's leadership committee, for the second year in a row. "He's a very good receiver, he's a very good leader, he's a very good person," Friedgen said during fall camp. "He's very humble. He's really just a great kid. He has a tremendous work ethic. He's a good student. He's the ideal of low maintenance-high production...his meaning to our team - just his presence alone makes us better. Take away that he's a good football player and everything. His presence in this program, his leadership qualities, his camaraderie, his unselfishness, his ability to communicate with me and all the other kids - he's going to be very successful in life."

SHIFTS ON THE O-LINE..

Maryland was able to build some continuity on the o-line and used the same starting lineup in the first three games. But a season-ending injury to **Justin Gilbert** in the West Virginia game (9/18) caused the Terps to reshuffle the line. **R.J. Dill** moved from right tackle to left tackle and redshirt freshman **Pete DeSouza** stepped in at right tackle. The interior of the line is unchanged; junior **Andrew Gonnella** is at left guard; senior **Paul Pinegar** is at center; and sophomore **Justin Lewis** is at right guard.

- Since allowing eight sacks against the Mountaineers, the line has been solid against the pass rush. The Terps allowed just one sack against FIU (9/25), which entered the game 12th in the nation in that category, and none against Duke (10/2).
- In the season opener the Terps racked up 261 rushing yards (most since 271 vs. Delaware in 2008) on just 34 attempts - an average of 7.7 ypc. **Davin Meggett** had his first career 100-yard game, including a career long 67-yard run, **Jamarr Robinson** ran for 92 yards and **Da'Rel Scott** had 58.
- Against Morgan State (9/11), the Terps had their second consecutive 200-yard rushing game, going for 221. The last time Maryland had back-to-back 200-yard rushing games was 2007, when they had 200 against Wake Forest (9/22) and 239 against Rutgers (9/29) the following week.
- Maryland also totaled 169 yards on the ground against FIU (9/25). Da'Rel Scott had 103 yards and the line helped create holes for two 50-plus-yard plays - Scott had a 56-yard TD and Davin Meggett had a 76-yard TD. The Terps followed that up with another 100-yard performance against Duke (10/2), totaling 124 yards.

MORE THAN A TACKLING MACHINE..

One of the top play-making linebackers in the country, **Alex Wujciak** has proved he can do more than just wrap up opposing ball carriers. Wujciak was a first team All-ACC pick in 2009 after leading the team in tackles (career-high 131) and ranking eighth nationally in that category (10.9 per game). He was a consensus preseason All-ACC pick heading into this season and is on the watch list for five awards - Lombardi Award, Nagurski Trophy, Lott Trophy, Bednarik Award and Butkus Award. He set a new career high with 18 tackles in the season opener against Navy (9/6) and ranks second in the ACC and sixth nationally with a 12.3 tackles-per-game average. But the senior also had a pair of interceptions last season and set the Maryland record for return yards. Wujciak totaled 152 return yards on his two picks which set a single-season school record. Joe Horning had 147 return yards in 1951. Wujciak's return yardage ranked fifth nationally last season and was the most by any linebacker. He had a 70-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. NC State (11/7/09) and had a 82-yarder vs. Florida State (11/21/09) which set up a TD. Over the last 10 games, he's also forced three fumbles and broken up a pair of passes.

DEPTH AND EXPERIENCE AT LINE-BACKER...

One of the strongest units on the team is linebacker with starters **Alex Wujciak** (Mike), **Adrian Moten** (Sam) and **Demetrius Hartsfield** (Will) and key backups **Darin Drakeford** and **David Mackall**.

- Wujciak ranks second in the ACC and 10th nationally with 11.4 tackles per game. Moten ranks fifth in the league in stops (8.2 pg), has one forced fumble and leads the team with three interceptions. Hartsfield, who ranks ninth in the ACC with 7.4 tackles pg, made his first career interception against Morgan State (9/11), returning it 14 yards for a touchdown.

- The trio combined for 42 tackles against Navy (Wujciak 18; Moten and Hartsfield 12 each) and helped stop the Midshipmen from scoring on five of their seven trips to the red zone. Moten had a spectacular play that made highlight reels around the country, jumping over the offensive line as QB Ricky Dobbs snapped the ball at the Maryland 1-yard line to force a fumble that Maryland recovered. Moten also had 1.0 tackle for loss, while Wujciak and Hartsfield had 0.5 each.

- Wujciak is a two-time All-ACC selection and a consensus preseason first team All-ACC pick. He is one of only two players in the nation to post 130 tackles in each of the last two seasons. Moten's 14.5 career sacks and 20.5 tackles for loss are tops on the team. The Terps also have depth behind the starters, although they were dealt a setback with the loss of junior **Ben Pooler** to a knee injury in the preseason. Pooler played in 11 games with five starts last season and was the backup at Will. Sophomore **Ryan Donohue**, Pooler's replacement at Will, had a solid fall camp and recovered a fumble in the game against Navy (9/6). Mackall, a true freshman who tied for the team lead with seven tackles against Morgan State (9/11), is the backup at Mike and Drakeford backs up Moten at Sam.

BOOMING BALTZ...

Travis Baltz has been doing it all for the Terrapins in special teams. An All-ACC selection in 2008 as a punter, Baltz is not only handling punt duties this season, he has also taken over as place-kicker.

- Baltz currently ranks seventh in the ACC and 49th nationally with an average of 41.7 ypp. Of his 30 punts on the season, 13 have been inside the opponents' 20-yard line and five inside the 10. Six have been 50 yards or longer.

- While taking on kicking duties for the first time in his collegiate career, Baltz was 2-for-2 on PATs and made his only field goal attempt in the season opener against Navy (9/6), a 24-yard game winner.

- Against Morgan State (9/11), Baltz kicked two 47-yard field goals and was a perfect 8-for-8 on PATs. In addition to place-kicking and punting duties, the senior had to handle the kickoffs as well in the second half after an injury to **Ted Townsley**. Baltz averaged

60.5 yards on four kickoffs.

- Baltz averaged 45.3 ypp on seven punts against West Virginia (9/18), with a season-long 62-yarder. The senior put four punts inside the opponents 20 and two inside the 10. He also made his only field goal attempt, from 35 yards.

- Baltz has a career average of 41.1 ypp. In 2009 he averaged 40.7 ypp despite battling injuries and in 2008, Baltz averaged 41.1 yards per punt, which ranked first in the ACC and 43rd nationally (FBS).

SECONDARY STEPPING UP...

Maryland's secondary has been solid this season even after losing three of four starters from 2009. The lone returning starter is junior **Cameron Chism**, who moved into a starting role last season after an injury to Nolan Carroll and had a very productive year. Opposite of Chism is junior **Trenton Hughes**, with redshirt freshman **Dexter McDougle** also seeing time at cornerback. **Antwine Perez** and **Kenny Tate** took over the starting safety positions and both have made a big impact.

- The Terps rank second in the ACC and 22nd nationally in pass efficiency defense by holding opposing QBs to a 107.7 rating. A big part of that is due to Maryland's ability to force turnovers - the Terps have seven interceptions and five fumble recoveries, which is third in the ACC.

- Over the first two games, opposing quarterbacks completed just 13 of 38 passes (34 percent), averaged just 3.2 yards per attempt without throwing a touchdown pass. Geno Smith of West Virginia completed 19 of 29 passes for four TDs on Sept. 18, but the Terps secondary picked him off once (Tate) and added another one (Hughes' first career pick) vs. Wes Carroll of FIU (9/25), then had two (Perez, Moten) against Duke (10/2).

- The secondary, led by Tate and Perez, had another solid game against Duke. Despite the Blue Devils gaining 351 yards on 56 attempts through the air, Maryland held them to just 16 points, well below their 30.8 ppg average entering the game.

- In the season opener vs. Navy (9/6), Perez made five tackles and recovered a fumble while Tate had a career-high 12 tackles and two forced fumbles, both of which came when Navy was in the red zone. Tate also stopped Ricky Dobbs on fourth-and-1 from the Maryland 1-yard line with under a minute to play to help preserve the win.

- Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** rolls in a number of secondary players. Sophomore **Eric Franklin**, true freshmen **Matt Robinson** and Desmond Kearse, and junior Austin Walker also rotate in the defensive backfield.

TOUGH LOSSES...

The Terps suffered a couple of difficult losses during the preseason and one early in the regular season. Junior TE **Lansford Watson** injured his knee, had surgery at the end of camp and is out for the season. Watson, who played in 10 games last season, was atop the depth chart at tight end, along with **Devonte Campbell**. In fact, that position was hit hard in August. Campbell (knee), **Will Yeatman** (fractured finger) and **Ryan Schlothauer** (leg) suffered from various ailments. Maryland had another significant loss in the preseason when linebacker **Ben Pooler** also suffered a season-ending knee injury. Pooler, the team's versatile fourth linebacker, had five starts last season when he posted 43 tackles, which was ninth on the squad. **De'Onte Arnett** and **Nick Ferrara** missed the first two games, and Gary Douglas was unavailable for the first three. **Taylor Watson**, who had knee surgery in the spring, returned to action against West Virginia (9/18) as did Yeatman. The Terps had a significant loss against WVU as starting left tackle **Justin Gilbert** suffered a torn ACL in his left knee and is out for the season. **Jamarr Robinson** (shoulder) also missed the start against FIU (9/25) and against Duke (10/2), though he was available as an emergency replacement against the Blue Devils. The Terps lost another tight end against Duke as **Dave Stinebaugh**, who had increased playing over the first five games, injured his knee and is out of action up to six weeks.

CAREER DAY VS. NAVY...

There were a number of Maryland players who posted career high numbers against Navy (9/6):

- Junior DB **Kenny Tate** recorded career highs in tackles (12), solo stops (9) and forced fumbles (2). His previous high in tackles was eight (vs. N.C. State 11/7/09).
- Senior LB **Alex Wujciak** posted a career-best 18 tackles (previous best: 17 vs. Rutgers, 9/26/09).
- Seeing his first extensive action, sophomore **Joe Vellano** recorded career highs in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3.0) and sacks (2.0). Vellano had just one career tackle before that game.
- Senior DE **Drew Gloster** had a career-high seven tackles (previous best: three vs. NC State 11/7/09).
- Sophomore LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** finished with a then career-best 12 tackles. He improved on that production with 13 stops vs. FIU (9/25).
- Sophomore DL **Justin Anderson** posted a career-high five tackles and his first forced fumble.
- **Davin Meggett's** 67-yard scamper in the first quarter was the longest run of the junior's career. It was also Maryland's longest run since Darrius Heyward-Bey went 76 yards vs. Clemson (9/27/08). Meggett totaled 105 yards in the game on just eight carries, the first 100-yard game of his career. Meggett went on eclipse that rush with a 76-yard TD against FIU (9/25).

MORGAN STATE MILESTONES...

Maryland downed Morgan State, 62-3, on 9/11 and there were a number of highlights in the game:

- The 85 yards in total offense allowed by Maryland against Morgan State are the fewest in the Friedgen era. Maryland has now had seven games since 2001 in which they have allowed less than 200 yards (see chart on pg. 5). The most recent was 187 by Villanova in 2007, with the fewest previously allowed being 124 against Eastern Michigan in 2001.
- Morgan State rushed for 37 yards, the lowest total by a Maryland foe since Duke had 23 last season.
- Maryland's 17-point first quarter against Morgan State marked the most points in the opening 15:00 since the Terps scored 24 on 9/13/03 at home vs. The Citadel.
- Maryland's 45 points in the first half tied for the most in the Friedgen era. The Terps took a 45-21 halftime lead over North Carolina on 11/1/03 en route to a 59-21 home victory. It is the fourth time Maryland scored 40 in a half in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 28-point second quarter marked the most points since it had an ACC-record 39 in the second period against UNC in that 2003 game.
- The last time Maryland scored 50 or more in a game before Saturday was 9/20/08 when the Terps beat Eastern Michigan 51-24. The last time Maryland

scored 60 in a game was a 61-0 win over The Citadel on 9/13/03. The 62 points mark the most by the Terrapins in the Friedgen era and is the sixth-highest total in school history (see list on pg. 5). It is the seventh time Maryland has scored 50 points or more in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 62 points were the most since a 62-24 win over Virginia on 11/22/75. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since that 61-0 win over The Citadel.

GOAL-LINE STAND...

The Terps had four key goal-line stands against Navy (9/6) which allowed them to come away with a 17-14 win:

- With Navy at the Maryland 1-yard line halfway through the second quarter, **Adrian Moten** leapt over the offensive line and forced a Ricky Dobbs fumble that **Antwine Perez** recovered.
- After Maryland went three-and-out, the Midshipmen again threatened to score as they drove the Maryland seven. But Perez stopped Dobbs at the 2 on third down and time expired in the first half.
- The Terps had another big stop in the second half. After Navy went on a 13-play, 59-yard drive to get to the 1, **Kenny Tate** forced a fumble by Dobbs that Maryland linebacker **Ryan Donohue** recovered.
- Maryland came through with its biggest stop on a Navy fourth-and-goal from the 1 with just 0:37 to play. Tate smashed through the line and tackled Dobbs.

TURNING RED...

The Maryland defense came up with the big stop time and again in the 17-14 win over Navy (9/6). The Midshipmen ran 82 plays and held the ball for close to 40 minutes, but when they got within scoring range, the Terps defense stiffened. Navy ran 32 plays in the red zone, but were only able to come away with points just twice in seven trips. Navy missed a 32-yard field goal on its first possession of the game, but went inside the Maryland 5-yard line on four trips without scoring. The Terps forced two fumbles, stopped a Navy drive at the end of the first half and had a goal-line stand in the final minute of the game to secure the win.

TERPS ADD FLORIDA TRANSFER...

One of the most highly sought-after players in the 2010 recruiting class has joined the Terps. **Adrian Coxson**, a transfer from the University of Florida, began practicing with the team last week. Coxson will sit out this season and be eligible to play in 2011. The Baltimore native is looking forward to getting back on the field. "It's close to home and it's a good program with great coaches," Coxson said of his decision to come to Maryland. "I believe Maryland is really on the rise and I think we're going to have a great season." A four-star prospect who was rated the No. 19 wide

TERRAPIN SPORTS RADIO NETWORK

All of Maryland's football games will be broadcast live on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network, which boasts one of the strongest coverage areas in college sports. Terrapin Sports Marketing (TSM), a division of CBS Collegiate Sports Properties, manages the radio network. In its ninth year as the multi-media marketing rights partner for University of Maryland Athletics, Terrapin Sports Marketing has built a stronger network that provides coverage in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, and Washington, D.C.

WJZ-FM 105.7 and WJZ-AM 1300 in Baltimore serve as network's flagship stations, with 13 more affiliates across the state picking up the games.

In July 2010, ESPN980 became the home for Terps football in Washington, D.C. All games will be "triplecast" throughout the D.C. metropolitan area, suburban Maryland, and Northern Virginia on 980-AM (WTEM), 92.7FM (WWXT) and 94.3FM (WWXX).

receiver in the nation according to Scout.com and the seventh-best player in the state of Maryland by Rivals.com, Coxson had over 1,280 yards rushing with 11 touchdowns and 650 yards passing and eight touchdowns as a wildcat quarterback in 2009. Coxson averaged 12.08 yards per carry as a senior and had more than 200 rushing yards in four games. He finished his junior season with 40 catches for 987 yards and 12 touchdowns. Coxson was a 2009 *Baltimore Sun* first team All-Metro selection and a second team All-Metro pick in 2008.

MARYLAND-WVU EXTEND SERIES...

Maryland and West Virginia will continue their football rivalry until at least 2017 as the schools agreed to extend the series by four years just before their meeting this season. The upcoming series is as follows:

Maryland and West Virginia have met 47 times (WVU leads 24-21-2), including each season from 1980 to 2007. After a two-year hiatus (2008-09) in the series, the schools agreed to a pair of home-and-home tilts (2010-11) and then tacked on two more years (2012-13) in 2009.

MARYLAND-TEXAS AGREE TO TWO-YEAR DEAL...

Maryland and Texas agreed to a two-year home-and-home football series on Sept. 27. Maryland will travel to Austin, Texas, on Sept. 2, 2017 for a game with the Longhorns. Texas will make the return trip to Maryland on Sept. 1, 2018. That game will be played at FedExField in Landover, Md., home of the Washington Redskins. Both games will be season openers. Texas has won all three previous meetings, though the teams have not met since the 1978 Sun Bowl.

TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...

The Touchdown Club of Annapolis presented the Crab Bowl Trophy to Maryland after its victory over Navy (9/6). The trophy will be presented for all subsequent meetings. The Touchdown Club of Annapolis, founded in 1954, has an extensive history with both Navy and Maryland, honoring both teams at its annual banquet. Commissioned by the club with underwriting from the D'Camera Group, the Crab Bowl is a large pewter bowl overflowing with pewter replicas of the Chesapeake Bay blue crab. The Crab Bowl sits atop an ebony-colored mahogany base that is engraved with the results of previous Maryland-Navy games.

TERPS OWN NATION'S LONGEST STREAK...

• During the last nine seasons, Maryland has had three full-time punters (Brooks Barnard, Adam Podlesh, and **Travis Baltz**), three long snappers (Jon Condo, Andrew Schmitt and **Tim Downs**) and zero blocked punts. In fact, since the Wake Forest game on 10/9/99, only four players (Barnard, Podlesh,

Baltz, **Nick Ferrara**) have started at punter. Downs made his debut last season, replacing Schmitt, a four-year starter at the position. However, with Baltz shelved with an injury, Ferrara took over punting duties for five games. In addition, **Ted Townsley** had one punt in the game against Rutgers (9/26/09).

• The Terrapins' streak without a blocked punt goes back 127 games, the longest streak in college football. The team has kept that streak intact under second-year special teams coordinator **Charles Banks**.

• The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State game (11/13/99). That amount of time became the longest in NCAA football when Georgia had a punt blocked by Ole Miss in 2006, snapping a streak which began earlier in the 1999 season.

TERPS AND THE NFL DRAFT...

• There are currently 30 players on NFL rosters (see list on pg. 22), including 27 who are active (three on practice squads). The 27 active players on rosters rank tied for second among ACC schools. Miami has 42 players active in the NFL and Florida State has 27.

• There have been 24 Terps drafted during **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure as head coach. There have also been 57 players either drafted or signed as free agents over the last seven seasons.

• Maryland had two players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft - OT Bruce Campbell (Oakland, fourth round) and Nolan Carroll (Miami, fifth round) - and five players selected the year before (WR Darrius Heyward-Bey, CB Kevin Barnes, LB Moise Fokou, OL Jaimie Thomas, and TE Dan Gronkowski), which was the most since 2004 when the Terps also had five players chosen. The five selections were also the most for an ACC school in 2009.

• The Terps have had at least two players selected in seven of the last nine drafts.

• The Terrapins have had 15 players chosen in the first round of the NFL Draft, including two Top-10 picks in the last five years. Darrius Heyward-Bey was taken seventh overall in 2009 (Oakland Raiders) and Vernon Davis was selected sixth in 2006 (San Francisco 49ers).

TERRAPINS RISING AIRS FOR FOURTH YEAR...

The fourth season of 'Terrapins Rising' aired this summer. The eight-episode reality series, which chronicles the Maryland football program, was shown locally on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and around the country. Each 30-minute show gives a behind-the-scenes look at the inner workings of a major college football program. This season's series followed head coach **Ralph Friedgen** and his staff as they prepared the Terps for the 2010 campaign. Each episode of the show featured in-depth player

and coach profiles, as well as footage of heated position battles from spring practice and off-season workouts. A film crew, led by former University of Maryland and Washington Redskins place-kicker Jess Atkinson, followed the team both on and off the field. The crew also sits in on team and positional meetings. 'Terrapins Rising' is the result of a partnership between Maryland Athletics, Comcast SportsNet, Under Armour and Atkinson & Co.

FRIEDGEN AND THE TERPS ON THE AIR...

Maryland's football broadcasting lineup for 2010 includes the Ralph Friedgen Radio Show and the Ralph Friedgen Television Show. The Ralph Friedgen Radio Show airs from 8-9 p.m. each Wednesday during the season on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network which has 15 affiliates (see chart on pg. 9 for affiliates). The Ralph Friedgen Television Show, which is presented by Outback Steakhouse, airs weekly at 11:30 a.m. Saturday on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic with the first show airing this weekend. The fast-paced, 30-minute show goes behind the scenes with Friedgen and the Maryland football team. Replays of the show are scheduled for 7 p.m. Sunday on Comcast SportsNet, just prior to the rebroadcast of the Terps most recent football game. Comcast SportsNet will carry the official rebroadcasts of all 12 University of Maryland football matchups. Friedgen also appears each Wednesday during the season on Comcast's SportsNite wrap-up show. Comcast goes live "Inside the Coach's Office" with Friedgen at 6:45 p.m. each Wednesday.

TERP HIGHLIGHTS UNDER FRIEDGEN

- Friedgen has a 70-47 record in nine-plus years, including the first back-to-back-to-back 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003).
- The consensus national coach of the year in 2001 when he led Maryland to its first ACC title in 16 years, Friedgen has guided the Terrapins to six bowl game appearances, including a school-record four postseason wins. He is one of seven coaches in ACC history with four or more bowl wins and one of 11 with six or more bowl game appearances. He became the 13th coach in ACC history to amass 70 wins with the victory over Duke (10/2/10).
- Friedgen's 70 wins are more than the Terps had (60) in the 15 years prior to his arrival. The victory total ranks fourth in school history, as does his winning percentage (.595).
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's nine years as head coach.
- Maryland was among the best in 2008 playing ranked opponents. The Terps went 4-1 vs. ranked foes (AP poll) with wins vs. No. 23 Cal, No. 20 Clemson, No. 21 Wake Forest and No. 17 UNC. The Terps were one of only five teams in the nation (also Florida, Oklahoma, USC and Texas) to beat at least four top 25 teams. The other four all finished in the top five of the final polls.
- During 2007, the Terps defeated two top 10 teams (No. 10 Rutgers, No. 8 Boston College). The Terps had never beaten two Top 10 teams in the same season. They were also one of only four teams in the nation (LSU, Kentucky and Illinois) to accomplish that feat in 2007.
- The Terps posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins (2003, 04, 06), culminating with a 24-7 triumph over Purdue in the 2006 Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps have out-scored their last five bowl foes by a 151-83 margin.
- Maryland posted a school record-tying 11-victory season in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many games.
- Maryland was joined by only four other Division I-A schools - Miami (Fla.), Oklahoma, Texas and Washington State - to have won as many as 10 games in the 2001, 2002 and 2003 seasons.
- A Top 20 final ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03). Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls, and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the ESPN/USA Today poll and 11th in the AP. It was the program's best three-year final rankings since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).
- After seven years as the Terps' head coach, Friedgen ranked the third-most successful seventh-year coach in ACC history, with his 56-31 mark eclipsing those of league mentors Dick Sheridan, Tommy Bowden, Bill Dooley and Mack Brown.
- He is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby

Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.

- In his first four years, Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifth-year coach.
- Bowl appearances in six of his nine seasons, including dominating wins in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7 over West Virginia) and a 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl victory over perennial national power Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in the two major preseason polls). The Terrapins also earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001 campaign.
- Friedgen led the Terps to the 2001 ACC title when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright league title since the Seminoles joined the conference.
- By winning the 2001 ACC title, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- 42 wins in 59 games at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005 and 51,263 in 2007.
- Three of the last nine ACC Defensive Players of the Year.
- 53 national television appearances, including a school-record eight showings in 2002. The Terrapins played on national television or ABC regional six times in 2005, 2006 and 2007, eight times in 2008, and once in 2009.
- The program's first major national award winner since 1974 in linebacker E.J. Henderson, a two-time consensus first team All-American who was named the winner of the Dick Butkus Award (nation's outstanding linebacker) and the Chuck Bednarik Trophy (nation's outstanding defensive player) in 2002.
- Back-to-back school records in number of first team All-ACC performers in 2001 (7) and 2002 (8), and an ACC-best 13 overall all-league honors in 2001 and nine in 2008.
- A league-best 14 representatives on the Academic All-ACC teams during a two-year span (eight in 2008; six in 2007).
- 33 weeks in at least one of the country's two major Top 25 polls, including a streak of seven consecutive weeks at the start of the 2004 season.
- The only consensus national coach of the year award (2001) in Maryland football history. He was one of 20 coaches around the nation on the watch list for the 2008 Paul 'Bear' Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- 22 of the top 29 all-time largest crowds at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium have come since 2001.
- Back-to-back school scoring records (2001 and 2002) and a two-year team scoring average of more than 33 points per game in those seasons.
- A NCAA-low four passing touchdowns allowed in 2005.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Redshirt freshman quarterback Danny O'Brien threw for 250 yards and two touchdowns, and the Terrapins got an 85-yard punt return from Tony Logan in a 42-28 victory over winless FIU.

O'Brien completed 18 of 27 passes despite being bothered by a high ankle sprain for two weeks. His backup was Logan, a wide receiver, because junior Jamarr Robinson couldn't even lift his arm before the game.

O'Brien brought the Terps back from an early 7-0 deficit and directed two long scoring drives after FIU pulled into a tie at 21.

Da'Rel Scott ran for 103 yards and two touchdowns for the Terrapins (3-1), who have already exceeded their win total of last year. Torrey Smith had eight catches for 159 yards and a score.

Wes Carroll went 35 for 58 for 355 yards for FIU (0-3). He threw two TD passes but was intercepted twice.

FIU amassed 472 yards on a whopping 98 snaps, but the Terrapins made the big plays when it counted most.

After the Panthers got within a touchdown with 4:16 left, Maryland's Davin Meggett ran for a 76-yard touchdown on the next play from scrimmage to clinch the victory.

Down 21-14 at halftime, FIU got a 5-yard touchdown pass from Carroll to Jonathan Faucher with 5:34 left in the third quarter.

After the kickoff, a pass interference call wiped out a third-down incompletion. On the next play, O'Brien lofted a 68-yard touchdown pass to Smith to put the Terrapins on top to stay.

A 9-yard run by Scott made it 35-21, and FIU subsequently missed two chances to get within a touchdown after getting inside the Maryland 11.

Maryland 21, Duke 16

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland was in desperate need of a big play when Tony Logan wrapped his arms around a punt at his own 16-yard line.

Eight-four yards later, the Terrapins had their first lead against Duke.

Logan's electrifying punt return in the third quarter provided Maryland with the push it needed, and the Terrapins opened the ACC portion of their schedule with a 21-16 victory.

Maryland (4-1, 1-0) trailed 9-0 midway in the second quarter and 9-7 at halftime before coming back. Logan's touchdown made it 14-9, and the Terps held on.

Logan sidestepped a potential tackler immediately after catching the punt. He then headed upfield, juked to his left and then cut right at his own 25 before sprinting down the sideline to the end zone. It was Logan's second punt return for a score in two weeks.

Duke (1-4, 0-2) lost for the fourth-straight time. Sophomore Sean Renfree completed 28 of 56 passes for 351 yards and a touchdown, but he was intercepted twice.

Donovan Varner had eight catches for 128 yards, and Conner Vernon gained 99 yards on six receptions.

A 2-yard touchdown pass from Renfree to Brandon King made it 21-16 with 7:20 to go, and after a Maryland punt the Blue Devils moved from their own 19 to the Maryland 39 with two minutes left. Facing a fourth-and-15, Renfree threw a pass to Austin Kelly that was tipped away.

Duke has been tormented this season by too many turnovers and the Terrapins got their first touchdown late in the first half following an interception, and in the second half Logan and Scott scored on long plays.

But the Duke defense - which was allowing 44.5 points per game - made it tough on O'Brien, who was playing in place of injured starter Jamarr Robinson for a second straight week. O'Brien went 9 for 26 for 170 yards, including his TD pass to Scott.

Davin Meggett capped off an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 3-yard TD plunge which cut Duke's lead to 9-7 with under two minutes left in the first half.

Will Snyderwine kicked three first-half field goals when the Maryland defense stiffened in the red zone three times.
