Holiday Workshop instructions:

- 1. Register by calling the 4-H office or returning the enclosed registration form by Friday, November 22nd.
- 2. Have your club decide on a small holiday craft item to sell and demonstrate. Small kits (containing all craft supplies and instructions) must be available so participants can make the item being demonstrated. Craft items should cost between \$.50 and \$2.00. Items in this price range seem to sell very well. Clubs may sell craft items over \$2.00 as long as they have at least one \$.50 to \$2.00 item. The more expensive item may be ready made or available as a kit.
- 3. Clubs may also sell holiday gift items such as candy, cookies, or holiday breads. These items must be packaged as a gift. Snacks can not be sold at individual tables.

4. Clubs should bring two dozen holiday cookies to donate to the refreshment table. Cookies and punch are then sold

for a nominal fee. Money earned pays for the punch. Remember clubs may not sell snacks at their tables.

5. There will be a tree set-up to decorate the auditorium. Clubs are asked to donate an



ornament for the tree. All completed crafts will be sold at your club table.

- 6. Clubs must be completely set-up by 7:00 p.m.
- 7. Clubs must bring their own change.
