	TRAVEL AND BEHAVIOR CONTRACT

A successful trip is directly related to the behavior of its participants. Safety is threatened if established rules are not followed. Please read and discuss the following rules and consequences with your child.

Behavior/Discipline Expectations at School Before the Trip

- 1. If a student is suspended out of school for any reason, the student will not be allowed to attend the trip.
- 2. If a student receives more than three full days in the Recovery Room/Behavior Intervention Program, the student will not go on the trip. Any partial days assigned by the administrator will be totaled and included as part of the three full days.
- 3. If a student receives a referral for smoking, drugs, alcohol, weapons, stealing, or fighting or is found with the afore mentioned paraphernalia, the student will not be allowed to go on the trip.
- 4. Any student who owes outstanding fines for textbooks, library books, shirts, belts, etc. must settle these before leaving on the trip.
- 5. All students must have completed all components of PASS testing.

THESE STANDARDS APPLY BEGINNING October 5, 2009

Rules for the trip

1. All school rules will be followed while on the trip.

Modified Dress Code:

- Shirts must remain collared and sleeved, but may be of any color, pattern, or design.
- Shorts, pants, and skirts must follow school dress code.
- Denim shorts and pants are permissible, and must be size appropriate, fitting at the waist.
- 2. Students will pay for any property damages they are responsible for.
- 3. Students will not leave the hotel or tour sites without permission.
- 4. Students will not enter the hotel rooms of ANY other students.
- 5. Students will obey hotel and tour site rules.
- 6. Students will comply with curfew time.
- 7. Students will use the buddy system at all times.
- 8. Students will show respect for others.
- 9. Students will not use abusive language.
- 10. No laser pointers are allowed in Washington D.C.
- 11. Students will report to assigned areas at scheduled times.
- 12. Students are responsible for their personal items and valuables at all times. **The school is not responsible for any items lost or stolen.** There is no time to investigate theft
- 13. Students will adhere to all school and district policies not listed above.

Consequences for Breaking School Rules

- 1. Student must remain with a chaperone at all times.
- 2. Student is restricted from evening activities.
- 3. Student will be assigned duties, such as loading and unloading luggage.
- 4. Student given earlier curfew.
- 5. Student given detentions, suspension, AWARE, etc. to be served upon return to school.
- 6. Student sent home at parents' expense.
