<u>Instructions</u>: Make a timeline of Henrico County history. You will list at least 10 important dates and events that are important to Henrico County history in the correct order. Each event will list the date and 2-3 sentences describing the event. Include a picture or illustration with all events. Your timeline must include: settlement, relationship with Indians, Nathaniel Bacon, "The Golden Age," American Revolution, Civil War (no battles, separate assignment), Reconstruction, 20<sup>th</sup> century, World War I, World War II.

Ten different historical events pertaining to Henrico County are clearly identified on the timeline. Each event is in the correct chronological order on the timeline, and the date listed is correct. Each event and its impact or effect is described in at least 2-3 complete sentences in the student's own words. Text may be printed out and pasted or hand-written very neatly and boldly. Color pictures (hand drawn or printed from an acceptable internet source) are included, at least one for each date.		50

<b>Option: Traveling Museum Exhibit</b>

<u>Instructions:</u> Create a museum exhibit of 6 to 8 artifacts that show important pieces of Henrico's history. Each artifact is a student-made replica. At least 3 artifacts should be three-dimensional objects. The remaining items may be illustrations. For each item in the exhibit you must complete a corresponding index card, which identifies the item in complete sentences and describes how it "shows" an important piece of Henrico history. Keep in mind that this exhibit will travel to other parts of the country where people have not heard of Henrico County, so your explanations must be thorough.

How the item relates to Henrico County history is also explained in a complete sentence on the index card. Text may be printed out and pasted or hand-written very neatly and boldly. Explanations are written for someone who knows nothing about Henrico County.		40
The writing is clear, legible, and neat. Correct grammar and spelling are used.		15
The artifacts show effort, creativity, and ingenuity; are clearly identifiable and show effort and skill in production.		15

You will report from each of the battles, identifying its date(s), relative location, key leaders, important facts and the outcome. Use outline on page 15 in booklet to guide you. **You must show the teacher a written script before taping or performing**. <u>Commercials should NOT be included</u>. If you are performing the program "live" it may not exceed ten minutes. If you are taping the program ahead of time, it should be about five to eight minutes.
