Birth to Three News

No home visits: October 13-19



The Birth to Three program follows a calendar which is different from the school District calendar of September to June. This calendar involves "stretching" out the 10 month school year over 12 months. As a result, there will be some weeks during the regular school year when the Birth to Three staff will not be making home visits. Families are provided with a calendar that indicates the weeks that Birth to Three services will be provided over the 12 month period.

What to bring to school?

Your child should bring a backpack to school for carrying their school papers and projects. Comfortable play clothes and tennis shoes are best for school, which the child can manage independently. Please send a change of clothes, and diapers/pull-ups and wipes, if needed. Remember to label your child's belongings

School supply list: Families are asked to contribute school supplies to your child's classroom, such as: thicker crayons, washable markers, glue sticks, watercolor paints, Kleenex. This is an optional contribution, but will help with our school budget.



ECSE teachers are responsible for setting up transportation for your child. Please be sure to inform your child's teacher of any changes you need to make regarding your child's bus schedule. The teacher will complete the necessary paperwork to let both the bus company and the ECSE office know your transportation needs. Changes can take up to one week.

In Case of Emergency....

It is extremely important that we have current numbers on file for your child in the event that he or she becomes sick while at school. Please let your child's teacher or your school nurse know of any updates to home phone numbers, cell phone numbers, or emergency contact information so that we may reach you in a timely manner when your child needs you.

Early Childhood Preschool Screening

Students enrolled in Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) are NOT required to go through the preschool/kindergarten screening process. All areas of your child's development are assessed and monitored by his/her education team, including health screenings for: vision, hearing, height, and weight. These screenings are completed *at least once* before your child enters kindergarten.

In addition, students may also receive hearing or vision screenings upon request from their parents/guardians or at the request of a teacher, if the teacher suspects that there may be a hearing or vision concern that is affecting the student's ability to learn.

If your child fails any part of the hearing or vision screening, the health office will re-screen the child within four weeks to verify the results. If the student fails the second screening, a letter will be sent home with the student outlining the findings and recommendation for follow-up with a physician.

If at any time you question your child's hearing, vision, height or weight, feel free to contact the health office at 952-895-6613.

Visitors welcome - please sign in!

Adult visitors and volunteers are always welcome at school. Visitors must make arrangements with the teacher and building principal prior to the visit. All visitors and volunteers must check- in at the front desk upon entering the building. Each visitor/volunteer will be given a badge or sticker that allows access to the building.

Pick up and drop off in the lobby please - for a smooth transition!

For those parents who are driving their child to school, please wait in the lobby for the teacher to come get your child. The teachers are very busy setting up their classrooms and escorting children to and from the bus. In addition, some of our young children are sensitive to changes in their routine. If you need to confer with your child's teacher, please let her know and she will be happy to call you or arrange a time to meet - when it is not as hectic as by the front doors.

Parent Education Classes for parents with children newborn to age 5.

Early Childhood Special education is excited to provide our families with Ready for Kindergarten at our location with all Special Education Staff teaching the classes as well as Special Education Staff providing childcare. **Parent can attend any group that matches their child's developmental stage regardless of age.** Please feel free to talk with your child's teacher on the best age group to attend.

If you have more than one child, a caregiver (parent, grandparent, relative, friend, etc) must attend a session for each child in order to receive the materials. Feel free to attend sessions for your children who are not in ECSE.

This program provides parents the opportunity to impact the lively early-learning years before a child enters school, time which lays the foundation for all future learning.

READY! teaches parents how to "play with purpose," which builds strong minds and relationships.

Parents learn activities and receive materials to make learning at home fun and effective. Parents should plan to attend one class per season (three for the year), based on the age of their child. Each class builds on the other, encouraging children's skills in literacy, math and reasoning, and social/emotional development, with age-appropriate tools and toys for parents to take home to engage in purposeful play with their children.

Classes are free to families in ISD 191. Child care is provided for pre-registered children (newborn babies to 12 months are welcome at class with parents).
