Repeat "For your area, how would you rate..." and "Use any number from 1 to 5 where 1 means "Poor" and 5 means "Excellent" for first 2 randomly presented items in the list, then with the 8<sup>th</sup> randomly presented item. After the 7<sup>th</sup> randomly presented item, insert the reminder: "Again, thinking of the area within about a half hour drive of where you live." Have "Don't Know" as a possible response category but don't ask]
