U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT - BEST PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS:

In their annual survey of public schools, U.S. News and World Report magazine has awarded Duxbury High School a gold medal. The organization evaluated nearly 22,000 public high schools in 49 states and the District of Columbia. Schools were awarded gold, silver, or bronze medals based on state proficiency standards, how well they prepare students for college, and other factors. Based on these factors, Duxbury High School came in 272nd in the country and 13th in the state of Massachusetts. This is a significant 'feather in the cap' for our students, faculty and staff, parents, and for the community. Congratulations!

Each of these students is among the 50,000 highest scoring participants out of 1.5 million entrants who took the PSAT/NMSQT and were invited to participate as a result of their high performance on that assessment.

REMINDER:

This is a reminder that the deadline for entering your essay in Duxbury's 375th essay contest is Friday, May 11th. The contest is open to all Duxbury students, grades 2 through 12, (regardless of where they attend school). The theme, *What Makes Duxbury Unique to Me*, will be judged on 1.) Originality 2.) Standard English conventions 3.) Topic development 4.) Organization and 5.) Rich language/word choice, and should not exceed 750 words. The decision of the judges is final. (No essays will be accepted after May 11, 2012). An application form must be submitted with the essay and may be picked up at the Town Hall, the Duxbury Library, The Duxbury Clipper office, Duxbury Mortgage Company in Halls Corner or from our website www.duxbury375.com. Four winners (one from each grade level group) in grade 2, grades 3-5, grades 6-8, and grades 9-12, will be awarded cash prizes: grade 2: \$50.00, grades 3, 4, & 5: \$50.00, grades 6, 7, & 8: \$75.00, grades 9~12: \$100.00. In addition, the winners will receive certificates and ribboned medals and will be recognized during the town-wide celebration on Sunday, June 17, 2012 on the Town Green. Registration for 2012 -2013 Bus Transportation is open!

Parents may now register their children for bus transportation for the 2012 – 2013 school year. Please be aware of the following changes: First Student has requested that rider information be provided to them by the Business Office by June 30, 2012 in order to create efficient bus routes and assign students to buses to avoid overcrowding. First Student is utilizing new software for this process.

In an effort to meet this deadline, the Business Office has automatically registered all current students (including students not previously registered for the bus) who will be in grades 1-6 in 2012-2013 that do not owe the transportation fee because their primary home address exceeds the 2-mile criteria.

Please register your child(ren) for which a fee is due before June 30, 2012. This would be children in grades K-6 whose primary home address is within 2-miles shortest driving distance to Chandler School or Alden School and all students in grades 7-12. Please refer to the current Street Listing for 2012-2013 on our website. The fee remains unchanged from last year. It is \$250/student with a \$500 family cap if payment is received by June 15^{th} . From June 16^{th} on, the fee is \$270/student with a family cap of \$540.

Bus transportation information, printable application packets, online registration and payment are located at www.duxbury.k12.ma.us. Click on "District Services" and then choose "Transportation Services". There is extensive information on our website to answer any questions you may have.

Please notify the Business Office if you have recently moved to ensure that we have the correct address on file for your family.

Bus passes will be printed and mailed in August. Any inquiries regarding the bus should be made to bus@duxbury.k12.ma.us.
