## Unusual Circumstances (please circle the circumstance for which you are applying)

The Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, outlines what may constitute unusual circumstances, including the following:

- 1. You, your spouse and/or your parent's earnings have changed significantly from the previous year due to unemployment.
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement outlining your employment history and describing the reduction in income for the person(s) affected.
  - Provide a copy of the last pay-stub you received from your previous employer.
  - Provide documentation of unemployment benefits.
  - Provide documentation from employer of reduction of hours, layoff or termination. (lay-off notice)
- 2. You, your spouse and/or your parents received one-time income and it was included on your 2014 federal income taxes. (Examples might include lottery winnings, inheritance, moving expense reimbursements, etc.)
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing the unusual circumstance/situation.
  - List the amount received in 2014, the source of that income and who received it.
  - Provide documentation of <u>how the funds were spent or invested</u>.
- 3. You, your spouse and/or your parents contribute financial support to persons who are unable to adequately support themselves. (Examples might include parents in nursing care facilities and adult children who are unemployed and living at home, grandchildren living with you, etc.)
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing the unusual circumstance/situation.
  - Provide name, age and relationship of supported relative(s).
  - Provide an itemized list of expenses paid in 2014 on behalf of the listed relative(s).
- 4. You, your spouse and/or your parents incurred medical or funeral expenses not covered by insurance.
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing the unusual circumstance/situation.
  - Provide copies of canceled checks or statements of account to confirm amounts paid in 2014.
  - Provide Schedule A from your 2014 federal income tax return, if completed.
- 5. <u>Dependent students only:</u> your parents were separated or divorced after completing the federal tax return.
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing the unusual circumstance/situation.
  - Indicate when divorce or separation occurred (court document required).
  - Indicate conditions of divorce/separation. If children are involved, indicate where they will be living and if child support will be paid.
- 6. Dependent student only: one or both of your parents are attending college.
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing your parents' enrollment expectations for the 2015-2016 year.
  - Provide documentation that supports your parents' enrollment in college for 2015-2016.
- 7. Other unique or exceptional circumstance not listed above.
  - Provide a signed and detailed personal statement describing the unusual circumstance/situation.
  - Provide any documentation that supports your circumstance.
