MATERIALS:

- Pencils (mechanical pencils preferred, but wooden pencils are OK) or BLACK/BLUE pens (no other colors are accepted)

ATTENDANCE:

You are expected to attend class daily and to be punctual (in your seat ready to work at the start of class). Attendance is taken daily. It is your responsibility to get all the information and clarification you need to turn your work in on time. Work missed due to an Excused Absence may be made up for credit (see Late Work policy below). If you are absent the day of a test, or quiz, you are expected to make arrangements for making up the assessment as soon as possible after you return to school.

LATE WORK:

Due dates for assignments missed due to an <u>excused</u> absence are extended two days per absence as written in school and district policy. Assignments more than one week late will be accepted for teacher feedback but no credit.

Each quarter grade will be calculated as follows:

- 25% = Process grades (homework, warm-ups, classwork, etc.)
- 75% = Product grades (tests, quizzes, projects)

- 60% 69% = D
- < 60% = F

NOTE: Extra credit is not allowed as per the district policy.
