The Skinny on Taking a Leave of Absence

"Help!! I need to take a Leave of Absence from the League. What do I do?"

I regularly get this question. While the League offers us all an opportunity to volunteer and enjoy the company and friendship of other members, life sometimes demands a break. Here are the most common questions (and answers!) regarding taking a Leave of Absence (LOA):

Q: When am I eligible for a LOA?

A: LOAs are granted to those members in good standing, who have been Active for a minimum of three years.

Q: Do I have to give a reason for requesting my LOA?

A: If you meet the above criteria of being in good standing and being Active for a minimum of three years, you do not have to give a reason for your LOA request.

Q: How long does my LOA last?

A: LOAs are granted for a maximum of one calendar year's time. You do not have to take an entire year's absence if you do not need/want to.

Q: What time requirements am I responsible for while on LOA?

A: You are not responsible for any time requirements while on LOA.

Q: What monetary requirements am I responsible for while on LOA?

A: You are responsible for annual dues while on LOA. You are not responsible for fund development credit or fundraiser ticket sales.

Q: What do I do if I'm not eligible for a LOA?

A: If you do not meet the minimum three-year Active requirement, you can submit a special request for a LOA to the Board of Directors (BOD). These requests are reviewed at the monthly BOD meeting, and either approved or denied.

Q: How do I request a LOA? Is there any paperwork to complete for my request?

A: LOAs must be requested in writing. An email to your friendly Corresponding Secretary is sufficient. We created a LOA request form last year, for requesting special circumstance LOAs (those prior to meeting the three year Active mark). This Word document will eventually be available for download from the website. Until then, you can request this form from the Office Manager or me.

Q. How do I get back into the League activities?

A: Approximately one month prior to the end of your LOA, you should receive an email or phone call from your Membership Advisor. They will assist you in placement and rejoining League activities. If you do not receive contact from anyone, simply call or email the Office Manager and she will put you in touch with the right person.

Q: What if I don't meet the three-year requirement, don't get approval from the BOD, but still need to take some time away from the League?

A: We understand that this is sometimes the case. If you fall into this category, you can resign from the League and reinstate at a later date. If you resign in good standing, reinstating with the League only requires a \$25 rejoining fee and current year's dues.


