	Review transcript and activities. Make sure you are on track to graduate and are building a transcript that colleges are looking for.
	Register with NCAA Clearinghouse if you plan to play college sports.
	Register for the SAT and/or ACT if necessary. (If you miss the fall testing date, your next testing date may be too late to send scores to your college choices.)
	Complete Request for Recommendation Packets (available from the secondary office).
	Prepare to attend college visits and college fairs if needed.
	Narrow your college choices to a few schools and begin the application process. Make note of their admissions policies, requirements, and deadlines.
	For applications, you may be able to utilize www.applytexas.org (Texas Public Universities) or www.commonapp.org (private colleges). Contact your desired school to confirm the application process.
	Apply for as many scholarships as you qualify for.
	Start on application essays. Ask your teachers to critique your essays before you submit a final draft.
	Talk to your parents, ministers, and teachers about your plans. Pray for direction in your future and ask others to pray fo you.

	Complete essays. Don't forget to keep a digital copy for yourself.
	Retake the SAT/ACT if needed.
	Schedule final campus visits if needed.
	Request recommendation from teachers and administrators TWO WEEKS prior to the day you need them.

	Send in applications, recommendations, etc. to meet the necessary deadlines for your chosen college.

	Stay on top of scholarship opportunities.

	Make sure your applications are complete and sent.

	Register for any needed AP exams.
	Watch for acceptance or denial notifications from colleges.
	Make your final college decision, if needed.
	Respond promptly to the college you are admitted to and wish to attend for admissions, scholarships, financial aid, orientation dates, registration information, etc.
	Notify colleges that accept you if you do not plan to attend.
	Keep praying and don't let your diligence in your studies wane!

	Turn in a list of all scholarship offers to LCA.
	Take AP exams.
	Prepare for graduation.
	Request your final transcript be sent to the college of your choice.
	Formulate your summer plans – work, orientation, moving, vacations, etc.
