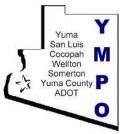

Supervisor Greg Ferguson motioned to approve consent agenda items as presented. Councilmember Gary Knight seconded the motion.

VOTE:

The vote on motion was unanimous.

VI. RE-ELECTION OF OFFICER – 2015 CALENDAR YEAR

Treasurer Russ Clark stated that Vice Chairman Cody Beeson will not be part of the Executive Board next year and opened up discussion regarding the next year's replacement of Chairman. Mr. Clark also stated that in accordance with the By-laws, the Vice Chairman normally moves up to Chair, and the Treasurer moves up to Vice Chairman; therefore, one option is to have the Treasurer move up to the Chair, and Executive Board members can nominate and vote on the vacant Vice Chairman and Treasurer positions. Another option is to replace the Vice Chairman now and have them move up next year as Chairman. Supervisor Ferguson informed the Executive Board that in the past, the Chair remained Chair for a second year, the treasurer moved up to Vice Chairman, and a Treasurer was then nominated and voted on by the board members. This option would have to be discussed with the present Chairwoman Maria Ramos. Mayor Cecilia McCollough suggested that the nominee should be available to attend most if not all meetings. Supervisor Greg Ferguson stated that he interpreted the By-laws as to offering no provisions on the removal of an Officer and suggested waiting until after the calendar year to make any kind of action. Treasurer Clark agreed to not taking action and suggested discussing again at December 2015 and January 2015 Executive Board meeting in order to include absent members in the discussion.

VII. RED FUEL, IS NOT STREET FUEL

Treasurer Russ Clark introduced Bruce Bartholomew, Karl Goldsmith and Alan Parisian of Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT). Mr. Bartholomew informed the Executive Board that there are various vehicles and equipment that utilize Diesel fuel that pose no damage to roads and highway. Vehicles and Equipment belonging to the farming, timber and construction industries are a few examples. As a result, these particular industries engaged in such activities are not required to pay taxes on diesel fuel as long as the activities are restricted to specific applications set forth by the government. The non-taxable diesel fuel is dyed red. Use of red-dyed diesel fuel in a vehicle on Arizona's public roads is a violation of state law. Arizona is losing at least 10 million dollars in revenue every year due to theft and improper use of Red-dyed diesel fuel.

The State of Arizona enforces the law by implementing sworn officers to conduct inspections and investigations. The penalties are severe with a minimum penalty of \$1,000 or \$10 per gallon of dyed diesel fuel. Once the State of Arizona access the violator, the IRS will also access the violator because of federal guidelines and laws. A second offense will double in penalty to \$2,000 or \$20 per gallon of dyed diesel fuel. However, the State of Arizona and ADOT focus more on compliance by informing the public and different agencies about the red-dyed diesel fuel.

Mr. Goldsmith and Parisian discussed some of the exemptions. The vehicle has to be designed to perform a specific function. Therefore a tractor riding from one farm to another is allowed to be on a road. A *hay-stacker* is a converted pickup used on farms and is not allowed on the roads because the pickup was not designed for that purpose. School buses and city buses are another exemption and allowed on roadways as long as it is used for the designed purpose. If a school bus is chartered out in the evening to take a group of people to a bingo event, the bus cannot have red-dyed fuel in the tank. Numerous eligible companies whose vehicles have multiple purposes simply purchase regular diesel fuel; and at the end of the year, they fill out the forms and documents provided by ADOT and write it off on their income taxes.

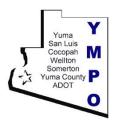

YUMA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION

SUBMITTED TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL

REGARDING THE CONTRACTING OF THE (CONFERENCE LOCATION) AND CATERING SERVICES (Contract) FOR THE BORDER TO BORDER TRANSPORTATION CONFERENCE

WHEREAS the Hidalgo County Metropolitan Planning Organization ("HCMPO") proposes to pay for the services of leasing a portion of the (conference location) and Catering Services (Contract) to the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Border to Border Transportation Conference in Yuma, Arizona, County of Yuma; and

WHEREAS the HCMPO, in consultation with the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization (YUMA), has defined this agreement to be eligible in the area of Yuma County; and

WHEREAS the LRGVDC, in consultation with the HCMPO, has created an account that will cover the expenses submitted by the Yuma MPO within the agreed area or premises; and

WHEREAS the Yuma MPO, has signed a contract with Location of Conference for the purpose of leasing space for the Border to Border Transportation Conference and are eligible for payment upon presentation of the original documents/invoices; and

WHEREAS the LRGVDC on behalf of the HCMPO and upon approval of the HCMPO will pay the invoices submitted by the Yuma MPO to cover the services of leasing location of conference and Catering services for the 2016 Border to Border Transportation Conference.

WHEREAS the Policy Committee of the HCMPO has approved this event to take place at Yuma, AZ and pay from local contributions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the LRGVDC and the HCMPO agree that, upon the submission of originals of this executed memorandum of agreement, as well as all required documentation specified

herein shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented in order to take into account the effect of the Contract.

Stipulations

AMENDMENT

Any signatory to this memorandum of agreement may request that it be amended, whereupon the parties shall consult to consider the proposed amendment. Shall govern the execution of any such amendment.

II. TERMINATION

SIGNATORIES:

- a. A. If the terms of this memorandum of agreement have not been implemented by August 31, 2016, then this memorandum of agreement shall be considered null and void. In such an event, the LRGVDC, HCMPO and Yuma MPO shall so notify the parties to this memorandum of agreement and, if it chooses to continue with the Lease of the Conference Location and Catering Services, then it shall reinitiate review of the Contract in accordance with C.F.R.
- b. B. Any signatory to the memorandum of agreement may terminate it by providing thirty (30) days notice to the other parties, provided that the parties shall consult during the period prior to termination to seek agreement on amendments or other actions that would avoid termination. In the event of termination, the LRGVDC and HCMPO shall comply with C.F.R. with regard to the review of the Contract.
- c. C. In the event that the LRGVDC, HCMPO and Yuma MPO do not carry out the terms of this memorandum of agreement, the LRGVDC and HCMPO shall comply with C.F.R. with regard to the review of the Contract.

The execution of this memorandum of agreement by the LRGVDC, HCMPO and Yuma MPO, the submission of it to the Council with the appropriate documentation specified in the C.F.R., and the implementation of its terms evidence that the LRGVDC, HCMPO and Yuma MPO has afforded the Council an opportunity to commence on the Contract.
