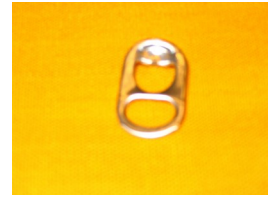
I am looking forward to another exciting year at Havre High School as we continue the "Tradition of Excellence" of the Havre Public School district.

Havre High Key Club will be gathering pop tabs again this year and rewarding the classroom at each school with the most pounds collected, with a ice cream social, hosted by the Havre High Key Club. Please weigh your tabs and mark your classroom name (teachers name) on the bags. We will also weigh them and keep track for the ice cream social competition. Please leave the tabs in the main offices of your buildings, contact John Ita at the High School and I will have the kids pick them up. Our goal this year is to surpass the nearly 400 pounds collected last year. The Key Club youth love doing the Ice Cream Social, I hope it is as much fun for the young kids as it is for the older ones. This year we will contribute the money collected from the Tabs to the Ronald McDonald House that Havre youth have been using in Seattle the last few years unless someone has a specific request. Our Club would like to do something specific this year again related to childhood cancer, so if you have a specific Havre need, please contact us at the High School.



MID TERMS

1st quarter mid-terms end on Friday, September 25. We will not be mailing out mid-term grades as of this year. If parents want a paper copy of their students mid-term report card, contact the high school and we will mail them a report. The mid-term grade will still appear in infinite campus and will still need to be posted.

Here is basic information about the pop tab collection for Ronald McDonald House. The Ronald McDonald House is a home away from home for the families of children undergoing treatment for cancer or other serious illnesses at hospitals around the country. To be with their children, whole families spend their days and nights in hotels or hospital lounges. The Ronald McDonald House provides a place where whole families can stay in a home-like atmosphere, finding support as they share with other families who are also undergoing the trauma of childhood illness. The Pop Tab Program is a great way for community organizations, schools, businesses, and families to support the Ronald McDonald House home-away-from-home for seriously ill children and their families. To date, over 400 million pop tabs have been collected generating over \$300,000. The tab of an aluminum can is pure aluminum unlike the rest of the can. The tabs are small and convenient to collect. 1,267 pop tabs make 1 pound, and 1 pound can be sold for approximately .40 cents. The Key Club of Havre High School is presently collecting tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. In the 2015-16 school year, with the help of participating schools, the Key Club collected over 400 pounds of tabs! This accomplishment won state recognition at the Key Club State Convention in Billings last March. The Havre High Key Club would like to surpass the accomplishment from last year and are asking schools, businesses and families to help by collecting tabs off of aluminum cans. When your collection pot is full, bring it to the Havre High School Office and leave it for the Key Club or call John Ita at the High School, and a Key Clubber will be sent to pick up the tabs you have collected... then start collecting more. Thank You for supporting the Ronald McDonald House Project through your local Key Club. At the High School we will be hosting the competition between the classes and the faculty. The container with the most tabs at the end of February will win an ice cream social for the entire class. Last year the faculty won!
