**September 11, 2001 is a day none of us will ever forget.**

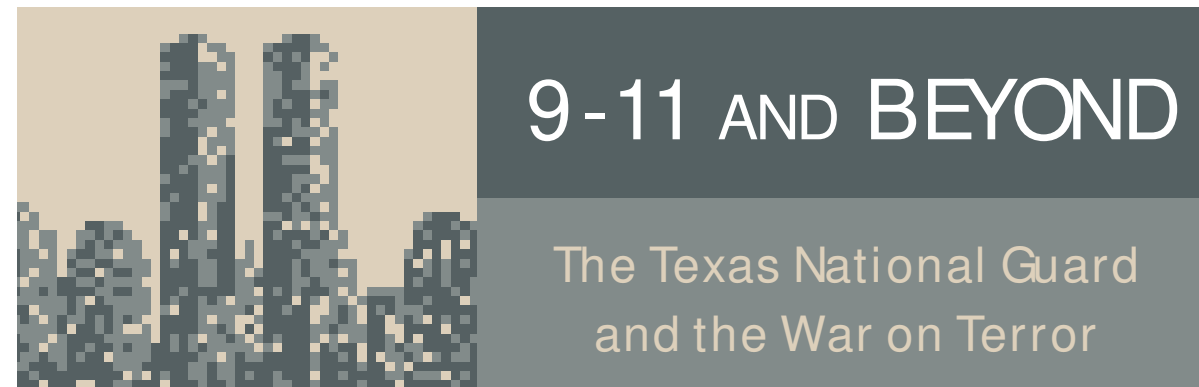
