## What is Geocaching?

Geocaching (pronounced geo-cashing) is a high-tech treasure hunting game played throughout the world by adventure seekers equipped with GPS devices. The basic idea is to locate hidden containers (called geocaches) outdoors and then share your experiences online. Geocaching is enjoyed by people from all age groups, with a strong sense of community and support for the environment.

- Be mindful of the environment, practice “[Cache In Trash Out](#)”.
- Bring friends and family with you; sharing the experience can be very rewarding. Pets are usually welcome, too!
- Remember that distances can be deceiving. A geocache can take longer to find depending on trails, rivers and other obstacles.
- If you take something from the geocache, leave something of equal or greater value.
- Write about your experience in the geocache logbook.

## The Winter Carnival Geocache:

- Follow the coordinates to the cache and write the “Year” found listed inside of the cache next to the coordinate on the entry form.
- To be entered in a drawing for fabulous prizes - complete your contact information and return the completed form by Feb 2 5:00 p.m. to the Winter Carnival Merchandise tent or the Carnival office.
