Spring break is just around the corner! This week long break seems to always approach at the most opportune time to rejuvenate for the final surge of learning! We are reaching the final stretch! As already shared, OAA testing will be occurring the weeks of April 29 through May 9, 2014 The following tests will occur on the below stated dates:

3rd grade Reading OAA- April 29 4th grade Reading OAA-April 30 5th grade Reading OAA- May 1 3rd grade Math OAA—May 2 4th grade Math OAA—May 6 5th grade Math OAA—May 7 5th grade Science OAA—May 8

To help your child during this important time, please make sure that a good night's rest and healthy breakfast predicate the testing days. Rest and fuel will be important factors in a successful testing experience. An early thank you to PTA for also providing a healthy assortment of snacks for testing grade levels on testing days. Please note, there is **NO delayed start on Wednesday, May 7** due to the OAA assessments.

On a different topic, I would like to share with famiiles that recently our staff participated in safety professional development. This is known as **ALICE training**. ALICE is an acronym for **Alert**, **Lockdown**, **Inform**, **Counter and Evacuate**. Our teachers have aprticipated in how to act if an intruder would enter school and how to help the students remain safe. As a continued practice, JFD will have lockdown drills throughout the year. It is very important in the drills, for those communicating, to be sensitive in balancing the practice with the important understanding that our school is a safe and caring place to be. Thus, discussions surrounding lockdowns will always be framed with the message that Dulles is a safe and caring place. It is the goal of the staff to help children feel that they have a means to keep themselves safe in a situation that may cause the school to be on lockdown.

In ALICE training, the staff learned about the importance of always remaining alert to their surroundings and understand that with lockdown comes a few more means of protection. This includes using more specific language from those who are informing about a potential unsafe situation. Also, teachers have been trained to help students evacuate the school to get to a safe area away from danger. Furthermore, teachers will be sharing with children how they can keep themselves safe in the classroom with the help of barricading and other techniques that will deter unsafe people from entering the classrooms. Again, this information will be given in appropriate detail based on age level and understanding. Thus, the discussions for pre k- second grade will be less descriptive than for older grade levels. For all grade levels the message will be delivered in a caring and positive manner helping our students to feel empowered with the lockdown practices.

I know this is a challenging topic, but I believe it to be important to be prepared as a school in case of an emergency. Through healthy conversation and reinforcement as a school community, I want our precious students of JFD to know they are cared for and safe! I will be certain to emphasize this message in a manner that helps our children feel empowered, strong and safe!






## DESTINATION IMAGINATION
