As Jesus comes to the northernmost part of his journey in this Gospel, he turns and begins the journey to Jerusalem but, before leaving he asks his disciples the pivotal question of Mark's Gospel, "Who do you say I am?" All teaching and events so far have raised the issue of Jesus's identity. Peter answers with the term, 'the Christ' a word not used since the opening verse of the Gospel. It was a word charged with many meanings in 1st century Jewish religion but Jesus will use the journey to Jerusalem trying to educate his disciples into his meaning of the word.

Firstly, this Christ, this anointed leader, has to be rejected, suffer and die before rising. How alien this was to their religious mentality is shown by Peter taking Jesus aside and arguing the issue. He is profoundly scandalised by such a notion. But Jesus does not back down. Secondly, anyone who wishes to be a follower of this Jesus, this Christ, must be prepared to embrace the suffering, rejection and even death that may come in living by the teachings of the Gospel.

Who do you say I am?" is the pivotal question in Mark's Gospel, as it should be in our lives as well. How we answer that question determines how we live. If we answer 'the Christ', we have taken Jesus as the centre of our lives, we will be taught to follow a Saviour who can transform everything by his grace, especially suffering, rejection and death. We will be taught not to shy away from difficulty, darkness and pain but to see in them paths to Christ's glory. We will be taught to live life so fully that we can even give up this life in following Jesus, knowing that a greater life awaits. We are committing ourselves to a Copernican revolution. Our little "I" is no longer the centre of our universe, rather Jesus is. And with that radical change, not only will we view life differently, we will be able to live and die with his love and life. Turning away from our self-centred universe, our hearts and lives will be broken open (even to feeling, at times, as though dying) to live in the universe of God's love. www.pravasvoucan.com.au 2015

MISSION Project Day follow up: This week I met with the Mission team to assist me with making our winter care packs for the homeless people in our local area. Thanks to everyone who has helped support this initiative to assist the more needy people in our local area. The Mission teams from St John the Baptist and our Year 6 Mission team will present the baskets of winter care packs at our final assembly to Bruce Whittet from SVDP on Friday 18 September.

WYD Pilgrims visit us at ST Mary's: At our final assembly for the term we will have a visit from Chris Ford an ex-student of St Mary's who is now at Forest High School and will be a pilgrim who will be sponsored by our parish of Manly Freshwater to travel to Krakow, Poland for World Youth Day in July next year. Chris has a number of expectations of World Youth Day 2016.

Catholic Mission Month - October: Anita Lee from Catholic Mission will visit our staff to do a staff reflection on how we can help them in Mission Month (October) to assist with the people of Madagascar. The focus this year is on the issue of Madagascar with water and sanitation as the theme. "I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink". We will have our crazy sock day the first week of term 4. On Thursday 8 October we will have a 'Crazy Sock' day and ask your children to donate a gold coin on the day to help the people of Madagascar. Dorothy Makasa from Catholic Mission will be here that day talking to all our children in workshops to share their mission to assist the children in Madagascar who live without access to clean water and proper sanitation. Distressingly this leads to thousands of children dying from easily preventable diseases like diarrohoea every year. The children will learn about the wonderful work Sister Rose Rasoavololona and her community and the insightful stories will not only help education students, but also inspire them to reach out to children in desperate need. #### **PPC August Meeting points**

- World Youth Day: there are now 11 young people from our Parish confirmed to make this pilgrimage to Krakow in July next year. The fund raising barometer is displayed in this Newsletter. Parish Council to support Jumbo Xmas raffle coming up soon. Robert Marshall and Michelle Ellis doing a great job coordinating along with Fr. Paul Kim.
- Visitation of Bishop Peter Commensoli: is scheduled to take place in early November. Bishop Peter would like to take this opportunity to meet with as many Parishioners as possible in an informal setting as well as having discussions with our Schools, parish Groups and Parish Council.
- Raglan Street Upgrade: is slowly being completed with Pedestrian Crossing guttering access now in place. Once the repaving is carried out the painted crossing will be installed, so that is all good.
- Huge Fig Tree: PPC is now in discussion with Manly Council over the management and possible removal of this now overgrown tree. A Permit Application to Remove has been placed with Manly Council as part of this process following recent incidence of tripping over exposed root system in carpark and blocked sewerage pipes that caused a messy flooding episode in our Parish office. More details to follow.





If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead. This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds - now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

You are the Christ ... the Son of Man was destined to suffer much.


Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'


