



The ministry offered at Skye Farm is led by a talented and dedicated staff. Their purpose is to assist all our campers (even our adult ones) to have an experience that is safe, joyful, meaningful and faithful.

All staff, including volunteers, attend a series of annual training sessions, attend precamp orientations, have reference checks and background checks, and are supervised by experienced leaders. They work as a team and make use of various certifications and skill levels including Registered Nurse, Ordained Clergy, Red Cross Water Safety Instructor, Lifeguard, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer, Challenge Course Certification, Wilderness First Aid, Culinary Arts, and more.

Many of our volunteers are school teachers, former staff, church leaders and clergy. They give generously of their time to enhance and often provide leadership in programs. Each member of our leadership team has an average of over 20 years of summer camp experience.

The critical need at each of our sites at the present time is a maintenance fund that will ensure long-term sustainability of our facilities and make certain that quality space is provided for our summer campers and retreat guests. Hey Parents... THINGS YOU'LL WANT TO KNOW ABOUT SUMMER CAMP AT SKYE FARM

ABOUT OUR ACTIVITIES

Whether you're an expert or beginning camper, there's something here for you! Our qualified staff will encourage you and ensure your safety. There are many options to choose from, and all equipment and safety gear is provided unless stated otherwise in the confirmation material. Please note that for the safety of our guests, all campers must take a swimmer evaluation to participate in most waterfront activities. Campers who are not strong swimmers will have limited, but quality, access to the waterfront activities.

FOOD SERVICE

Always one of the most important parts of camp, we provide quality food and plenty of it! Healthy and delicious home-style meals are prepared daily and usually served family style. We seek to meet special dietary needs, provided we receive advance notice.

ACCOMODATIONS

Campers will stay in their designated cabin which is nestled among trees and beautiful scenery. Electricity is not provided to the cabins. Bathrooms with electricity, showers, hot and cold water and flush toilets are located near each cabin area. Lean-tos are available for temporary use.

HEALTH & SAFETY

The health and safety of all our guests is of utmost importance. Our Health Care Staff includes a consulting physician, an on-site Registered Nurse, several RTE's, and numerous staff who are certified in CPR and /or first aid. In addition, there is a full-service hospital located within a half hour of our site. Staff are chosen after a rigorous application and screening process; and pre-summer staff training is provided. Red Cross certified lifeguards provide a safe environment for all water and beach activities. Skye Farm is accredited by the American Camp Association, receives a permit annually, and is inspected a minimum of 2 times a year by the New York State Department of Health. Inspection reports are available at the main office.

CABIN MATE REQUESTS

We will seek to honor cabin mate requests made at least 2 weeks before camp begins, provided campers are registered in the same program; ages are not more than 24 months apart and the request is made by both people. Note that this is optional and many campers do not make requests. While we to seek to honor your wishes, we also value kids making new friends. Please call if you have questions.
