Course Description, Objectives and Goals: (1.5 Credits)

Welcome! You have chosen to continue your study of ASL. As you know, American Sign Language (ASL) is a unique language involving not only signed vocabulary used within a particular grammar structure but also a cherished culture including people of all ethnicities, backgrounds and professions who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing.

During the study of American Sign Language students will experience and evaluate ASL as it relates to communication, cultures, connections, comparisons and communities and how each relates to people who are Deaf. Students will be challenged to explore how each of these topics is similar to and/or different from their own culture and language. Upon successful completion of ASL 1, students will be eligible to enroll in ASL 2: upon successful completion of level 2, students will be eligible to enroll in ASL 3

ASL 1 introduces basic structures of the sign language with an emphasis on listening (with eyes) and speaking (with the hands); students will acquire an extensive vocabulary, take part in practical conversations taken from ordinary situations of daily life, and tackle the skill of glossing English into sign and vice versa. Culture is an integral part of learning any language. The class will continue to improve its ASL skills and develop an appreciation for the language and the people who use ASL on a daily basis.

In ASL 2 the communication skills acquired in Level I are extended to include distinguishing between variations in signs and non-manual communication. A more in-depth study of Deaf culture will be explored. Students will be provided opportunities to express and receive signed information in a variety of situations. The majority of instruction is given in A.S.L. Master ASL is the textbook used.

Classroom Expectations:

My classroom will be a place of safety and respect <u>at all times</u>. I plan on students being successful in ASL and expect you to prepare for the same. The following expectations are in place to foster success in American Sign Language.

- Be respectful
- Be prompt and prepared
- Be an active participant in class
- Abide by all school district, campus and classroom rules and expectations
- Use of all electronic devices *Follow MISD / BBCTA/FHS policy at all times. The teacher may take the device and a \$15 fee will be paid prior to the device being returned.
- **Students MUST wear the current ID** at all times while on campus and while attending any school activity/function.

General Consequences:

If a student chooses not to follow district / class rules the following consequences will be enforced:

- Verbal Warning
- Removal from activity or classroom and student / teacher conference
- Phone call to parent
- Office referral *Severe disruptions will result in an immediate office referral

Other expectations:

- Watch and participate
 - In order to be successful in American Sign Language, you will need to be willing to try new activities. You have chosen to take a foreign language that is visual and active. Be prepared to step out of your comfort zone and take risks. I know you will enjoy my class and I guarantee you will learn to communicate with people who are Deaf while having fun if you follow these class procedures!
- Communication Procedures
 - Communication will be conducted using only American Sign Language. Students are expected to respond and communicate using the method initiated. "Voice Off" grades will be awarded according to compliance with this procedure.
- Videotaping
 - In accordance with District policy: "HH. Videotaping of Students" Because ASL is a visual language, students will be videotaped during most projects and various activities / assignments. By signing the Parent / Student information sheet you confirm that you are not denying this permission unless otherwise indicated.

These videos will be used for instructional use only and any publication of such media will only be used with prior written permission.

I expect all of my students will succeed. One key factor in success is *effort*. If you are participating in class, doing your homework, asking questions and practicing frequently, you will succeed!

Foreign Language Grading Policy: *variations may apply according to individual instructors

Six Week Grading:

- 40% Tests / Projects
- 30% Language- Receptive / Expressive ("Listening/Speaking")
- 30% Culture/ Daily work / Homework / Participation /Quizzes (Quizzes will be weighted 2X)
 - = Six Week Average
- Semester exams are 20% of the grade.

There will be at least 8 grades per six weeks. At least TWO of these grades will be a major assessment/test.

Test Retakes:

A student who fails a major test may retake a similar test under these circumstances:

- The student requests to re-take test and schedules an appointment.
- *(This does not apply to the semester final exam.)
 The student arranges transportation to and from BBCTA/FHS for the retake
- The highest grade on any retake is 70%
- All retakes must be completed prior to the end of each six week grading period

Late Work:

Late assignments will be accepted **ONLY 1 class day** after the due date for a maximum grade of 70; after that a zero will be given. *Please see me if you feel you have a <u>valid</u> extenuating circumstance. You will be asked to email your extension request to me at <u>stephaniemcknight@misdmail.org</u>

Absences/Make Up Work: (see Student Handbook)

It is the student's responsibility to ask for, obtain, and complete assignments missed for any absence, including school activities. The work must be turned in 1 day after the student returns to class. Pending the number of days the student is absent, is the amount of days allowed for make up.

Academic dishonesty—cheating or plagiarism—is not acceptable. Cheating includes the copying of another student's work—homework, class work, test answers, etc.—as one's own or allowing another to borrow answers. Plagiarism is the use of another person's original ideas or writing without giving credit to the true author. A student found to have engaged in academic dishonesty will be subject to loss of credit for the work in question, as well as disciplinary penalties, according to the Student Code of Conduct.

District / Class APPS:
