
We would also like to welcome back Mrs. Sequin who is returning to her role as office manager at the school.

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What Every Babysitter Should Know—Sept 15th

St. John Ambulance, Powell River Branch, is offering the above noted course at our Training Centre on September 15, 2012 (Saturday). Cost of course: \$45.00

This 8-hour course is designed to teach young people ages 11 years and older how to babysit children and infants. The course will enhance knowledge of safety, responsible babysitting and will develop skills to cope with common emergencies. An outline of the lessons covered will include:

1. Becoming a Babysitter

- 2. Caring for Kids
- 3. Kids and Food
- 4. Getting Along with Kids
- 5. Kids and Play
- 6. Keeping Kids Safe
- 7. Handling Emergencies
- 8. First Aid

There is a multiple choice question exam. The instructor will also base your skill comprehension with an ongoing practical skill evaluation throughout the course. The combination of both the written and practical skill evaluation will determine successful completion of the course.
