LICENSE PLATES: When I renewed my Washington license plate this year, I checked to see if I qualified for the Armed Forces plate and thought from the wording that I did not. That was a mistake on my part. Surviving spouses can get the Washington Armed Forces license plates. Get this: \$28 of the cost is tax deductible because those funds go toward supporting programs/services for homeless veterans; memorials honoring veterans; and/or maintenance of our state veterans cemetery. I have since gone to a local licensing agency and ordered military plates, and they arrived in less than a week.

STATE VETERANS HOMES

I learned something very important at the WSCOC meeting in September: If a veteran with honorable service is admitted to a WA State Veterans home, the spouse can also be admitted if 1) she requires the type of nursing care that is provided by that home and 2) a bed is available. Surviving spouses of deceased veterans with honorable service can also be admitted under the same rules. Assisted living is only available in Retsil and Orting. Cost is based on the individual's financial status.

There are three Washington State Veterans homes. Nursing care is available in all three, but assisted living is only in Retsil and Orting. You can call the Admissions Directors listed below to schedule a free lunch and tour, or to get an interview regarding your situation.

Congress Approves MOAA Federal Charter

On Oct. 27, the U.S. House of Representatives approved legislation granting a federal charter to MOAA. The Senate passed on identical bill on September 24th. Perhaps by the time you get this newsletter, the bill will have gone to the President for signature. The Charter provides federal recognition of MOAA's service mission and ensures that MOAA leaders in all states can serve on state -level veterans' advisory panels.

The Spokane Chapter sent 547 letters on this subject to our legislators in 2009, which no doubt greatly influenced our legislators to vote in favor of this important piece of legislation.

Bravo Zulu (Well Done!) to Chapter Member Bill Aller!

Chapter member **Bill Aller**, LCDR, USNR (Ret.), recently received the 2009 Book of Golden Deeds Award from the Downtown Exchange Club. Bill was honored for his efforts in founding the Spokane Sea Services Museum and for his many volunteer years in keeping the museum open to the public. When Spokane's Naval Air Station was closing in 1956, Bill saved hundreds of photos relating to the station's ten-year history. In 1988, the Spokane Naval and Marine Corps Reserve Center (which is now the Navy Operational Support Center) gave him a space in the main building to display them, and then in 1998 they moved him to a small house in back of the Center where he ran the museum with the help of the Navy League Spokane Council. His collection grew over time, and today it includes uniforms, insignia, ship and airplane models, photographs, newspaper clippings and magazines, and a 72-inch section of a 16 inch gun barrel from the battleship USS Wisconsin. There is also a torpedo, two USCG landing crafts, a 12-man personnel boat and a Japanese sword surrendered to a U.S. commander in the Pacific after the end of WWII.

To top it off, the museum has the most extensive collection of memorabilia from the USS Spokane, the city's namesake light cruiser commissioned in 1946 and decommissioned in 1950. (Information from Valley Voice 10/8/09)

Rules for Give Me Ten MOAA Membership Program that Expires 31 December 2009

- Lapsed or new MOAA members can join MOAA national for \$28 for two years (normal price \$62).
 These paying members can then get a \$10 discount on chapter membership. Their discounted chapter membership price is \$5 for one year or \$30 for three. (Normal price is \$15/one year or \$40/three years).
- Active duty, Guard and Reserve can have a free year of MOAA national membership.
 These free members can also join the chapter at the discounted price: \$5/one year or \$30 for three.
