

\$10 MILLION TO CANCER CENTRE

Austin Health is delighted that the Australian government has committed \$10 million to the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Centre Appeal to support facilities for the internationally recognised cancer research programs at Austin Health.

In partnership with the international Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research, Austin Health conducts pre-eminent basic and clinical cancer research. Austin Health also participates in many clinical trials, and is a major teaching and training institute for cancer health professionals.

Austin Health Chief Executive Officer, Dr Brendan Murphy said, "The Australian government contribution recognises the academic leadership of Austin in providing research, teaching and training that will be part of a major new comprehensive cancer centre."

"The \$10 million provides welcome support for the efforts of the Cancer Appeal and brings this project closer to implementation," Dr Murphy said.

AUSTIN STARTS NEW TREATMENT FOR MESOTHELIOMA

he Austin Radiation Oncology Centre has commenced a new form of therapy for patients with mesothelioma, the lung cancer caused by asbestos which is on the increase in Australia and many other parts of the world, using a complex form of radiotherapy called IMRT. IMRT, or Intensity Modulated Radiation Therapy, was developed in Houston for treating mesothelioma

patients who have had their diseased lung surgically resected. A team from the Austin travelled to the USA in 2005 for training in the technique.

Each daily fraction requires a one hour treatment slot, and our first patient completed his five week course of radiotherapy recently without any problems.

Sophisticated planning technologies and dedicated staff has enabled our centre to introduce many high tech advances with an accuracy difficult to reproduce in other Australasian radiotherapy centres.

Our mesothelioma program continues to evolve under the direction of Dr Malcolm Feigen, senior radiation oncologist, and we are liaising closely with the thoracic surgeons and medical oncologists at the Austin to improve our planning targets and add more effective chemotherapy before IMRT. We are currently investigating the set up of a national clinical trial for mesothelioma patients to assess the usefulness of this approach.

LUISA OWES HER LIFE TO BREAST SCREENING

uisa Lostia, 54-year-old mother of three had been putting off having a mammogram until one of her friends was diagnosed with breast cancer. With no family history, Luisa wasn't worried but thought she'd better have a check-up just to be on the safe side. The mammogram taken at the BreastSreening service at Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital revealed a 6cm lump in her breast, the product of a highly aggressive cancer. Within three weeks, Luisa underwent surgery, which was followed by 6 months of chemotherapy. Today, she is in recovery and thankful for the decision which, in hindsight, she believed saved her life.
